LOOKING BACKWARD

THE BATTLE FOR INCORPORATION OF WINNIPEG

By Mayor J. H. ASHDOWN

"In the matter of incorporation some people seem to be getting almost crazy. They seem to imagine that it only requires incorporation to make the hamlet of Winnipeg jump into a great, flourishing, magnificent, commercial city. For our part, we cannot see it."

This is an extract from the *Manitoban* of 1872, written by Mr. Cunningham, and if this Editor were alive to-day he would see it and would have to acknowledge that incorporation has been a very important factor in bringing this city to its present prosperous position. This paragraph from the principal newspaper then in Winnipeg, that is, in 1872, may be taken as fairly accurate in representing the feeling of most citizens regarding the question of incorporation. But those fighting for incorporation found a way of swinging the pendulum their way. The method resorted to was the frequent calling of mass meetings at which impassioned addresses and speeches were made to crowds who voted for resolutions calling on the government to bring in and pass the Incorporation Bill without further delay. These meetings had the desired effect upon the Legislature, who took up again the consideration of the bill, but the Legislative Council made some amendments in regard to the license money, which the Speaker of the Assembly, Dr. Bird, ruled as unconstitutional inasmuch as they affected the revenue of the Province. He, therefore, ruled the bill out of order and the result was that incorporation was lost for a year and Dr. Bird became very unpopular in consequence. The next thing the people heard was that the bill had been thrown out altogether. Shortly after this announcement the Hon. Dr. Bird, Speaker of the Assembly, to give him his full title, was decoyed from his residence on pretense of being called to see a patient and when near Point Douglas, he was taken forcibly from his

cutter and a pail of hot tar thrown over his face, head and shoulders. This act caused much indignation amongst the townspeople as it reflected upon every respectable man in Winnipeg concerned in the incorporation movement, yet the perpetrators of the outrage were never discovered, although a reward of \$1000 was offered for their apprehension. Thus ended for the time being, the hope of incorporation.

The Bill of Incorporation was again carefully revised and corrected and finally submitted to the House and passed at the Fourth Session of the First Parliament of Manitoba.

Mr. W. F. Luxton was the first to announce himself as candidate for Mayoralty which he did in an address published on the 15th November, 1874. Candidates for civic honors however, appeared very quickly and the following names were spoken of:

For Mayor, Messrs. Kennedy, Ashdown, Bannatyne, Cornish, McMicken, Macaulay and Luxton. On Monday, January 5th, 1875, the first civic election took place as follows:

F. E. Cornish for Mayor	383
W. F. Luxton " "	179

Majority 204

It will be seen by this that a large number of repeaters were brought in, the actual number of voters in the city being only 308. Mr. Luxton contended that Cornish's actual majority did not exceed 34, and he was probably near the mark. Cornish was supported by the Hudsons Bay Company and their friends, and no doubt he owed his election to their patronage.

THIS is one of the best known clubs in the city, and has on its books the names of the most prominent professional and business men in Winnipeg. It was organized on May 7th, 1906, and had 164 members the first year, which number has now been increased to over 200. The annual fee is \$10 and the clubs' colors are blue and gold. Matinee meetings are held every Saturday afternoon at River Park, which has been leased for a number of years. Meetings also take place on all holidays and are witnessed by a large concourse of people.

Since the club was inaugurated a great improvement has been observed in the class of road and matinee horses in the city, and undoubtedly much credit must be given the members of the Amateur Driving Club, to whose activity may be attributed, not only the higher quality of the horses seen on the streets, but also the neatness of the light vehicles that are noticed at every turn. The club's most popular event of the year is, perhaps, the first day's racing at the Industrial Exhibition when six contests are held amid great enthusiasm. There are many other prizes competed for, too numerous to mention here, and the seasons sport is wound up with a large banquet given about the middle of November when the spirit of rivalry gives way to that of good cheer and good fellowship. The committee meetings of the club are held at the Empire hotel, and the officers elected for the present year are: President, W. D. Mace; Vice-President, A. C. McRae; Treasurer, G. H. 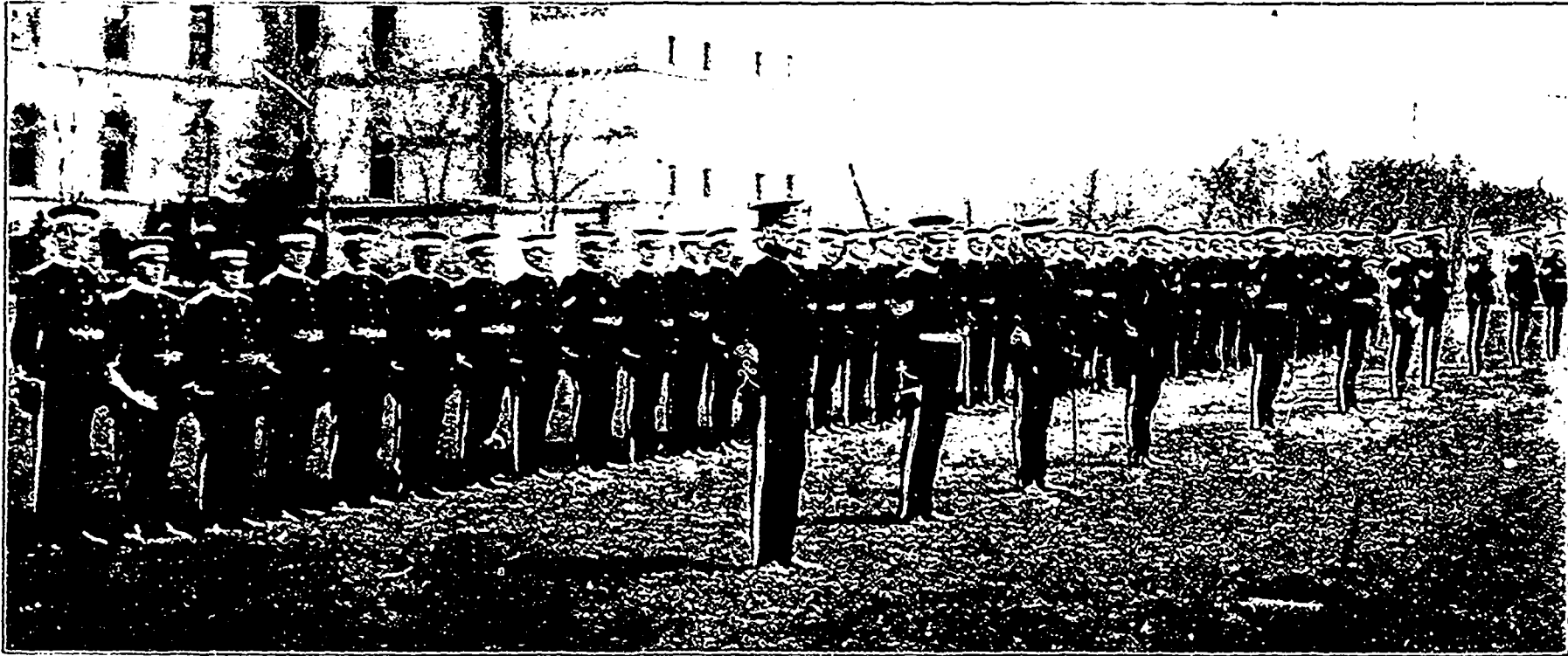

THIS club was organized in 1903 with a membership of ten, which has since increased to 125. The meetings are held in the Board Room of the Grain Exchange, and the subscription is \$5.

Of the many events that the members of this club participated in during the year, perhaps, none is more popular than the Dunlop Trophy Road race. It is a dash of 100 miles, the prize being the gift of the Dunlop Tire Company. Last summer, the first automobile club tour ever held out of the city was inaugurated, Mr. W. C. Power, the Secretary-Treasurer, being the chief spirit in organizing the trip, which occupied three days. The party was made up of thirty-five people in eleven cars, which, en route, were decorated with sheaves of wheat from the fields. Ahead of the party went a pilot car, the pathfinder, driven by Mr. Power, who in addition to being principal organizer of the trip, was also the guide. Confetti was thrown from the pathfinder and thus served to mark the road to be followed by the other cars. It is anticipated that the club will organize another trip this season, when the party will probably be much larger. The officers for 1908 are: President, Hon. Mr. Justice Phippen, Vice-President, J. ARMY SERVICE CORPS



NO. 11 Company, Canadian Army Service Corps, was organized during the first week of April, 1907, and in thirty days was fully completed, and able to take its place on the field. Its work commenced at once by conducting the Commissary and Transport work at the Brigade Camp at Sturgeon Creek in June, making an excellent record, which was highly commended upon by the officer Commanding the District and the Authorities at Ottawa. Its establishment consists of 106 Officers and men and 86 horses. Its personnel being as follows: 1 Major, 1 Captain, 3 Lieutenants, 1 Veterinary Lieutenant, 2 staff Sergt. Majors, 1 Staff Quarter Master Sergt., 3 Artificer Sergts., 1 Company Sergt. Major, 1 Company Quarter-Master Sergt., 5 Company Sergts., 1 Trumpeter, 3 Artificer Corporals, 2 second corporals, 3 carriage and shoeing smiths and 73 privates. The present officers are as follows: Major Commanding, H. Swinford; Capt. G. F. C. Poussette, Lieutenants McGillvray, Scott, Ruttan and Baker; V. t. Lieut. T. Z. Wood.

