ONE DAY LATER FROM ENGLAND

By yesterday's mail Liverpool and London papers of the 14th and 13th June were received here, having been brought to New York by the packet ship Siddons, they furnish intelligence on day later than was brought by the Liverpool, but it is not of much importance. The subjoined are the only item of interest that we have discovered.

A war between Turkey and Fgypt was on the point of commencing. The Turkish army, 50,000 strong crossed the Euphrates. The combined British and French fleets in the Levant, will amount, after the joining of 30 vessels of war in preparation at Toulon, to 75 sail, under the command of Admiral Stopford. The fleet is to be divided into two-one to tatch the Turkish, and the other the Egyptian naval forces. The Turkish navy is described as very formidable; 10,002 soldiers, acting as marines, were on board of it.

A long and sharp debate ensued, in which Mr. O'Connel took a prominent part and the petition was rejected, 165 to 82.
