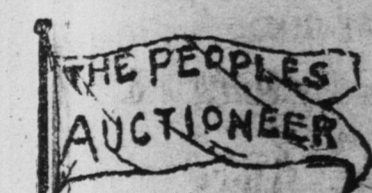

The Great Pearl Robbery.

How the Box Was Repacked—Substituted Seals—Quest for £150,000 Necklace.

No trace has yet been found of the wonderful pearl necklace, valued for selling purposes at £150,000, the property of Mr. Mayer of Hatton Garden, E.C., which was abstracted from a registered postal package between Paris and London on Tuesday or Wednesday.

The English and French police are busily engaged trying to unravel the mystery, and one new fact has come to light. The necklace was carefully packed in a box and the wrapping bore a number of seals with the monogram "MM" impressed. An examination of the wrapping shows that two of the original seals had been replaced with new seals also bearing the monogram "MM."

As stated in a portion of our issue yesterday a reward of £10,000 is offered by Messrs. Price and Gibbs, 23, St. Swithin's-lane, E.C., on behalf of the Lord's underwriters for information leading to the recovery of the stolen property and to the conviction of the thieves. Full details of the necklace, with the weight of each of

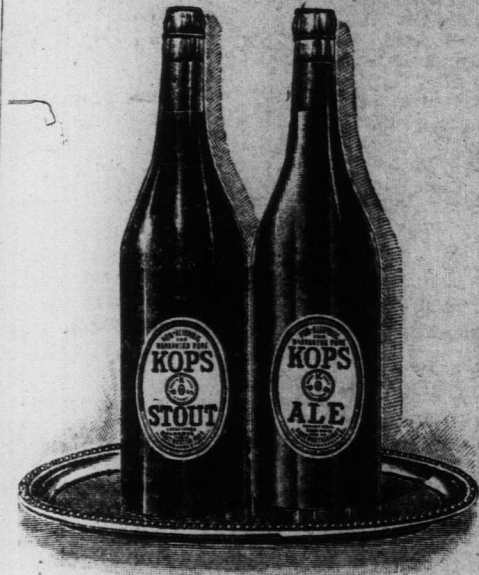

Cable News.

Special to Evening Telegram.

LONDON, July 30.
The Ambassadorial Conference yesterday settled the status of the new Albania. A Prince will be nominated as its ruler, six months hence. Meanwhile a commission of control, composed of one representative of each Power, will organize an administration with the aid of a Swedish officer-gendarmerie. The Conference did nothing officially as to coercing Turkey, and as the strongest feeling is being manifested at indignation meetings throughout India against any attempt to drive the Turks from Adrianople, it is not likely that the British Government will be anxious to initiate coercion.

LONDON, July 30.
The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Telegraph says that Czar Nicholas, attired as a rifleman, with the usual rolled-overcoat, pouches with 120 rounds of ammunition, trenching spade and ration bag altogether weighing 84 lbs. exclusive of rifle, the full outfit of an infantry private, marched up hill and down dale for seven miles, saluting the officers whom he met on the way. No one apparently knew his identity until next day, when he entered himself on the regimental roll as Nicholas Romanoff, married, orthodox faith, coming from Tsarskoe Selo.

LONDON, July 30.
The Greeks are still operating by sea and land. Bulgarians who were defeated at Kresna Pass turned upon the pursuing Greeks and furious fighting occurred. Thrice the Greeks were ejected from their positions. Both sides suffered heavily. Under cover of darkness the Bulgars retired first setting fire to Djuma which the Greeks later re-occupied. It is said that there is now not a single Bulgarian soldier in Macedonia except prisoners. The Greek fleet has occupied Port Lagos.

SHANGHAI, July 30.
Foreign consuls yesterday protested to the Northern admirals against firing over Shanghai. The naval commanders of the international fleet discussed the question, warning the belligerents of this danger, but reached no decision. Two Chinese and two Annamite police were killed in the French concession by Monday night's bombardment. Numerous foreign buildings were damaged by shells.

WASHINGTON, July 30.
Secretary McAdoo has announced that wood pulp and paper would not be admitted free of duty from Russia under the "most favored nation" clause of the commerce and navigation treaty between the two countries having been abrogated. Imports from Austro-Hungary, Germany and Norway will be admitted. The position of other countries is under consideration.

CALGARY, July 30.
Soldiers watched the Dominion Land Office all night, to prevent a recurrence of rioting among those who would file oil leases in the Okotoks district. Rival contingents fought for places in the line yesterday morning. One crowd was jockeyed on their position, but the victors found they were one day too early for filing. Both crowds were again in line last night.

HALIFAX, July 30.
The s.s. Beothic returned here this morning, under her own steam from North Sydney, where Lloyds' Surveyor Saunders had inspected her. Capt. Falk said his ship was slightly damaged. Divers report one hole. The steamer will go into dry dock without unloading any supplies. Repairs will be completed in two or three days, when she will resume the voyage to Hudson Bay.

CONSTANTINOPLE, July 30.
The Russian fleet, which has been cruising near the Bosphorus, was to-day making soundings in Szougolli harbor, 150 miles from Constantinople in Asian waters. The populace of the capital were greatly excited but the news made no impression on the officials who declare that considerably more than a naval demonstration will be required to induce the Porte to abandon Adrianople.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 30.
A story is related here by John McLean, employee in the States Quartermasters' Department, who arrived from Manila by the steamer Permis. He says 195 women and 340 children were killed in one day's fighting, two thousand Moros altogether being killed by General Pershing's soldiers. When the Moros saw that the battle was lost they held their women and children in front of them, as shields, whilst fire from rifles and machine guns mowed them down in scores.

OTTAWA, July 30.
Before returning to Canada in October the Duke of Connaught will be the king's guest, when probably the details of the Prince of Wales' trans-Canadian tour will be arranged. The Duke and Duchess with Princess Patricia are leaving on a yachting trip to Norway.

LONDON, July 30.
Mary Wyman refused to leave jail when released; was sent to a nursing home, refused to enter sat outside till midnight. Finally police brought an ambulance, took her back to jail and thence to Kensington infirmary.

PEKIN, July 30.