For the information of those who are not familiar with army duties the Army Service Corps is charged with the whole of the organization for the collection and issuing of rations to the troops, also, all Transport by wagon, water and rail. Everything consumable is handled by the Army Service Corps, and it is responsible for the shoeing of horses, repairing of wagons and harness. It is combatant, being armed, but only for the purpose of defense. Any person interested in the business end of the army would find much to interest them when visiting any of the camps of Instruction to see how the work of conducting an Army Service Corps Company is carried on.

BANKERS HOCKEY LEAGUE

BANKERS Hockey league was formed on Dec 17th, 1892, having for President W. A. Machaffie of the Merchants Bank of Canada. F. J. Boulton was elected Secretary-Treasurer. There was little interest taken in Hockey by the league up to '95 there being only one match played that year between the Commerce and the Imperial. The following year however, the interest taken in the sport was considerably increased, the constitution was revived and a new cup was presented by Mr. E. E. Webb, who was at that time Manager of the Union Bank. The trophy was to be known as the "Goal Cup" and to be retained for the season by the team scoring the greatest number of goals in league matches. The teams that faced each other in the first fight for the cup were

composed of picked men from the Ottawa and Molsons forming the Imperial, and players from the Merchants, Montreal, British, D'Hochelega, Hamilton and Commerce made up the Union team, which won easily. In 1906-7 the Commerce won for the third year in succession and retained the cup trophy that had been so strenuously fought for since 1896. The following year a new cup was subscribed for by all the Banks and was won by the Northern. It now stands on the desk of President MacKenzie, giving an added charm to that busy office, and being greatly admired by visitors to the Bank.

WINNIPEG Board of Trade was chartered in 1878 and started with a membership of 60. At the head was the Hon. A. G. B. Bammatyne. To-day the total membership is 375 practical business men who serve on many boards for the settlement of all disputes between dealer and inspector of the various products such as grain flour, hides, leather, etc., etc.

From Winnipeg, the centre of an inspection district, no one but those who have taken an active part in the board work can comprehend the labor expended in the business organization of the city. In the selection of inspectors of grain, it is evident that the Board were well advised in making these appointments inasmuch as in the foreign grain markets, no certificates of grain inspection have a higher standing than those of Winnipeg.

The Board's work and progress attracted outsiders soon after it entered upon its duties in connection with inspection matter, and as they were in those days very few organized bodies of the kind connected with business affairs, almost every community or people with a grievance looked to the Board to assist in securing redress.

Thus, the outcry of ratepaying citizens in 1884 against the reckless, if not rascally City Council of that year, which was surely driving the City to bankruptcy, came to the Board, and the Board organized a movement and put a ticket in the field, which swept the Council out of existence at the next election and the sweep had the effect of bringing all classes of citizens to ideas of municipal economy. That sweep saved the credit of Winnipeg and hoisted quotations on its bonds all over the world. The officers elected for 1908 are:

WINNIPEG BUILDERS EXCHANGE

THE Builders' Exchange was organized in 1904 with the object of joining in one association all contractors, manufacturers and dealers of good repute doing business in the city whose vocation connects them wholly or generally with the industry of building, either as employing contractors in any branch of the building business, or as manufacturers of, or dealers in material used or employed in the erection of buildings, or other structures, and who are not members of any journeymens' trade or labor union.

It was also their aim to establish and maintain among the individuals thus associated, a just and equitable system of dealing and uniformity in commercial usages by rules and regulations; to acquire, preserve and disseminate valuable information regarding the business in which they are severally engaged; and to establish and maintain a system of adjustment of all disputes or controversies

which may arise between its members, or between its members and their employes and other persons and for that purpose to act in concert with similar organizations.

The Builders' Exchange has from time to time taken a prominent part in labor troubles and it is to them, by forming an organization of the largest employers of labor in the building trades, that the Unions have looked for any amelioration of conditions.

The exchange is divided into sections corresponding to the respective trades and callings of the membership, so as to facilitate the better consideration and carrying out of any matter of special interest to the particular line the members of the section may be engaged in. These sections have the sole power to make agreements regarding their section, or applying particularly to the trade involved.

Roland, alert, wideawake and resourceful. The literature issued from the offices of this organization is far-flung across the world, so that to-day you will find it in cities and in villages, in big industrial centres and by the countryside. Well printed and tastefully gotten up, these booklets tell the story of the city's wonderful growth and progress. It is an interesting story that moves people to the little bookish office window where the railroad and steamship tickets are sold. And thus the westbound trains are crowded. But the first chapter has scarcely yet been written; the chapters that are to follow telling of this western city's progress will, unless some terrible calamity befalls it, make ye true story of ye Arabian nights look insignificant.

On file in its offices at 482 Main Street, the Bureau keeps the most wonderful collection of fresh commercial facts to be found in any city in Canada, and any person, manufacturer, farmer, investor or homeseeker requiring this information has only to write to the Commissioner, Mr. Roland. It is the function of this organization to furnish free to all enquirers full information in connection with the advantages of Winnipeg as a centre of business. THIS Club was organized on 14th April, 1904, with 28 charter members, J. S. Ewart being elected president. The objects of the Club are "to foster patriotism by encouraging the study of the institutions, history, arts, literature and resources of Canada, and by endeavoring to unite Canadians in such work for the welfare and progress of the Dominion as may be desirable and expedient." Since its organization, the Club has enjoyed every evidence that the aims and purposes for which it was formed met with much favor in the minds of a large number of citizens and a very big increase in the membership has in consequence taken place, there being at present on the roll 779 members in good standing, with a list of 50 applicants awaiting the decision of the club. It must be gratifying to the executive to mark the interest which has been shown in the club by the business men of the city, indicated by the fact that a very large number of the shrewdest and most progressive are members, and are to be seen at very many of the meetings.

During last year, twenty-two luncheons have been held with an average attendance of 250. The annual fee is \$2 and the meetings are generally held fortnightly. CANADIAN Order of Foresters was organized on Nov. 25th, 1879, as an Insurance and Fraternal Benefit organization, confining its business exclusively to Canada. Since then it has increased from a few members until it has to-day a membership approaching 70,000 and after paying all death, sick and funeral benefit claims maturing in that time it has a reserve fund of over \$2,600,000. And this with lower Insurance rates than that of any other society or organization of the kind in Canada. The following are the rates which have been the same for the past twenty-five years.

The first Court organized in Western Canada was on Dec. 1st, 1882, when Court Garry No. 2, of this city was instituted by D. Stewart, P.D.H.C.R., now a resident of Victoria, B. C.

From this small beginning the Order has spread so that at present there are nine courts in the city with a membership of about 1,500. There being in all about 120 courts in the Province. With a membership of over 6,000.

On August 9th, 1891, a District High Court was formed for the West with Headquarters at Winnipeg, the office at present being at 401 McIntyre Block. The first President of the District High Court was A. Monkman, Barrister, etc., of this city, and the first Secretary was A. K. Bevis (now Deceased). The present occupant of the principal chair is G. E. Anderson, of Griswold. R. G. Afflick, Barrister, etc., of this city having retired in March. The Secretary at present is Mr. D. E. McKinnon.

