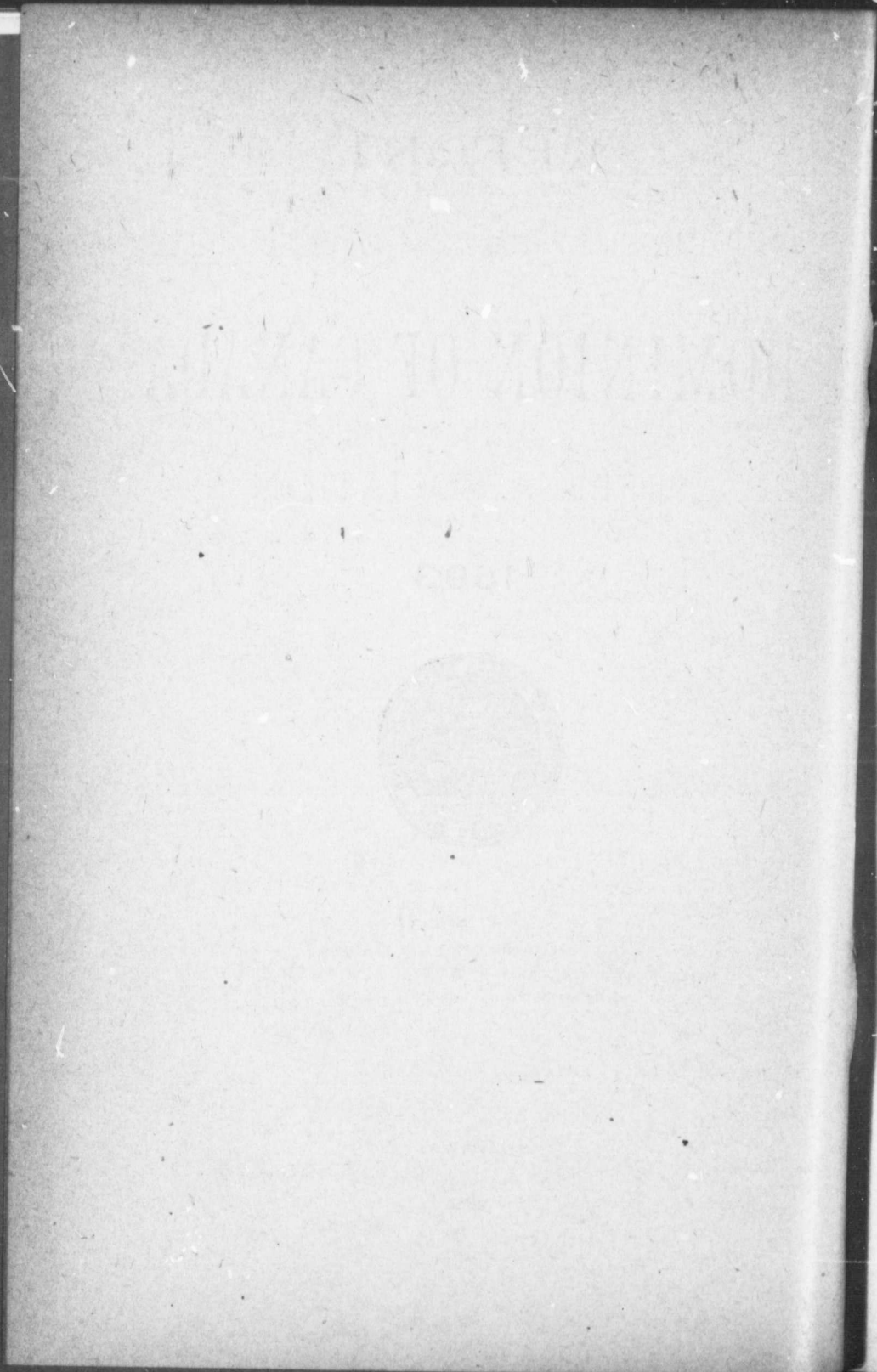

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

1893.

The Council have the honour to submit the twenty-sixth annual report of the proceedings of the Association.

