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

BILL.

An Act to incorporate the Canada, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, and to aid the same.

THEREAS the New York, Newfoundland and London Preamble. Telegraph Company has been organized under and in compliance with an Act of Incorporation passed by the Legislature of the Island of Newfoundland, intituled, An Act to Act of New-5 incorporate a Company under the style and title of the New foundland York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company; And cited. whereas the said Company has lately formed a union with a Company projected in Great Britain, under the name of the "European and American Submarine Telegraph Company for 10 uniting Europe and America," and it has been determined to prosecute the undertaking under the above mentioned title of the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company; And whereas the parties interested in the said United Companies have applied for an Act of Incorporation in this 15 Province, and for aid towards the accomplishment of their object which is of great public importance: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted 20 and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of 25 the same, as follows:

I. Peter Cooper, Moses Taylor, Cyrus W. Fleld, Marshall O. Certain per-Roberts, Chandler White, The Lord de Mauley, Samuel sons incorporated. Laing, Sir James Carmichael, William Chaplin, F. Cadogan, Charles D. Archibald, John W. Brett, and all other persons 30 who are now or shall become proprietors of shares in the said Company, and their successors and assigns, shall be and they are hereby declared to be a Body Politic and Corporate by the Corporate name of the New-York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph name and ga Company, and by that name may have a common seal, and neral powers. 35 sue and be sued, and may hold lands, tenements and hereditaments, necessary for the purposes for which the Company is formed, and such others as they are expresly authorized to hold by this act, and goods, chattels and things in action, and may let, sell, assign and convey the same, or any part thereof, and 40 do all other acts or things which corporations may of right do.

II. The Capital or Joint Stock of the said Company Capital and shall consist of fifteen hundred thousand dollars, in shares of shares.

one hundred dollars each, with the privilege to the said Company by resolution of the Board of Directors to increase the Capital from time to time but not to an amount exceeding three millions of dollars: and it is hereby declared that the shares in the said Company shall be deemed personal property; 5 and that no assignment or transfer of any share shall be valid until such transfer shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose; and it is hereby declared that whenever any shareholder shall transfer in manner aforesaid, all his stock or shares in the said Company, he shall thenceforth cease to be a 10

member of the said Corporation.

III. The parties above named shall be the first Directors of the said Company and shall continue in office until the first Monday in the month of May which will be in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and until their 15 successors are appointed; any stockholder owning five shares of the capital stock of the Company shall be eligible to be a Director, and at all meetings of the stockholders each may vote in person or by proxy, each share being entitled to one vote.

IV. The times and places for holding the General Meet-20 ings of the Stockholders for the election of Directors and other purposes, and of special meetings and the modes of conducting the same, and the notices thereof shall be in accordance with the By-Laws of the Company to be made in this behalf.

Directors to appoint Officers of the Company: forther powers.

V. The Directors of the said Company for the time being shall have power to appoint a President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary and other officers and servants of the said Company: to prescribe their powers and duties and fix their salaries; to fill vacancies in the Board of Directors (occurring 30 by death, resignation or otherwise,) until the next general election of Directors; to receive subscriptions to the Capital Stock from time to time, and to require and enforce payment of the same when and as they may see fit; and to make By-Laws not repugnant to the Laws of this Province, to pay divi- \$5 dends and generally to regulate and manage the affairs of the said Company; and any three of such Directors shall be a Quorum for the transaction of business: and the said Directors shall and may appoint a local Manager in this Province for the superintendance and management of the business of the 40 said Company therein.
