JEERS CAUSED SUICIDE. Took the Place of a Striker and was Boycotted. New York, July 30.—George McCabe, 43 years of age, committed suicide yesterday. He cut his throat at his home. Members of the man's family say that McCabe was driven to desperation by the jeers of his fellow-workmen, at the Worthington Hydraulic Works in Brooklyn, where a strike has been in progress.

In a letter to the superintendent of the Maritime Association of New York, he says that if a 21-foot ship canal can be constructed from the lakes to the sea, in accordance with the plans and estimates of the Board of Engineers, on deep waterways, it will undoubtedly be necessary for the State of New York to transfer the Erie Canal to the Federal government.
