

BAPTISM-INCIDENTS OF THE TRAGEDY. A terrible accident, involving a fearful loss of life, occurred here yesterday afternoon. The rite of baptism was being administered to a number of recent converts to one of the Baptist churches here at a point in Rock River just below the trestle iron bridge, and about two hundred persons, including many ladies and a number of children, had gathered on the bridge to witness the ceremony. Suddenly, without warning, the bridge gave way and precipitated its living neight into the stream below. The scene which followed was indescribably terrible, as the struggling victims value under which followed was indescribably terrible, as the struggling victims valuly endeavored to free themselves from the ruins of the bridge and from each other. Large crowds of people on the banks rushed wildly to and fro, many of them so destracted with terror as to be unable to render any assistance—others were sail.

wildly to and fro, many of them so destracted with terror as to be unable to render any assistance—others were self-possessed and speedily brought ropes, planks and boats, and went nobly to work to rescue the living and recover the dead. Some of these were on the bridge when it fell—were so near the edge that they were able to reach land without assistance; while others were fortunately in reach of those on shore, but up to 6 p. m. thirty-two dead bodies had been taken from the river, and it is almost certain that there are others still under the wreck of the bridge. Of those saved 24 were more or less injured.

LATER.—No other bodies of the victims of the bridge disaster were recovered up to the present hour, but several bodies were pickedup at Sterling, 6 miles below, and doubtless the swift current has brought others down the stream. The general estimate of the lost is from 90 to 100 souls. Five bodies floated past the men at work at the wreck and the bodies have not been found. It is supposed that at least 50 bodies are still in the water. Most of them are supposed under the wreck of the bridge. The bridge was of iron, trestle patterns, of 5 spans, elevated about 25 feet deep. Only the two end spans fell. The three middle spans wreck of the bridge. The three middle spans are standing, but in such a condition that it is thought they will fall when the wrecked spans are removed. Workmen are busy to-night putting up a derrick in order to clear the wreck, and making arrangements to secure the bodies beneath it. It is now stated that there were 300 persons on the bridge at the time of the accident, and a greater number escaped than at first supposed. When the bridge gave way most of the people gathered at either end. A large number were near the centre, and some of the latter remained where they were after the crash and were taken off in boats. Several persons jumped from their precarious places and were drawn ashore. Two horses attached to a buggy on the middle span when the crash came and remain there still as there is no way of getting them off.




