So early as the year 1841, I urged in strong terms, upon the attention of the then Government, the justice and utility of establishing a Department of Agriculture, feeling that as I do now, that if any one interest or department was entitled to the consideration and vigilance of Legislature, that one should be the Agricultural.

The Government has now established a Department of Agriculture the management of which, together with several other duties connected with emigration, and the statistics of the Province, are entrusted to the Chairman of Committees or President of the Council.

And although I still feel that a gentleman of superior literary attainments would more properly discharge the duties of Chairman of Committees, yet as His Excellency and his Advisers have been pleased to consider me competent to the several duties now attached to the office, I have accepted it.