For the first time in many years the prize competitions commencing on Monday, 28th August were very seriously retarded by the inclement weather; so much so that it exercised the ingenuity of the Executive to carry the matches through within anything like the time indicated in the programme, and one match, a new one, for "Activity and Precision," the prizes for which consisted of three fine engravings (military subjects), generously offered by Lt.-Col. Hood, late commanding the Royal Scots, now of the first or Prince of Wales' regiment of rifles, had reluctantly to be abandoned. This, with reducing the number of rounds in the "Henshaw" match at 600 yards from 15 to 10, and firing the "Dominion" and "Walker" matches concurrently, enabled the Executive to carry through the programme by Friday evening instead of at noon, notwithstanding that a day and a-half had been lost by almost incessant rain.

Although the watery element was very much against the interests of the Association and the comfort of the competitors, the social element went very far to compensate the latter for their discomfiture, thanks to the hospitality of the Major-General commanding the Militia and the Hon. Mrs. Herbert; Lt.-Col. J. M. Gibson (the President); Lt.-Col. Toller, and the officers of the Governor General's Foot Guards; and Lt.-Col. Burland and the officers of the 6th Fusiliers, all of whose entertainments were largely attended and thoroughly enjoyed.

Her Majesty's regular forces were again represented at the Annual Matches of the Association ; the Army by detachments from the Royal Engineers and the King's (Liverpool) Regiment, the Navy by a detachment from H.M.S. "Blake," and amongst all were some very excellent shots.

The Martini-Henry was for the first time the only rifle used in any of the competitions ; this may to some extent account for the reduction in the number of competitors, which was considerable, although the Council had hoped that the changes made in the prize list would have attracted a larger attendance. However, the quality of the shooting of those present was very far ahead of any shooting ever before done on the Rideau Range, as the following comparison of matches will prove :

It must also be stated that the number of prizes in many of these matches was increased, on an average 15 per cent., and this fact should be considered when making a comparison between the shooting of 1892 and 1893.

The other matches cannot be compared, as conditions other than the change of rifles were materially different.

In compliance with a decision arrived at, at a Meeting of the Executive Committee of Council, held 21st July, 1893, Martini-Henry ammunition of both Canadian (1892-3) and English (1885) manufacture, was for sale at the Annual Matches, and the quantity used shows greatly in favour of the home manufacture, being :

and the Council take great pleasure in stating that the first prize in every match was won by competitors using ammunition of Canadian manufacture.

The abolition of the use of the Snider Rifle at the Association matches, gave great satisfaction to the competitors present.

His Excellency Lord Stanley of Preston, Governor General, again honoured the Annual Business Meeting with his presence, for which, and his contribution of \$500 to the Prize List, the Association is much indebted.

To the Hon. J. C. Patterson, M.P., Minister of Militia and Defence the Association is indebted for his contribution of \$100 to the prize fund, and for the free issue of ammunition to the teams competing in the Canadian Rifle League Matches, as well as for the interest he takes in the success of the Association.

The Postmaster General again directed that postal convenience to competitors be provided, which resulted in a well equipped Post Office, with several daily deliveries.

Messrs. S. Davis & Sons presented a handsome Silver Challenge Cup, which was made a team prize in the Dominion of Canada Match and was won by the 43rd Battalion.

The Challenge Cup presented by His Honour Lt.-Col. Hon. Geo. A. Kirkpatrick, P.C., Lt.-Governor of Ontario, on his retirement from the Presidency of the Association, was won by a team from Military District No. Two.

The report of Lt.-Col. Fred. C. Denison, C.M.G., Commandant of the Bisley Team, will be found in its place, and is well worthy of perusal.

The thanks of the Association are again due Lt.-Col. C. S. Roberts, commanding the Cambridge University Volunteer Rifles, for the use of the Rifle Ranges of that Corps, as well as for the many courtesies shown to the Canadian team during its sojourn in Cambridge, previous to its proceeding to Bisley.

The Canada Club, with its usual generosity, again offered a valuable Silver Cup for competition by the Canadian Riflemen, which was presented on its behalf by Sir Charles Tupper, Bart., High Commissioner for Canada.

The Chairman of Council, Lt.-Col. Fred C. Henshaw, and T. C. Brainerd, Esq., of the Hamilton Powder Co., again contributed \$100 each to the prize fund.

The Council desires to record its appreciation of all these contributors to the funds of the Association, and to hope for their continued support in the future.

The duties of the staff for the conduct of the matches were rendered much more arduous than usual owing to the unusual bad weather, heavy rain occurring during a day and a-half, causing so much delay that the Executive officer, Major W. E. Hodgins, and those under him, had to exert their utmost energy to get the matches completed as early as they did; and the Council has to place on record its satisfaction with the manner in which the whole of the Staff performed their duties.