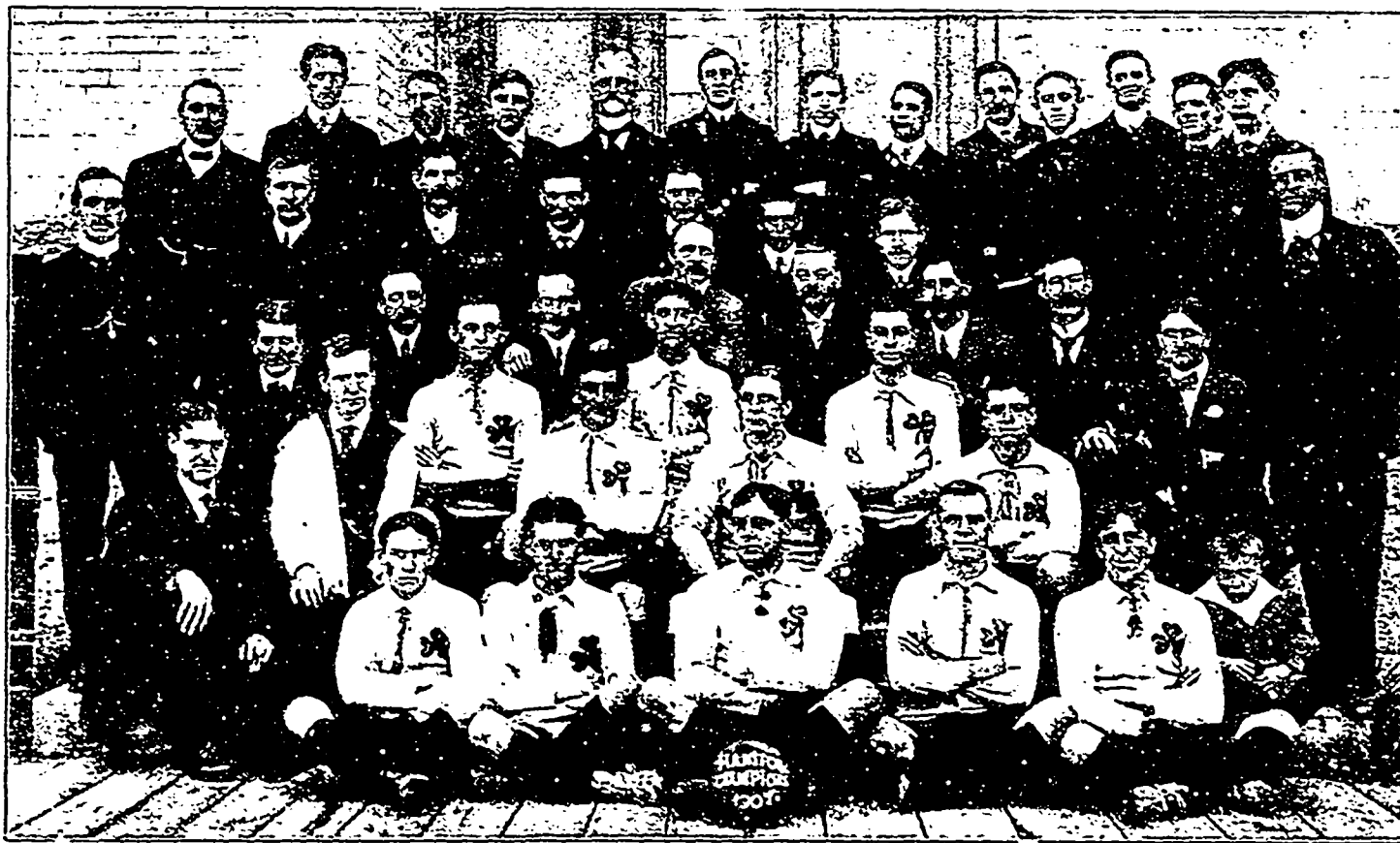

THIS organization was launched about the close of 1899 in a very modest way, with Headquarters in the Commonwealth Block, corner of Main and Market Street. The membership at the first annual meeting was approximately 75, but a jump to 200 had soon to be recorded and this was the average total until last year. The Club moved to Avenue Block on Portage Ave. opposite Y. M. C. A. Building, where it has since continued occupying the portion of the third floor. In 1908 the membership having grown to over 400, the Club was again forced to seek new quarters and a lease was procured of the larger portion of the second floor in the same building. The new home has been fitted up and furnished in a luxurious manner, fully in keeping with the scope and honorable position of the Club in the life of Winnipeg. The first President was T. D. THE Celtic Football Club was organized in March, 1905, by a few enterprising spirits from the North of Ireland. John Todd was elected the first President, and still continues to hold the position, showing the esteem in which he is held by his fellow members.

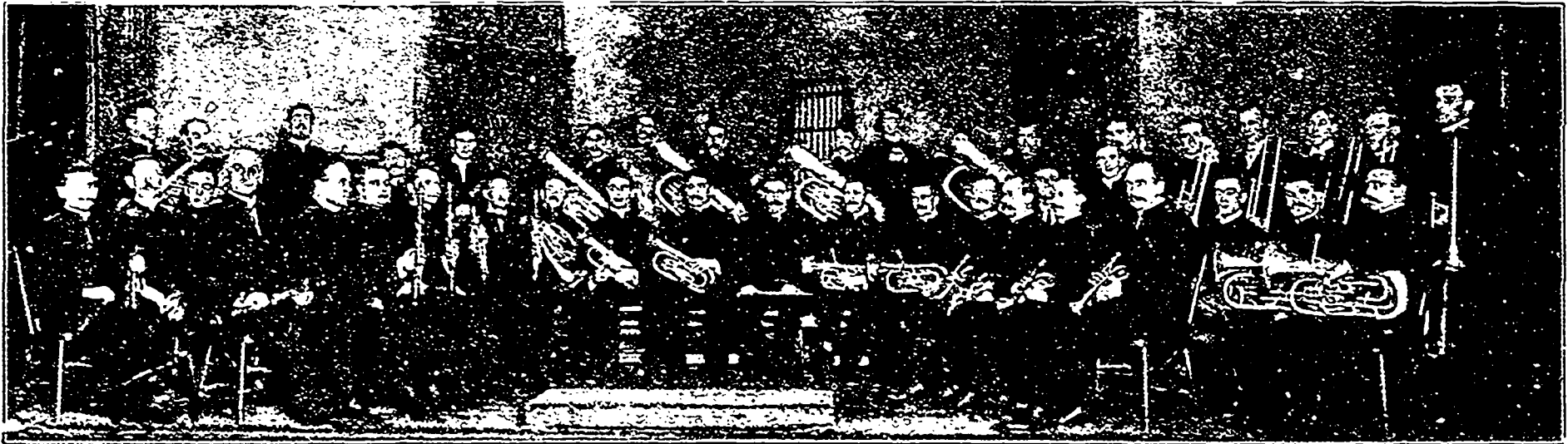
In the first year of its existence the club entered two teams with the Manitoba Football Association, and although the senior team did nothing to set the river on fire, being just as low in the competition as it was possible to get, the Intermediates fought such a good fight that they succeeded in reaching the final for the District Championship. Next year the senior team did better, getting third place in the league championship, and were just a little unlucky in losing second position. As everything comes to those who wait, so success crowned the efforts of the Celtics the following season when they landed the District Championship without sustaining a single defeat, and capped their previous performances by wresting the league championship from Minnedosa in one of the hardest fought football battles seen in Manitoba for years. This victory earned for the team the title of "Provincial Champions" but unfortunately by means of a protest this distinction was not long conferred on them. Their next achievement was the brilliant one of defeating the "Britannias" in the final for the "Bell Cup" at River Park, which victory carried with it the title of "City Champions." Here again misfortune awaited them, for the defeated team protested the game, and Celtic lost their hard-fought and well-earned honors in the committee room. Thus in one season after winning the blue ribbon of provincial football, and the much-coveted City championship, both were rudely snatched from them through a slight technicality, which caused a difference of opinion even amongst the Protest Committee; the Celtics losing their laurels by only one vote.

Jimmy Salmon the outside left winger is the only one at present playing with the team continually since the inception of the club, and perhaps he is the most popular footballer in Winnipeg.

The Club membership has gradually increased from about fifty the first year, until now it stands near the 150 mark.

