BOYS' HOME.

TWENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL MEETING.

The twenty-sixth annual meeting of the lady managers and friends of the Boys' Home was held on Tuesday, 10th of February, at the Home in George Street.

Among those present were His Lordship the Bishop of Algoma, President Wilson, Rev. Canon Dumoulin, Rev. D. J. Macdonell, Rev. E. A. Stafford, Rev. Dr. Potts, Rev. Dr. Reid, Rev. G. M. Wrong, Rev. J. P. Lewis, Rev. G. M. Milligan, Rev. M. Hobson, and Mr. J. G. Hodgins, Deputy Minister of Education, Rev. Robert Wallace.

Owing to the unavoidable absence of Mayor Howland, President Daniel Wilson kindly consented to occupy the chair, and the Rev. D. J. Macdonell opened the meeting with prayer.

Letters were read from His Worship Mayor Howland, Hon. G. W. Allan, Col. Gzowski, Hon. S. H. Blake, Hon. Chief Justice Patterson, the Lord Bishop of Toronto, Rev. Dr. Thomas, Rev. Elmore Harris, Rev. Hugh Johnston, Rev. Mr. Patterson, (Deer Park), Rev. Prof. McLaren, Rev. J. Fielding Sweeney, Rev. H. M. Parsons, Rev. P. McF. McLeod, Mr. J. J. Withrow, and others, regretting their inability to be present.

Dr. Potts then read the twenty-sixth annual report as follows :

The Lady Managers of the Boys' Home, in presenting this, their twenty-sixth annual report, showing what has been done during the past year, to the friends and patrons of the institution, and to the public, desire, with grateful hearts, to record their devout thanks and praise to the

Heavenly Father for His continued goodness, and their sincere thanks to the many kind friends of the institution for the generous support and encouragement which they have given the managers and trust that in this account of their stewardship the benefactors may see that their confidence has not been misplaced.!

The total number of inmates in the Home during the past year is two hundred and fifty-five, including those in residence on the first of January, 1885, of these twenty-seven were apprenticed to farmers, one hundred received temporary shelter, whilst waiting for situations in the country, two were sent to friends in England, twenty-three were removed by parents or friends, ten ran away, and ninety-three remain in the Home.

During the past year seven boys have completed their term of apprenticeship, and are now in positions which enable them to support themselves. At the present time there are eighty-nine boys of various ages, serving their time with farmers. The demand for boys has been greater than ever during the past year, the managers being unable to fill all applications. Whilst on this subject the managers do not think it out of place to mention the terms and conditions upon which boys are bound to farmers: They are usually sent out at ten and bound until they are eighteen years of age. When a farmer makes application for a boy, he is required to furnish two certificates of character, one from his clergyman and the other from a Justice of the Peace. Two months are allowed for approbation: if the boy proves satisfactory, indentures are signed in triplicate by the First Directress and the farmer, each receiving a copy, the third being filed in the office of the Clerk of the City Council. The boy must be kept comfortably clothed, and sent regularly to church (Protestant) and Sunday School, and to the Public School for at least four months of each year; a payment of four dollars, must be made to the managers at the expiration of the first year, and an increase of four dollars for each succeeding year ex-

cept the last two years, which in every case must be twenty-eight and thirty-two dollars each respectively, and with each of said payments the farmer must transmit to the Secretary of the Institution an annual statement in writing, of the condition and welfare of the boy ; such statement to be certified by one of the clergy of the parish or the minister of the church to which the farmer belongs, and the school teacher where the boy attends school. The sum of the aforesaid payments are placed at interest for the benefit of the boy, and his use when the indenture expires, subject however to the discretion of the managers, in the boy's welfare, until he becomes of age. And lastly, at the expiration of the boy's apprenticeship or term of service, the farmer shall provide the boy with a good new suit of clothes, suitable to the condition of the said boy. If a boy leave his place before his term expires, without just or good cause, he forfeits the money which has been paid for him, and the amount thus forfeited is added to the funds of the institution. This occurs occasionally, and in nearly every case, the cause, when traced, is found to be ill advice from mischief makers, who tell the boys they ought to be receiving higher wages ; giving amount paid in harvest time for example, forgetting that the boy must be fed and clothed in winter, kept in a comfortable home attending school, etc.

