PARLIAMENT OF CANADA

Special Telegram to the Tribune. Pacific Railway Inquiry—The Navigation of the Columbia River.

OTTAWA, May 6. The Pacific Railway Committee yesterday asked power to adjourn to July 2nd, to keep their proceedings secret until reported to the House, and to sit in such places as were found expedient.

Mr. Blake moved an address to the Queen praying that Canada should be asked to consent to a foreign power of Canadian rights be made in name, and that her Majesty should be taken for procuring the right to navigate the Columbia river.

General quite recently, but has been a Major General since the 12th of January, 1868. He bears the reputation of being a strict disciplinarian.