FINANCE.

A Statement of the Finances of the Association, duly audited, is submitted herewith.

Affiliation fees from Rifle Associations amounted to \$635, as against \$722 received last year, a decrease of \$87.

The number of Affiliated Rifle Associations this year is as follows, viz. : Provincial, 8 ; Regimental, County and others, 33 ; a decrease of six Associations, as compared with last year.

The annual subscriptions received for the year amounted to \$218.

The Associate Members' fees received as qualification for competition in matches, amounted to \$320, as against \$331 received in 1892, a decrease of \$11.

The receipts from special donations amounted to \$845, a decrease of \$85 as compared with last year.

Special donations from Banks amounted to \$750, as against \$800 received last year, a decrease of \$50.

The entry fees to matches this year, including sighting shots, blow-off tickets, post entries and fines, amounted to \$3,701.90, as against \$4,504.59 received last year, showing a decrease of \$802.69

The receipts from the sale of ammunition this year amounted to \$834.67, being the actual cost to the Association. The difference in amounts under this head, as compared with previous years, is accounted for by the reduced price charged by the Militia Department, the cost of Martini ammunition having been reduced from \$20 to \$15 per 1,000 rounds for issue to the Militia and Rifle Associations.

Cash prizes and Badges amounted to \$7,065.35, as against \$7,568.34 last year, a decrease of \$502.99.

The expenditure on account of the Bisley Team amounted to \$5,448.21, as against \$5,720.21 in 1892, a decrease of \$272. This difference may be accounted for principally in the saving in cost of passage of the Team to England.

The receipts from all sources for the year amounted to \$17,351.46, which, with the balance of \$53.58 from last year, and a loan of \$587 from the Ontario Bank, shows a total of \$17,992.04 on the credit side of the account.

The expenditure amounted to \$17,984.05, leaving a balance of \$7.99 on the credit side at the end of the year.

The unexpected falling off in the usual sources of revenue during the annual competitions this year is attributed to the severe rain storms that prevailed, delaying the shooting for a full day and a-half. The targets usually set apart for extra series shooting had to be appropriated for the remainder of the week in order to complete the regular matches on the programme. This arrangement seriously affected the revenue from extra series matches. The bad weather had the effect also of adding to the expenses in various respects, which largely contributed to the decrease already mentioned.

In order to be in a position to close the accounts for the year, a small advance had to be obtained from the Association Bankers, to be repaid out of the revenue for 1894.

A detailed account of the expenditure made by Lt.-Col. Denison, commanding the Bisley team for 1893, will be found in the appendix.

REPORT OF
 LIEUT.-COL. F. C. DENISON,
 C. M. G., M. P., ETC.,
 COMMANDING THE
 BISLEY TEAM FOR 1893.

TORONTO, 28TH SEPT., 1893.

To Lt.-Col. the Hon. J. M. Gibson, President Dominion Rifle Association.

SIR,—In accordance with your instructions to me, as Commandant of the Bisley Team for the year 1893, I proceeded to Montreal, arriving there Saturday morning, the 24th June, at 10 a.m. I inspected the team, found all present, except Sergt. Crowe, who had received permission to proceed to England by a different steamer. The members were properly dressed, except in some minor particulars, which were afterwards rectified in England. We embarked on the s.s. "Sarnia" that evening, sailed early Sunday morning, arriving in Liverpool Thursday, 6th July, at 5 a.m. I might say we received every kindness and attention from Capt. Couch and the officers of his ship, but I would not advise sending the team on a slow steamer in future. The team should be dispatched by an earlier vessel or else by a quicker one, the latter would be the most desirable, as it would expose the marksmen to less sea sickness. In consequence of our long passage we only reached Cambridge Thursday afternoon, and we should not have had a practice that day had it not been for the kindness of the Customs House officials who came on board at 6 a.m. in response to a telegram I sent on to them. By this promptness on their part, we were able to catch the first train at 7:40 a.m., and managed to put in half a day's practice. Leaving the team in charge of Major Hartt, I proceeded to London and Bisley, to make arrangements with different contractors and provide for further entries.

The team shot over the Cambridge range on Friday and Saturday, and left for Bisley Monday morning, the 10th July. The London & North Western Railway put on a special for us at Waterloo station, running us through to Brookwood (Bisley) without stopping. In many other ways this Company was most obliging.