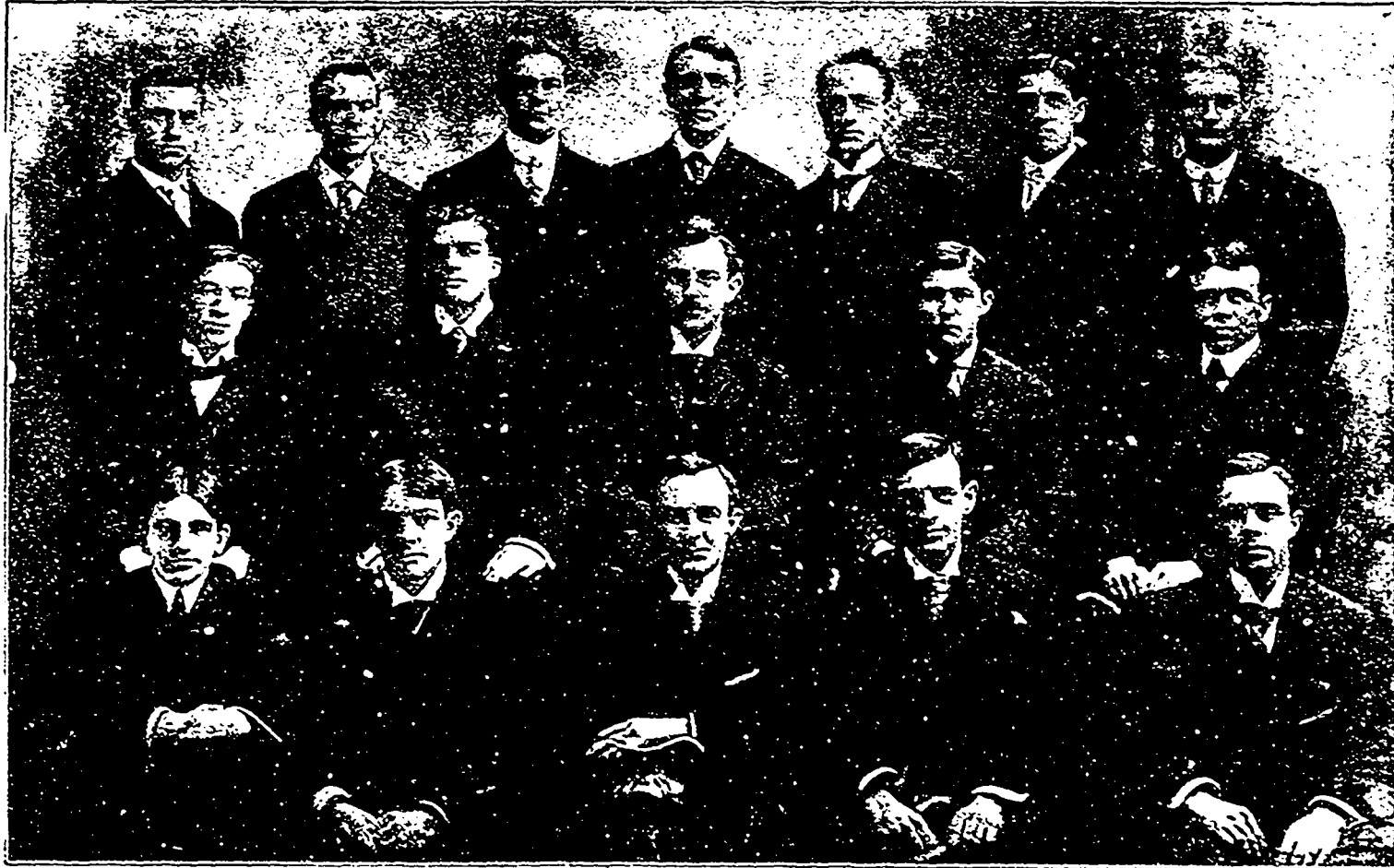
With the host of good players at the disposal of the club, and their previous reputation, it is safe in predicting another bumper year for the Celtics.

THE CITY BAND



THIS band was organized in 1902, James Tees being elected President, O. O. Ingo, Vice-President, J. A. Fisher, Secretary, S. L. Barrowclough, Conductor. It was a success almost from the start, quickly jumping into popular favor and playing at nearly all civic functions and before monster audiences during the summer months in the various city parks. The forty-two musicians composing the band are using Boosey instruments, which are held in high esteem by bandsmen all over the world. Devotees of music regard the Barrowclough bandsmen as highly accomplished musicians and with the "surging through" they are great favorites. The conductor, Mr. Barrowclough, has had a splendid musical training, and has travelled considerably, having conducted several notable orchestras in the Old Country and elsewhere. In 1895, having met many musicians of international fame, and attended the annual musical festivals in England and on the Continent, he returned to Winnipeg and entered the music business. He once more "held the baton" over the Citizens Band, and seven years later he assisted in the formation of the present musical body and has been at its head since.

BASEBALL IN WINNIPEG



SEVEN years ago there was practically no baseball played in Winnipeg, lacrosse having complete control of summer sports. But in the spring of 1901 some old time enthusiasts got together and with the help of the sporting editors of the newspapers stirred up the local players and organized a City League composed of six teams. At this time there was no professional baseball in the city and the League was a success financially from the start. This success was a detriment in the playing line however, as shortly after the season started, the better teams began strengthening with the best players of the weaker teams and the result was that only three teams finished the season, the Unions, Capitals and St. Boniface. The race was a very close one, the Capital's winning out after a strong finish. In 1902 the Mets and C. P. R. teams were admitted to the League, making five teams, but before the season started the Capitals quit as most of their players had joined other teams. The Unions took the lead from the start and finished an easy winner. Very little interest was taken in the League by the fans as this was the first year of professional ball, and financially all the teams quit losers.

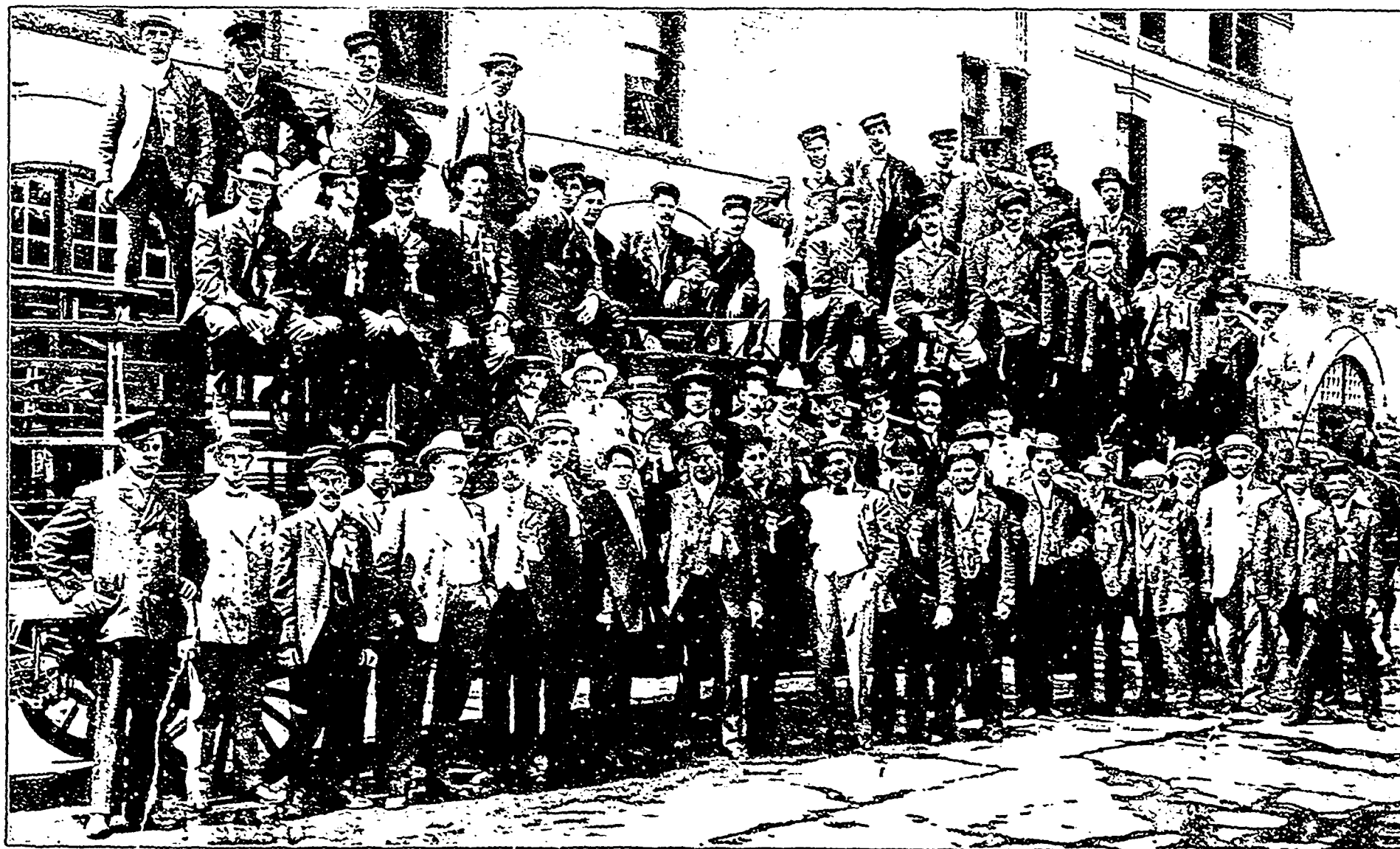


When the warm weather of 1907 put in an appearance the players who had taken very little part in the strife decided that there was no reason for quitting the game and a general meeting was called, and it was decided that the league be reorganized under entirely new officers. The Shamrocks were the only old team to join the new League, but the Lyceums, North Stars and Y. M. C. A. came on, making a four team league. The following officers were elected, President, Frank L. Taylor, 1st Vice-President W. R. Talbot, 2nd Vice-Pres. J. H. Mortimer, Secretary, P. J. Cantwell, Treasurer Roy Chambers. These officers took a very active interest in the affairs of the League and thanks to their efforts, amateur baseball enjoyed its most successful season.

At the present writing the prospects for this season are of the very brightest. River Park grounds have been secured, and three teams, Y. M. C. A., Lyceums and Shamrocks have already organized and are at practice.

