GERMAN ATTACKS CLEVELAND

HE SAYS THE PRESIDENT APPROVED THE BRATTLE BILL.

The bill as fixed up by Senators Jones and Vest was submitted to Cleveland and Carlin and was endorsed by them. The President's approval was described as infamous.

WASHINGTON, July 23.—At noon when the Senate proceeded to begin the debate on the tariff bill, the galleries were filled with hundreds of people in the halls and corridors and on the marble stairways who were unable to get inside the chamber. Both sides of the chamber were pretty well represented.

Senator Gorman spoke on the subject of the tariff bill. He made reference to President Cleveland's letter to Chairman Wilson and the fact that the bill was not passed by a President of the United States.

Cleveland had seen every amendment. Telling of the tariff bill conference Mr. Gorman said every Democratic Senator had been consulted with a view to reconciling their views.

PARLIAMENT PROROGUED

BY LORD ARDEN WITH HIS RAIL IN HIS LAP.

The Ceremonies Not So Impeding as at the Opening—Blackrod's Bow Lack Their Usual Suppleness—The Speech From the Throne—150 Bills Assented To.

OTAWA, July 23.—The gas has fired, the band has played, Blackrod has made his traditional bows and the fourth session of the Fifth Parliament is at an end. The closing ceremonies were not so imposing as the opening. The galleries in the Senate Chamber were well filled, but there were very few ladies on the floor, and the number of Senators present could have been counted on one's fingers without further debate.

There was a short session at 11, at which a letter was read from His Excellency's secretary announcing prorogation for 3 o'clock, at which hour the Speaker took the chair and immediately after the three sounding knocks, which are popularly supposed to be given by the gentleman usher without further debate.

What occurred there in all its detail will probably never be known, but it is learned from the witness who is said to possess the bill that the President expressed a hope that the bill would be sent back to conference without further debate.

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SMELL OF SMOKE AVERTS DISASTER

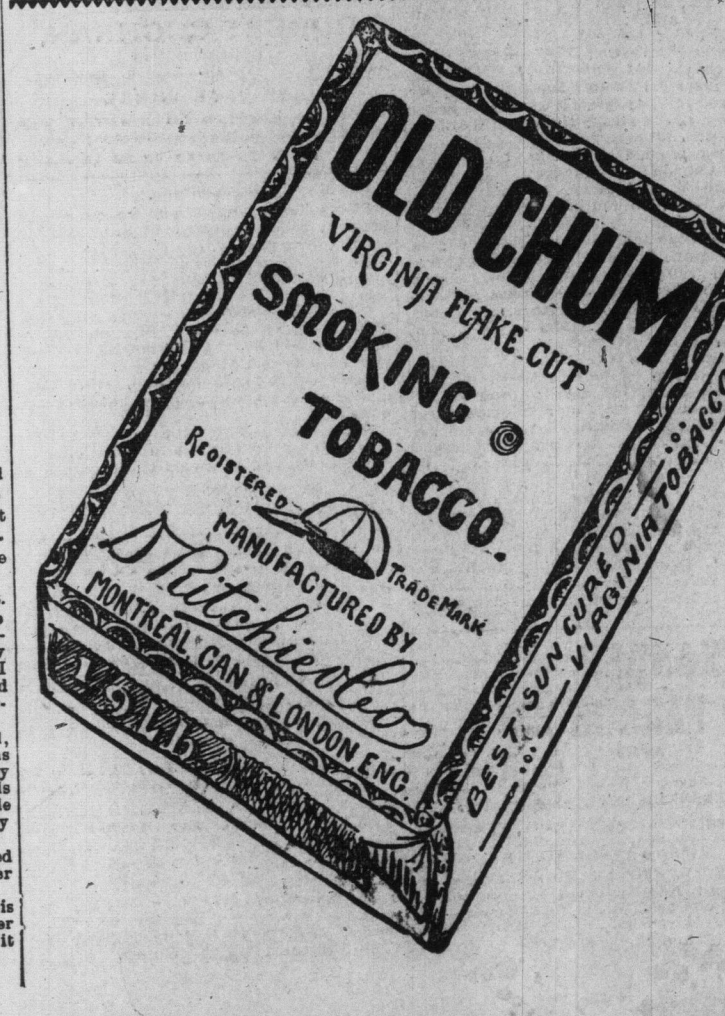
