A. 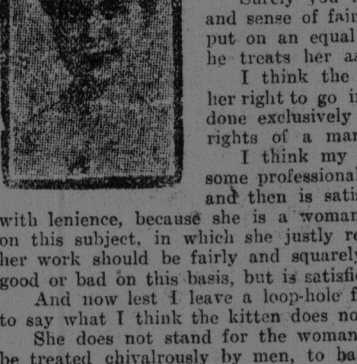