A write up of Amateur ball would be incomplete without mentioning a few of the officers and players who have helped to make it a success. Prominent among the officers are W. G. White, G. Ford and C. P. Walker, the donors of the handsome trophy which is annually fought for. Geo. Saults did a lot of useful work for the League in the past, also A. H. Palford. While no team has ever won the championship twice, several players have had the honor, and three players have helped to win it three times, Fred Timney, Bill Harkness and Frank Taylor. Among the pitchers of note are De Savigny who pitched the Capitals to victory, Bige Hallock of the Ninetieth, Bill Tait of the Young Liberals, Tillmore of the Mets, Bedford of the Y. M. C. A., Roche of the Lyceums, Cail of the Unions and Weldon of Unions and Lyceums.

CIVIC Curling Club of Winnipeg is the youngest curling organization in the city. Its membership is confined to those within the Civic Service. On November 26th, 1901, a meeting of the enthusiastic curlers engaged in the Civic Service was held at the City Hall at which meeting an organization composed of some 20 members was formed and was known as the Civic Curling League. At that time the members of the League were dependent on the sister clubs for ice accommodation, and were, therefore, restricted to only such games as could be arranged for when the ice was not occupied by Club games.

In 1903, the membership had increased to 35, and it was felt that some steps should be taken to establish a rink in order to provide proper opportunity for play. In 1904, the Civic Curling Club was formed, Alderman J. G. Latimer being elected president.

The City Council very kindly allowed the Club the use of its storage shed at Corner of McDermot Ave. and Pearl St. for rink purposes, and this provided two sheets of ice. By permission of the city the Club has had the use of this building ever since.

The membership of the Club has continued to increase each year until now it has some 55 active members. The season of 1907-8 just closed, has been the most successful one in the club's history. The Civics are the present holders of the O'Grady Challenge Cup, first put up for competition at the 1908 Bonspiel.

Another good feature about this Society is the efforts they make to relieve distressed Clansmen or their families, and find employment for those who have newly arrived from the Old Country. During summer months the Society hold quite a large number of sporting events, which are always well attended. The entrance fee for Active Membership are as follows: Physician's fee, \$2.00; Initiation fee, \$3.00 and Honorary Members Initiation fee, \$5.00. The present membership exceeds 250, who pay an annual fee of \$2.00.

The Clan Stewart has also a Ladies Auxiliary under the name of Flora MacDonald, which was organized at the beginning of this year and promises to be a great success. Mrs. John Duff is President, and the secretary is Miss L. Bullock, 55 Kate St. The Auxiliary is open to all ladies of Scottish birth or descent. The fee is only \$1.00 with 50 cts. as quarterly dues.

ON April 12th, 1905, the Clef Club was organized with thirty members, having for its president, George Bowles, who has held this position, being re-elected every year. The present membership is nearly two hundred, and is steadily increasing.

The objects of the Club are the promotion of music and the development of a friendly feeling amongst amateur and professional musicians.

The first mentioned object of the Club is the principal one, and the Saturday musicales which are held in the well-appointed music room of the organization every week from September to May, are a source of great enjoyment and education to the large audiences which attend. The Clef Club male chorus, of about twenty picked voices, under the leadership of the president, is deserving of special mention in this article, for the work which it has done during the two past seasons. THE Commercial Club with its membership of over six hundred, is one of the largest clubs in Canada and within its handsome Main Street home has an institution which for its appointments has few equals. The Commercial was started very modestly about eight years ago by a number of Winnipeg's busy commercial men who felt the need of such an institution. Rented quarters were first secured, but so fast did the new club grow that in two months time it was necessary to look for permanent quarters.

So rapidly did the club expand that it was soon found necessary to remodel and almost double the capacity of the building. This work was started in 1904 and during that summer the club was housed in Hugh Sutherland's old residence. The reconstructed and redecorated club was taken possession of by the members in 1905 having been in the hands of the contractors for one year.

The club is constructed of a light colored brick with a red sandstone front, and consists of three stories and a basement. The main entrance opens into a long corridor, communicating with all the rooms on the ground floor. The walls are decorated with red burlap, every other panel being hand-painted in attractive designs. Heads of elk, deer, moose and Rocky Mountain goat give an added charm, not only to the walls of the entrance, but throughout the whole building. There is a large dining room in polished oak on the second floor, also a ladies' reception room. Connecting the two dining rooms are the kitchen, pantries and servants quarters. On the third floor is a large billiard room with four tables, three American and one English. On this floor also, is the smoking room and a reading and lounging room. On the next floor will be found the card room, and from here a door leads to the roof garden, where an excellent view of the city is obtained. The following are the officers for 1908. COMMERCIAL TRAVELLERS ASSOCIATION

WE must turn back the page of history to the year 1882, to find the beginning of the Commercial Travellers Association of the North-west. On October the 19th of that year a little band of commercial men met together in the Grand Union Hotel, Winnipeg. The first meeting of this organization unfolds a pathetic story of the inconveniences and trials of the knights of the grip scattered over the West. It was felt by the pioneers of the organization assembled there that afternoon that there was a crying need for a strong association to successfully and legitimately ask for improvements, and combat existing evils to which, in the course of their business, they were daily subjected. It was suggested that some special railway rates should be issued to these knights of the road, who probably used more mileage in a stated time, than any other class of travellers in existence. Hotel accommodation was very poor along the road, and where licenses were granted to men to conduct hotels, it was felt that the proprietors should be compelled in some way to provide accommodation sufficient and as up-to-date as the resources of the country would permit.

Telegraph Companies, it was suggested should give preferential tariffs to the Commercial travellers, and the organization should be effected for the due insurance of its members. Again it was voiced that a brotherhood banded together for the mutual exchange of valuable information of matters of peculiar interest to commercial men would be a decided advantage. Individual complaints at existing evils they found of little avail, and so a union with weight behind it was absolutely necessary. So then, on the conclusion of the meeting, resolutions were passed to join hands to carry these improvements into effect. Such was the beginning of the Commercial Travellers Association of the Northwest. To-day it has over 3000 members, and is one of the strongest organizations in Canada. Last year another organization was formed from among the members of the old association called the Commercial Travellers Club. The latter has a membership of 560. These organizations are both housed under one roof, a very solid and very comfortable structure on the corner of King and Bannatyne. The building was opened about Christmas last year and is equipped with all the latest luxuries and improvements known to the builder. This is a splendid record from such a small beginning. THE PRESENT organization is the outcome of an amalgamation of the Young Men's Conservative Club and the Maple Leaf Conservative Club. CRICKET was popular in Winnipeg as far back as 1873, when the Selkirk Cricket Club was formed. MANITOBA Dental Association was organized in 1883 with twelve members, Dr. J. L. Benson being elected President. The present membership is over eighty, and about one-third of this number are practicing in Winnipeg. The Association is the legal licensing body for the Province and meets twice a year, generally in Winnipeg. At these sessions candidates for license to practise dentistry are examined by a Board of Directors consisting of not less than six, who are elected to office for four years. The profession of dentistry is extensively practised in Manitoba and especially in Winnipeg, and a very high standard of qualification is required of each practitioner by the Board. WHEN the T. Eaton Co. opened up its business in Winnipeg there were some 250 of the Toronto staff brought here to assist in developing the same system which was being used in the Toronto Store. They secured the ground floor of the residence on the corner of Graham and Donald, formerly owned and occupied by Mr. George Stovel, but now the property of the Company. The Company fitted up the rooms, not elaborately but suitably, and the Club have enjoyed these apartments ever since.

It started with a membership of 205 but now, although the necessity for this club is removed, the membership still stands at 180, and its scope now takes in all the employees of the T. Eaton Co. The rooms are open to members at all times, and on certain evenings special entertainments are provided. During the three years of its existence the committees have provided some excellent entertainments in the way of assemblies, concerts and smokers, and there are those of us who have been members since its inauguration, who will look back in the years to come with a great deal of satisfaction, to the many pleasant hours we have spent at the Eatonia Club. In connection with the club, genial spirits have formed inner clubs or circles, from which they have derived great benefit and pleasure. For instance, a French Class was formed. A number of those with oratorical aspirations formed a debating society while others, always delighted with a rubber, formed a Whist Club.

The Fees for the Club are very reasonable, the ladies being charged 25 cts. per month or \$2.00 per year, and gentlemen 50 cts. per month or \$5.00 per year. The Club is entirely self-sustaining, and is not kept up, as some may imagine, by the Company, although it has always had the hearty support and encouragement of all the officers of the Company.

