Truro has the incandescent electric light.

The town of Yarmouth is happy in the possession of a complete system of electric lighting.

The annual report of the penitentiaries of the Dominion shows the following number of inmates in each institution on the 30th of June 1887.

Mr. Baron Botford, M. D., died very suddenly at his home in St. John last Tuesday morning, aged 76 years.

Mr. Israel Hemmors, of Central Quebec, killed 28 ducks at one shot, on the flats at Chebogue Point, on Friday evening last.

The slopes of some of the provincial collieries are assuming great length.

A dispatch has been received at Ottawa announcing that the election of Guillemin, M. P. for Joliette, was annulled by Judge Taschereau for corrupt practices by agents.

The Rev. Mr. French, of Montreal, has been chosen for Knox church, Winnipeg, at a salary of \$3,500.

There has been a drop in wheat all over Manitoba, owing to the decline in the eastern markets.

Joe Fahy, the popular Canadian Pacific conductor, is mentioned as a probable labor candidate for North Winnipeg at the next general election.

The weather is very mild throughout Manitoba and territories. A Medicine Hat farmer counted and ploughing Monday.

Mr. J. J. S. McGee, of St. John, has been chosen for Knox church, Winnipeg, at a salary of \$3,500.

There has been a drop in wheat all over Manitoba, owing to the decline in the eastern markets.

The Gloucester schooner Arthur D. Snow put to sea yesterday afternoon and is expected to be in St. John in a few days.

Fahy, one of the Montreal accused detectives, said that he was confident when his side of the story is told the tables would be turned and the whole proceedings would turn out to be a conspiracy from the beginning to the end.

Twenty-three fishing schooners are in course of construction in Lunenburg county.

St. John county jail now contains thirty-five prisoners.

There are at present in the general public hospital at St. John 56 patients, an unusually large number.

The Grand Southern railway is to be sold at public auction on Friday, May 4th.

An official abstract of the insurance report for the past year shows that the policies in force increased nearly \$14,000,000, the premiums nearly \$500,000, and the matured claims \$162,500, during 87.

Manitoba, boasting a big harvest, is also boasting of her climate. Not a life was lost in the late blizzard on the British side of the line, while in the adjoining territory of the United States, a death toll was numbered by thousands.

The friends of post-mortem assessment insurance charge the old-line experts and journalists with prejudice, inspired by self-interest, because they unceasingly exploit the weakness and delusions of the former system.

This change is disproved, and the objection of those people to the best interests of society is established by the fact that, though the system of The Dominion Safety Fund Life Association, St. John, N. B., is as much in competition with the old line as in the assessment system, yet these experts and journalists have given their hearty endorsement. Self interest has not blinded their eyes to the merits of this system, which have never yet been questioned over the name of a responsible person.

It is reported that application will be made at the next session of the local legislature for an act to incorporate a company to construct a subway under the harbor of St. John, to connect the east and west sides of the city.

The Boston and Moncton railway has been sold to an American syndicate, represented by Dr. Louis J. DeBertram of Brooklyn. The necessary transfers have been made and the road will be pushed to a completion at once and all rolling stock necessary furnished.

The extension of the superstructure of the railway bridge will be commenced in a few days at Fredericton, N. B.

Schooner Second, Dorset, for Digby, drifted out of a apple river with the ice, was abandoned by the crew and is supposed to have sunk. No insurance on vessel or freight.

Mr. St. John, Recorder of Halifax, has accepted the office of Deputy Minister of Justice for the Dominion.

The last incident in the history of the big Juggies raft, as indicated in a despatch some days ago, is a suit for \$44,000, brought by Mr. O'Leary, the owner, against

the steamer which let the raft slip. He claims that the captain of the steamer was ordered to tow the raft to Eastport, Me., in the first place, but disobeyed this order and put to sea.

As noticed in our last, Messrs. J. A. Walker & Son, marble dealers, have arrived with a quantity of stock to commence the business in our midst.

The ramor is in circulation throughout Quebec that a decision was come to by the Ottawa government, Friday, in favor of Quebec as the terminus of the ocean mail service.

It is stated that in Ric Jansen the punishment for drunkenness is a tin mask placed over the face and fastened behind with a lock.

Prof. Virchow has examined a fragment taken from the centre of the trouble in the crown prince's throat, and declares it shows no evidence of cancer.

The tenancy on the estate of the Countess of Kingston have expressed themselves satisfied with the terms offered by the landlord, who agrees to allow 20 per cent. reduction in rents, to pay all costs and reimburse the tenants who have been evicted.

A sharp shock of earthquake has been felt in Scotland. It caused no damage.

A monument is about to be erected to the memory of the late Earl in the Grand Court of the Kremlin at Moscow, which is to cost \$650,000.

The enormous amount of 67 tons of diamonds is said to have been extracted from four South African mines during the last few years. They were valued at \$200,000,000. The other great diamond field of the world, India, is also a British possession.

Five fashionably dressed men were arrested in Marylebone court charged with attempting to obtain £30,000 from the bank of England on forged or stolen bonds of the Hamilton and Northwestern railroad of Canada.

An earthquake was felt with severity in Scotland at places on the line stretching from Fort William in the west to Nairn in the east. The shock was also felt in other parts of the highlands.

The British army now consists of 217,000 officers and men. There were 2,500 men added in the last year. The army guards somewhat more than 2,000,000 of square miles of territory.

Princess Louise and Lord Louis are staying in Naples, where they live in a simple, unostentatious fashion, flying at the public table and other vice-prescribing

Lewiston bankers have declined to receive Canadian money, following the example of their Bangor brethren.

The Canadian citizens in Brunswick, Me., are at work trying to start a shoe factory on the co-operative system.

It is now claimed that the victims of the blizzards in the United States number fully 1,000 persons. Dakota and Minnesota are safe places to stay away from.

James Gordon Bennett's income from the Herald is still a princely one, amounting to half a million dollars a year.
