## Notes

The adjourned business meeting of Tuesday evening last was most excellent in spirit and results. It has been definitely decided what repairs and improvements are to be made. Tenders are to be called for and submitted to the next business meeting, the first Tuesday evening in April, for acceptance. The business part is proceeding in a business-like manner, in strict accord with Baptist usages.

Now it remains for every member of the church, young and old, to become enthusiastic over the coming changes. Certainly everyone admits the need of doing something to make our church home more attractive. There is not one dissenting voice in our congregation on this point. We are unanimous. Even if the Convention, representing over 50,000 Baptists, did not meet with us in August, this work ought to be done immediately. But now that the Convention is assured, it becomes doubly urgent: We may talk about opportune times all our life, and still it will never come without effort. This is the time, this is our opportunity.

It means for each one of us now to take hold and help. The task is a large one, and a few cannot do it alone. If we are genuinely enthusiastic about the necessity, it can be done. All of us will feel better for the sacrifices we will have to make. Unless many of us are prepared to give liberally the work cannot be satisfactorily performed.

We believe that the church and congregation recognize the importance of this undertaking, and will respond most heartily to the call. Encourage the committee by your cheerful subscriptions. It is the Lord's work, and we believe well pleasing in his sight. This has a stronger claim upon us than many other expenditures.

If we can only give a small offering let us do it gladly to the Lord.