THE Winnipeg Golf Club was organized on June 28, 1894, at a meeting held in the Old Manitoba Hotel the first president being Mr. W. B. Searth. ALTHOUGH an attempt to organize a Grain Exchange was made in 1884, it was not until 1887 that the organization was carried out, and the present Exchange started under articles of Association with a membership of about fifty. The time of the organization was very opportune for the large crop of every kind of grain that year would have hampered very much the previous business organization in existence to handle and market it.

A charter from the Provincial government was secured, and the Exchange had full authority, by act of parliament, for its standing. Besides having its daily meetings, at which the grain transaction of the Northwest are centered and carried out, the exchange has its organization framed to keep the grain business of the country within controllable limits and flowing in a channel which guarantees fair treatment not only to local dealers and exporters, but also to foreign purchasers and consignees. Every member of the exchange enjoys its privileges and advantages only upon condition of straight forward and honorable trading with all patrons and clients.

Besides a regular council or executive, the exchange has a standing arbitration committee before which all disputes between members or between members and their distant consignees or purchasers, are settled; also a standing committee of appeals, who hear and settle all matters of appeal by shippers or outsiders.

As might be expected, the growth of the membership of this institution has been rapid. From the fifty who first formed it in 1887 it has now a total membership of three hundred, while the cost of membership has also increased from the modest sum of \$25 to \$4,000. So that members have now something at stake, and consequently are more particular as to the engagements they enter into, than heretofore. In other words, each member practically furnishes a guarantee of four thousand dollars for the honesty of all his transactions on the Exchange.

ANCIENT ORDER OF HIBERNIANS



THIS society is one of the youngest in the city, it being formed on the 20th of April, 1908, and has at present over 100 members the president being Mr. J. J. Dutton. 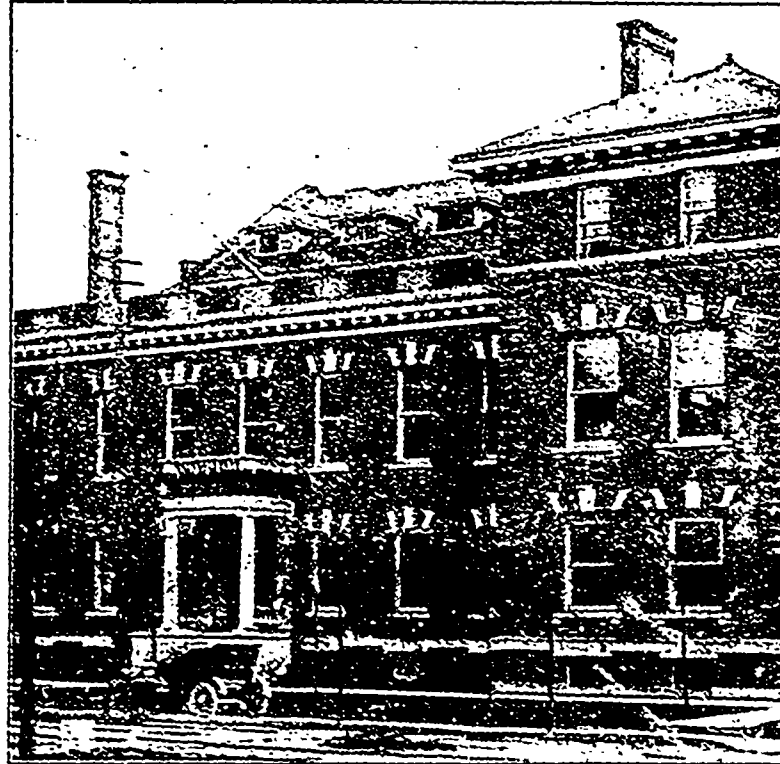

Since the club moved to its present sumptuous abode it has entertained many notable men from all parts among whom are Prince Fushimi of Japan, the Duke of Connaught, J. J. Hill. THIS Association took practical shape after a lengthy discussion at a meeting of sportsmen from all parts of Manitoba assembled at the Y. M. C. A. hall on March 31st, 1905. The meeting was called for the purpose of ascertaining what would be the best policy to pursue in assisting in the protection of the Game Birds and Animals of Manitoba, and of arousing a greater public interest throughout the Province in game protective measures. The outcome of this meeting was the formation of the above Association, the principal objects of which is "to foster public sentiment for the preservation of Manitoba's game heritage; to support the enforcement of the game laws, and in time, to place officers in the field to assist the Provincial game wardens." CONVENTION AT BRANDON LAST SUMMER

On October 17th, 1877, the Manitoba Sunday School Association was formed at a convention held in Winnipeg, the Rev. James Robertson being elected President, and the Rev. E. W. Marrow, M.A., as Secretary-Treasurer. The records show that the Rev. Mr. Marrow, who for several years before coming to Manitoba, had been a member of the Sunday School Association of Ontario and Quebec, was the person who first took action in the formation of the Association, and he died in Winnipeg on August 31st, 1881 at the age of 41 years. This Association which had at the close of 1877 only 207 members has to-day the grand total of 5,671 throughout the Province, and about one third of this number are located in Winnipeg.

Up to 1888 nothing had been done to extend the work of the organization, or to arouse interest in Sunday school work aside from holding the annual convention. The executive committee of 1891-2, saw the necessity of having a man in the field giving his entire time to the work but the man could not be found until January 1892 when Mr. W. H. Irwin of Brandon was placed in charge. On entering upon his duties he found the county associations formed in 1888, sweetly slumbering. A vigorous and systematic educational campaign was at once started and carried on until all the populated portions of the province were brought under organization, and new life put into the work. 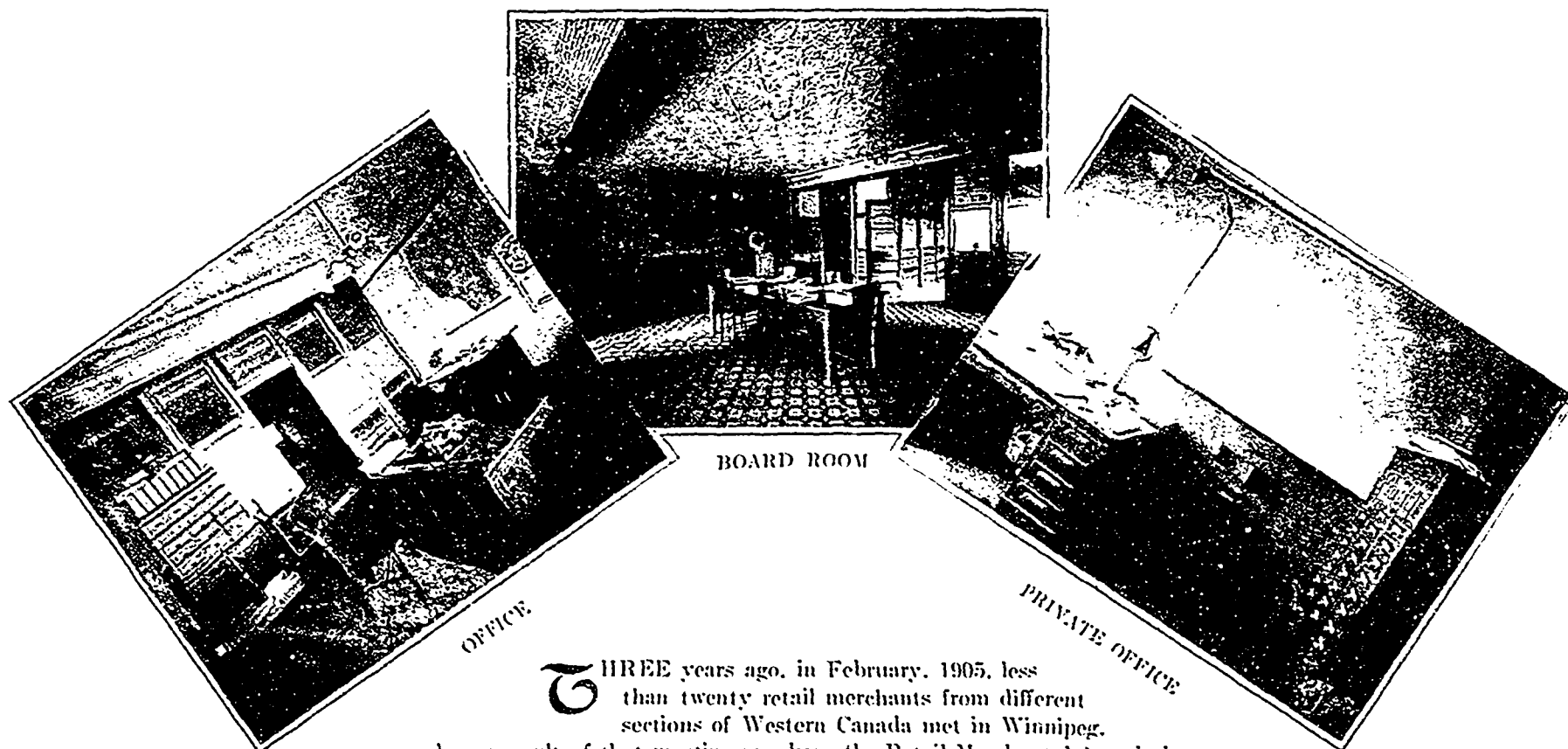

