ARRIVAL OF THE STEAMER EUROPA. The steamer Europa arrived at Halifax yesterday.

REACHING A DRAIN: It destroyed a very large portion of the street, and a considerable sum will be required to repair it.

THE BRIDGE AT THE CREDIT AND ON THE STREETVILLE PLANK ROAD: The bridges at the Credit and on the Streetville plank road were partially destroyed.

THE IRON STEAMER MAGNET: Capt. Sutherland made his first trip from Hamilton to Kingston, on Thursday last.

FRANCE: The elections have closed without any disturbance whatever. The official declarations of the members returned from Paris took place on Friday morning.

ITALY: The Pope was to return to Rome in April. The Prussian advances from Berlin inform us that the negotiations between the courts of Austria and Prussia for the definitive conclusion of a central government for Germany have been entirely failed.

RUSSIA: The cold has been unusually severe. The news from Paris on Tuesday and Wednesday was of a more tranquil character than for some days past.

INDIA: The whole of India was perfectly tranquil at the latest dates. The Hermann arrived here yesterday, with 70 passengers and a valuable cargo of French, German, and silver goods.

THE FRANKLIN EXPEDITION: A letter received here from the British Consul at Fort Snelling Minnesota, March 16, says that the Northern Cross of the Franklin Expedition, from Bhering's Straits to Weir's Bay, had been discovered.

DESTRUCTIVE FLOOD: MILLS, DAMS, BRIDGES, AND HOUSES CARRIED AWAY: The neighbourhood of Toronto has just been again the scene of the most disastrous flood that has been known in the vicinity.

KINGSTON BUILDING SOCIETY: At the 35th Local Meeting of the above Society, held at the Court House, in this City, yesterday evening, the 1st of April, ten shares (£1000) were loaned, at an average bonus of 3 1/2 per cent.

CONVICTION OF A MAGISTRATE FOR DEFRAUDING THE REVENUE: At a petty Session held recently in Guilph, Richard Harpell, Esq., one of Her Majesty's recently appointed Justices of the Peace for the County of Waterloo, was convicted on the information of James Brindley, Esq., the County Revenue Inspector, of selling spirituous liquors in small quantities without license and fined £5.

Messrs. Rose and Johnson have very properly abandoned their resistance to the Letters Patent revoking their Commissions as Queen's Counsel. They day yesterday took their seats ordinarily assigned to the gentlemen of the bar, as they were accustomed to do before they were entitled to exercise the privilege.