As in former years, letters have been frequently received from boys, who have been sent to farmers, we shall however only give two brief extracts :—" I take this pleasant opportunity of writing to you to tell you I am well, and hope these few lines may find you the same. I have been going to school pretty near every day since, and I am trying hard to pass the examination at Christmas, as my 'boss' says he will get me a new suit of clothes if I pass. I have a very good 'boss,' he has not said a cross word to me yet, and I would like very much to stay, and I hope my brothers are well. Your friend, T." Two months later the same boy writes again, commencing this letter the same as the other, he continues—" I must tell you the kind of winter

we are having ; it is so cold we can scarcely go out, and I had to stay home from school, but I have got the suit my 'boss' promised me if I passed at the examination. I would have written sooner, but my 'boss' was in Toronto a month ago, and he intended to go and see you, only he had not time ; he intended going again at Christmas and said he would take me, only Mrs. R. was ill, and we could not go, so I thought I would write and tell you. My father used to live in Toronto, but I do not know where he is now. Please tell the boys I am going for a sleigh ride on Christmas. Your sincere friend, T."

The Managers are glad to be able to report, that no death or serious case of sickness has occurred during the year. One boy was hurt by an explosion of fireworks in the Gardens on the evening of Dominion Day. Dr. Aikens very kindly attended to him at first, after which he was under the care of our good friend Dr. Thorburn, until quite recovered. As a precaution, owing to the prevalence of small pox in other places, the boys have all been vaccinated. This, of course, necessitated more frequent calls upon the valuable time of Dr. Thorburn, but as in the past, his services were most cheerfully given. This treatment also gave the matron, Mrs. Munro, and her kind assistant Miss McKay, extra care, and nursing ; and the Managers again express their continued appreciation of their faithful services. Dr. Thorburn will add his report.

The Managers had occasion again, during the summer, to extend hospitality to the stranger, in admitting the boys Mr. J. C. Fegan brought across the Atlantic from his "Boys' Home," Southwark, London, England, who remained until the places to which they were going, in the North-West, were ready. The extra expenses incurred were again generously defrayed by Mr. W. Gooderham, who still continues to take a warm interest in the institution, and in the welfare of the boys he has also generously given the full equipment for a fife and drum band of twenty performers, and provided a band instructor, Mr. J. McNeil.

Special thanks are due to Mr. Jos. McCuaig, for kindly teaching the boys gratuitously until a paid instructor was provided.

The Managers would express their thanks to the Captains of the various ferry boats and steamers : to Alderman Harry Piper of the " Zoo," and to kind friends, including those who sent liberal donations at Christmas (thus sharing their dinner with the boys) for their consideration in affording opportunities for pleasure and enjoyment ; also to the butchers on Yonge Street and at the Market, and the grocers and bakers throughout the city who have assisted in supplying the wants of the institution, and to the editors of the various morning and evening papers for inserting gratuitously matters relating to the institution ; to the Trustees of the Public School Board for consideration and attention bestowed upon the education of the boys, and to Mr. J. L. Hughes, Inspector of Public Schools, for the kind courtesy he has ever shown to them.

The Managers again desire to acknowledge with grateful hearts, the unselfish service rendered by Mr. Robert Kilgour, superintendent of the Sabbath School, Mr. S. B. Brush, musical director, and the teachers, in devoting a portion of the day of rest in giving religious instruction to the boys, and whose never failing efforts to promote their spiritual welfare cannot be too highly commended.

The Managers desire to acknowledge with gratitude the receipt of four hundred and forty-one dollars, a portion of a legacy left some years ago by the late Mr. Williams of Owen Sound. Owing to indefiniteness of description by the testator, only one-half of the original amount was received by the institution.

They also desire to acknowledge receipt of a legacy of one hundred dollars bequeathed by the late Mr. Robert Walker, in whose removal the Home has lost a true faithful friend. We find in looking over the records of the past, as far back as 1863, a gift of five hundred dollars to a building

fund, and Mr. Walker continued to feel a warm sympathy with this work of charity until the last.

The Managers have to regret the retirement of one of their number, Miss Mitchell, whose name has been placed on the list of honorary members. She has for many years taken a warm interest in the Home, faithfully performing all the duties devolving upon her.

It is with a feeling of sincere sorrow and regret that the Committee have to record the removal by death of four of its oldest and most esteemed members—three of these ladies however, had not been engaged in active work for some time, after many years of unselfish labor they had found it necessary to retire, through failing health or other duties. Mrs. McCutcheon was first Directress from the inception of the Home in 1859, until 1881, when advancing years compelled her to retire from active membership. For nearly a quarter of a century she worked to advance the interests of the institution, fulfilling faithfully the duties devolving upon her, always presiding with unflinching gentleness and courtesy. As long as the Boys' Home stands the name of Mrs. McCutcheon shall be associated with it. Mrs. Davidson, also a member of the Board from its early days, the interest she had ever taken in the welfare of the Home ending only with her life. Mrs. Beard, one who ever took a deep interest in the welfare of the boys, amiable and loving in the discharge of her duties, until she left us in 1882, to reside in Montreal, and Mrs. Wilson, also one of the first members, whose sudden removal from our midst so recently makes it hard for us to realize that she will join us here no more. She ever took a deep interest in the "Boys' Home," and whatever duty she undertook could be relied upon to fulfil, unselfish and thoughtful, we miss her cheering presence, the loss sustained by her death is very great. She was a devoted worker until the last. Met with us at a Thanksgiving Service in November, and a few days later passed into the presence of the Master.