AMONGST the many Rifle Associations throughout Manitoba, the Winnipeg Civilian Rifle Ass'n deserves mention. Formed in 1901 under the able Captaincy of one of the expert shots of the West, Dr. M. C. Clarke, it has enjoyed great popularity and has counted among its members some of the best shots turned out in the Province, having included in its membership such marksmen as Mr. H. Welford, first secretary, late of the 90th regiment, Dr. W. Webster, now Commanding Officer of the 16th Field Ambulance in this City, Mr. H. A. Wise, now of the same Corps, Mr. T. C. Burns and many others who have gained notoriety in the shooting both here and at Ottawa and also at the Bisley Ranges in England. Many of the trophies and prizes offered at the Manitoba Rifle Association matches held annually at Sturgeon Creek Rifle Range in this city, have from time to time fallen to the guns of the W. R. A. some two or three members of the Ass'n having, by the score made at those matches, been chosen each year, amongst other good shots to represent the West at the Dominion rifle meet, which takes place annually at the Rockliffe Ranges, Ottawa. These representatives are sent under the auspices of the Manitoba Rifle Association and are chosen according to the Grand Aggregate scores made at the Manitoba Rifle meet. As an incentive to the younger members of this Association, a number of handicap matches are held during the shooting season at the Sturgeon Creek ranges for silver and bronze medals, which are shot for monthly, whilst a weekly shoot for a gold button for the new beginners, is a new idea to be tried this coming year. The Association recognizes the fact that, although possessed of some of the city's best shots, yet they do not fail to understand the need of training the eye of the new beginner. In the training of the new members, the older ones have not only the satisfaction of helping them to take their place in the shooting fraternity, but the great satisfaction that they have trained a man to be useful to his country, both as to forming a part of its defence and attack should his services be needed. It is hoped during the coming season to have open shoots between the sister clubs and Associations in and out of town as in previous years. Much praise is due the late Captain Dr. M. C. ON February 2nd, 1883, the Winnipeg Rowing Club was organized in the room of the bachelors' quarters known as the "Bungalow" situated at the foot of George street, the first President elected being Mr. Thomas Renwick and secretary W. S. Grant. The meeting was recorded "as very enthusiastic" and considerable progress was made until the Spring of '84, when the river overflowed its banks and carried away the boat house. Several members of the club who were near by at the time were notified and arrived on the spot just in time to see the barge sail out of view on its trip north. Reinforcements were hurried up and a hot pursuit followed, and after several unsuccessful attempts at rescue the much prized boathouse was abandoned at Kildonan. Despite this loss and many other difficulties that soon appeared, the club made steady progress and to-day it is the second largest rowing organization in Canada.

For several years the club confined itself solely to home regattas, but about 1886 it went further afield and made an excellent showing at the Canadian Henley Regattas, winning since then the Senior Fours three times, the Intermediate Fours, Junior Fours twice; Senior Doubles, Junior doubles twice and Junior Singles. At the National Regattas for the championships of America, the club has been almost as successful. Several trophies have also been secured at the International regattas, and of these the Senior Fours win in 1896, is highly-prized, having been lifted in record breaking time. The home regattas which are held during the Spring and Fall, give every member a chance to enjoy the pleasures of racing. The officers of the club are: President, G. F. Galt; Vice-President, J. C. G. THE objects of this Society are to advance the interests of Englishmen and their descendants by providing a sure means of mutual protection in times of sickness and distress, and to strengthen the bond of union between England and the lands her sons have peopled. There exists to-day from the Atlantic to the Pacific a network of lodges each one the rallying point of the Englishmen of the locality and the centre from which they carry on the good work. The Society was first started in Canada in 1874, at Toronto. There are now lodges in South Africa, Newfoundland, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Ontario, Quebec, Manitoba, North-West Territories and British Columbia.

The Neptune Lodge was organized on July 24th, 1891, with 24 members, which number has now been increased to 330. The first President was W. Jones, who held the office for two years.

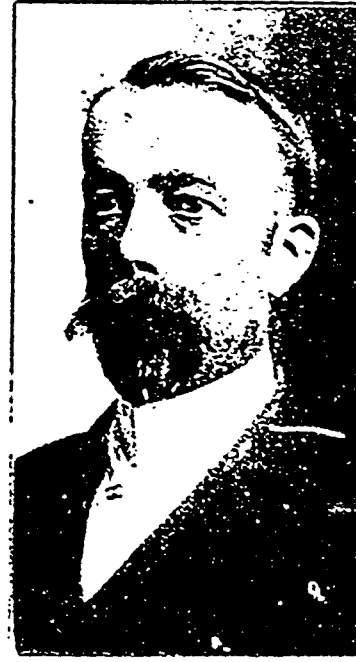

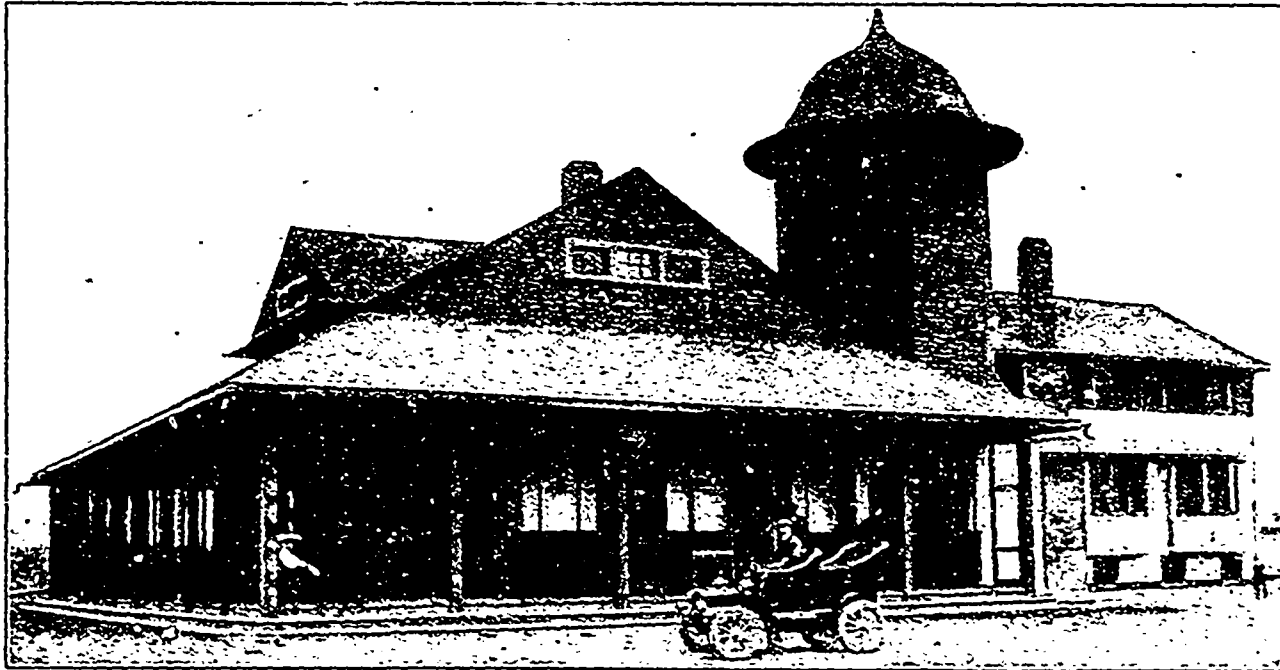

ST. Andrew's Society is one of the oldest in Winnipeg, being organized in 1871 and had for its first President, Donald A. Smith, now Lord Strathcona. Apart from fostering a love for the old home, the main object of the society is to provide quarters where Scotchmen coming to Winnipeg may meet their fellow-countrymen who are always pleased to assist them in obtaining employment and giving them the benefit of their experiences by tendering sound advice. The charitable work is also a feature of what the society regards as its chief duty. The case of all applicants for charity is enquired into and relief given. The number assisted during the past winter was perhaps the largest for a similar period in the history of the society. All Scotchmen in the city are invited to join the society and assist in the excellent work that is now being carried on.

The social side of the society has been well cared for, two English billiard tables having been installed with the usual accommodation for card-playing, chess, music and reading. All the principal Scottish newspapers are subscribed to and are on file for the use of members and their friends. The Society's big event of the year is the celebration of St. Andrews day, which falls on the last day of November, and is observed either by a Ball or a Banquet. There are at present about 300 members on the roll, and the rooms of the Society are open from 1 p.m. until 11 p. m. In addition to insurance the Order gives sick and funeral benefits of \$300, or \$6 for first two weeks, \$5 or \$10 for succeeding ten weeks, and \$50 or \$100 funeral benefit, according to rate paid. The rate for insurance will compare favorably with any purely Canadian Order.

