KING'S IRISH TRIP Will Likely Be Entertained by the Duke of Manchester.

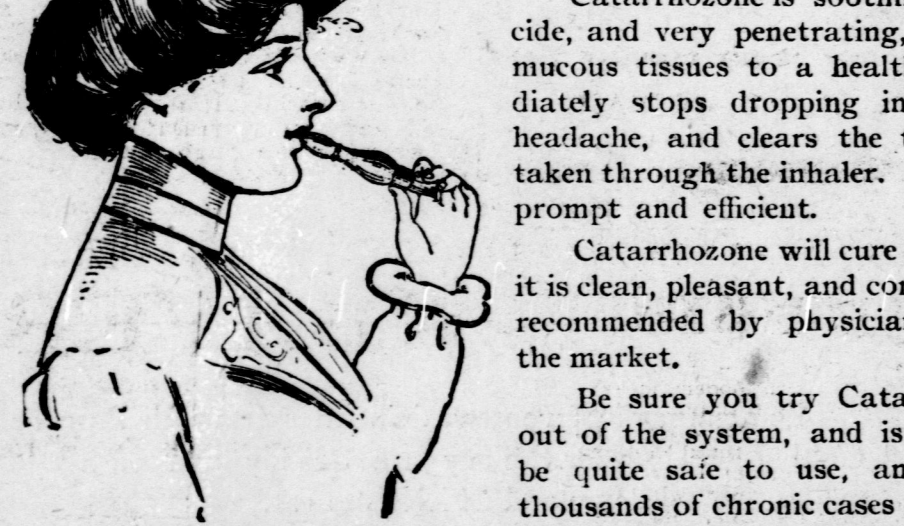