The team are under special obligations to Col. Roberts, commanding Cambridge University Rifle Volunteers, who, with his usual kindness, placed the range at Cambridge at our disposal.

The Canadian team, together with the Cape, the Jersey and the Guernsey teams, were inspected by His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, accompanied by Sir Evelyn Wood, V.C., and a large staff. His Royal Highness expressed his pleasure at meeting the team again and his satisfaction at their appearance.

During the first week at Bisley I caused the team to practice daily in extra matches as a preparation for the "Kolapore," and the "eight" were selected after close consideration of the scores made. The match was fired on the morning of the 15th July. Before the match started, I was told by an old "habitué" of Wimbledon, that the best eight in the British Isles were opposed to us. The truth of this statement was afterwards clearly demonstrated, for they made the hitherto unapproachable score of 741. Our own eight put on the highest total (696) ever reached by the Canadian Kolapore team, either at Bisley or Wimbledon, and gained us the Colonial prize of £80 sterling.

We had also formidable competitors in the South African team, who had been practicing, I am informed, for a month, at ranges in the neighborhood, and the teams from Guernsey and Jersey.

All the important individual competitions were shot during the second week, and under weather conditions quite unlike those of the first, frequent rain showers swept over the camp, usually accompanied with strong gusts of wind. In the Queen's, we had two men in the second stage, and one (Lieut. Boville) in the third; he shot extremely well. If some arrangements could be made by which the team could be divided in firing for the "Queen's" prize, so that half could fire at one hour and half at another, it would give us a better

chance. For instance, this year the whole team was firing at one time. They did remarkably well at the 200 and 500 yard ranges, and promised to have 15 or more in the second stage, but next day at 600 yards we happened to fire during a rain and a high gusty wind; the result was that our men necessarily fell off. Our highest man with 64 made only 17, and so with the rest.

In the Corporation of London, which is the Grand Aggregate among the Colonials, Lieut. Mitchell well sustained our credit and won the silver cup. He was followed, I may say, by three of the Cape team, and owing to the good scoring of our fellow Colonial team we had to resign a generous share of the prizes in this match.

The cup presented by the Canadian Club was made the prize for the second Canadian score in the Grand, and so fell to Staff-Sergt. Simpson after shooting off a tie with Lieut. Boville. Another individual success I would mention is that of Private H. G. Heaven, in the M. H. Association Cup match, 200 and 600 yards. He scored within one of the possible, and then by winning the shoot off, secured the cup valued at £25.

The total cash winnings of the team were £368.

In accordance with your instructions, I did not order flooring for the tents, and we certainly did not require it this year, even though we had some heavy rain. The ground at Bisley is composed of sand and gravel, consequently water rapidly disappears, besides the Canadian Camp is excellently situated, being on a high rise, the ground falling away on every side.

The garden party came off very successfully on the second Thursday. Lady Tupper most kindly consented to receive the guests. I was glad to secure at Aldershot the band of the Lincaster Regt. (old Royal Canadian) for the afternoon.

The Canadian Club, with its usual generosity, offered for competition a beautiful silver cup, which was presented by Sir Charles Tupper, Bart., on behalf of the Club, Mr. Gillespie, the Secretary, and other members being also present.

Revolver match same as last, utilize money in individual.

The fine of \$1.00 for firing on wrong target was considered, and it was decided that the fine was to stand.

The question of ammunition being sold at office on the ranges was left to a special committee.

“That Major W. E. Hodgins be chosen Executive Officer for the Annual Prize Meeting of 1893.”—Carried.

The Montreal members desired another meeting to choose range officers and for other details.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00. and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a

Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the name of the winner and details of the matches at which it is won shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions :

Fourteen	[14]	from Ontario,
Ten	[10]	" Quebec,
Six	[6]	" New Brunswick,
Six	[6]	" Nova Scotia,
Four	[4]	" Manitoba,
Four	[4]	" British Columbia,
Four	[4]	" Prince Edward Island,
Two	[2]	" each of the North-West Territories so soon as Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association, as Provincial Associations,

one half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting; the names of those

elected by the Provincial Associations, to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutant's General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association,

14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held in Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council ; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding ; but they or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any members or competitors attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all Members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. Meetings of Council.
 The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such Meeting—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings. Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to inspection of any Member of the Council. The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three Members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting. Finance Committee.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association. Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank.

Expenditure of sum for current expenses.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditure of a general nature.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual accounts

A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November.