The Order is incorporated by Act of Parliament 1893, and the books and securities of the Order are regularly examined by the Superintendent of Insurance.

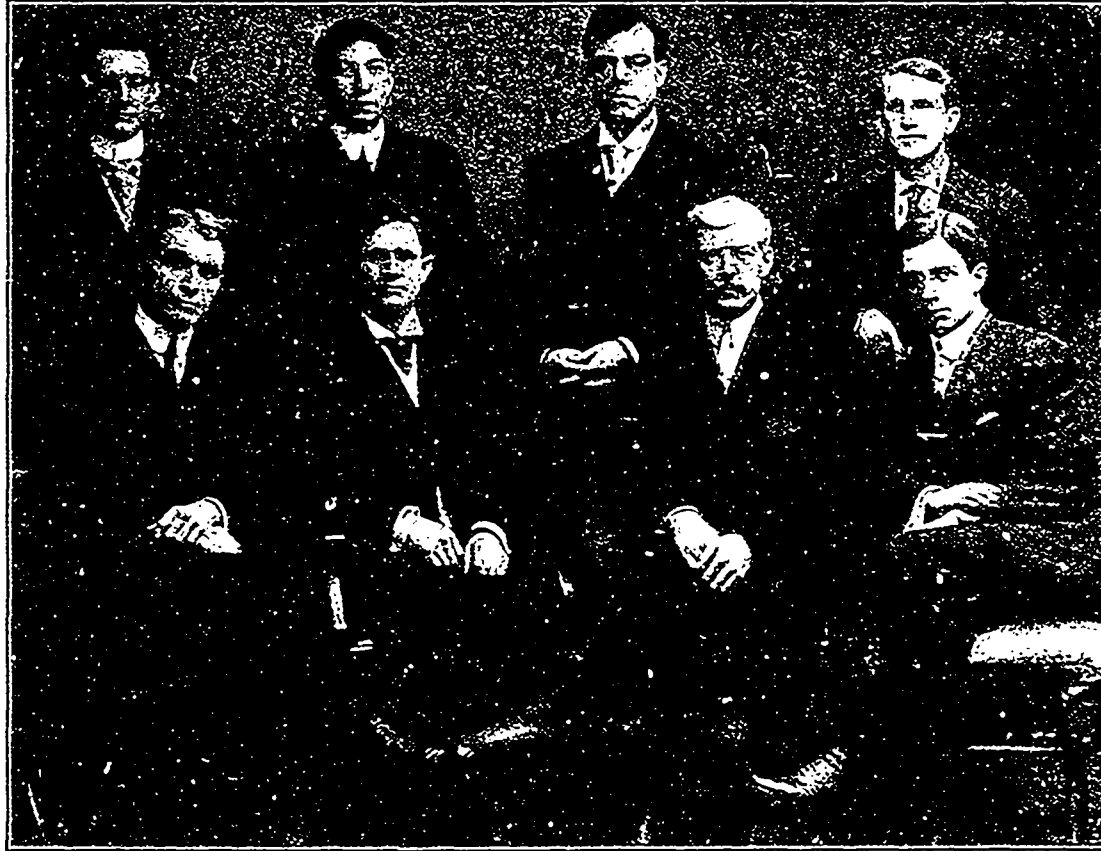

The first room was located at the corner of Main and Owen Streets (now McDermot Ave.), but later on in that year rooms were rented over Lister's store on Main Street near the corner of Portage Avenue. These rooms were open from 6.30 to 9.30 every evening. The present building was opened on January 17th, 1901, and was easily recognized at that time as very well adapted to the growing work of the Association. Provision was made in its construction for the development of the all-round work of the institution, which had been impossible in the rented quarters of earlier years. The building and lot cost \$100,000 and was built entirely by subscription, \$25,000 of this amount having been secured from friends of the work in Eastern Canada.

Since entering the building, there has been rapid increase in the work of the Association. The membership has grown until the year 1907 closed with one thousand three hundred and thirty-eight.

The work is divided into four leading departments, Physical, Educational, Social and Religious.

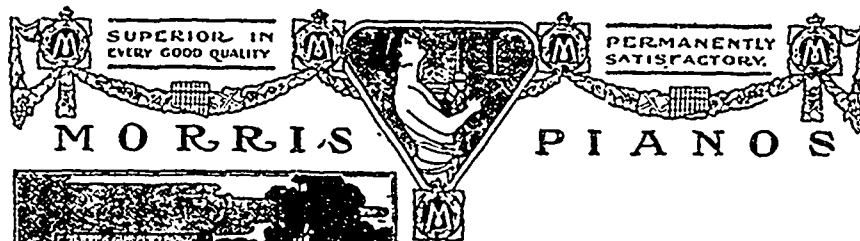

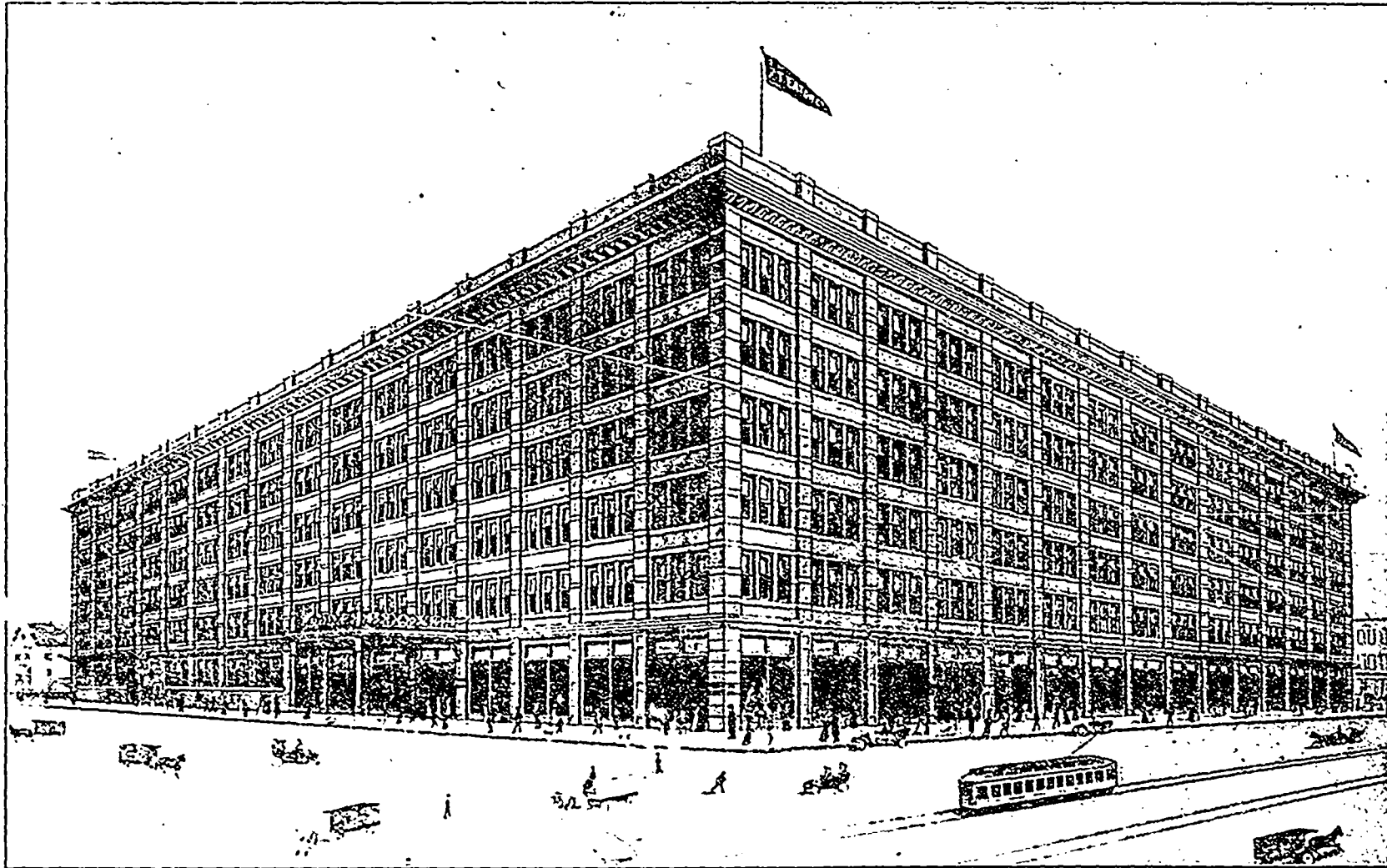