The Treasurer's report will show a full and satisfactory

statement of the financial position of the institution, and in closing the Lady Managers again commend the Home to the sympathy and help of the friends of the poor and destitute, to enable the Committee to continue in their work of caring for the boys and preparing them to become useful members of society.

Hitherto hath the Lord helped us and we will still "trust in Him."

MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

In presenting my twenty-sixth annual report, it affords me much pleasure to inform the Lady Managers and the friends of the Institution that another year has passed without any deaths occurring among the boys. We have not, however, been free from sickness. Inflammatory diseases have prevailed to a considerable extent,—as sore throat, croup, bronchitis and pneumonia, and one boy received a severe wound on both legs from the explosion of fireworks in the Horticultural Gardens, in July last. I am happy to say, however, that he is completely recovered, without any ill effects. Two boys were admitted and subsequently removed, one because he was suffering from constitutional vice and his presence was a source of much discomfort to the inmates, he was sent to the General Hospital; the other boy was idiotic and of disgusting and filthy habits, he had been forwarded from the country without these facts being stated; after much trouble to the Institution he was returned to the place from which he came.

I would suggest in future that no boy be admitted with-

out a certificate (from a medical man of the place in which the boy resides), stating in full the mental and physical condition of the applicant, which should be subsequently submitted to the Managers for approval before admission.

In consequence of small-pox prevailing in our country, all the inmates have been vaccinated once and some twice and three times. I am happy to say that the dreaded disease did not make its appearance among us, which we can safely attribute to the precautionary measure of vaccination.

The sanitary condition of the Home is very excellent. I would however make the two following suggestions:— First, in reference to the Gymnasium; the present concrete floor should be changed to a wooden one, the dust arising from the former is a constant source of irritation to throat and lungs of the boys, which would be completely removed by replacing it by the latter.

Secondly, there is an absolute necessity for an Infirmary and Dispensary in the Home. At present we have no means of separating the sick from the well, which in the event of an epidemic would militate against the recovery of the sick and greatly endanger the other inmates of the Home.

As in former years, I wish to place on record my full appreciation of the courtesies and assistance rendered me at all times by the Managers and Officials of the Institution.

The presence of Mr. Wilson has been conducive of much good; he teaches the boys to be methodical and regular in their habits, lessons which they cannot forget in after life.

In speaking to his motion, the Bishop made some earnest remarks, in a strain of quaint humor peculiarly his own.

The motion was seconded by the Rev. G. M. Milligan, who spoke of the necessity of religious education in the training of the boys.

It was then moved by the Rev. Canon Dumoulin, seconded by the Rev. E. A. Stafford,—That the meeting gratefully recognize the valuable services of the Sunday School Teachers, and that the same be tendered to Mr. Robert Kilgour, Superintendent; Mr. S. E. Brush, Musical Director; Miss Hynes, Miss Coleman, Miss Wills, Mr. J. Macdonald, Mr. J. O. Anderson, and Mr. Joseph A. C.

McCuaig, Teachers, for their faithful and devoted labors in this portion of the Master's vineyard, which, with the Divine blessing, they trust, may bear fruit unto life eternal.

It was then moved by Rev. Wm. Reid, D.D., seconded by the Rev. Mr. Hobson :

That the continued success which marks the progress of the Boys' Home, and the proofs of the beneficent results from the training of its inmates, as shown by letters from those who have left, afford the most encouraging assurance to its friends, and calls for grateful acknowledgment to Almighty God for the evidence of the Divine blessing on the labors of the Managers and friends of the institution.

After a vote of thanks to the chairman had been moved by the Rev. J. P. Lewis, seconded by the Rev. Robert Wallace, the Rev. G. M. Milligan pronounced the benediction, and the meeting adjourned.

OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year; the said committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts pre-

mented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution, as also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the "Home" daily, each week; inspect the house; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer, to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The general Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock, a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the discretion of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys; to conduct the household affairs generally; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., Dinner at 12, and Tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed under supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and Divine Service, in a Protestant Church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
