### Town and County News

**THE BRENNANS.**—This company gave their first entertainment last evening. The scenery of Ireland was very good, while the singing and acting by the members of the comedy company was above the ordinary ability. They appear again this evening, when we bespeak for them a crowded house.

**S. of T.**—The entertainment given in the rooms of the Sons of Temperance last evening was a great success, although the audience was not very large. The best feature was the singing by the choir which was really excellent. The readings were well received and the addresses by Rev. Messrs Howie and Davidson elicited applause. **BLASTING ACCIDENT.**—The *Ampton Times* says: A bad accident happened to Mr. John H. Caslor, of Boston, Caledon, on Thursday last week. Mr. Caslor was blasting some rock, and in plunging in some powder with a stone, it is supposed that in driving in the plug, one stone struck another, and struck fire and set the powder off before the fuse had been put to it, causing one of Mr. Caslor's hands and arms to be very badly burned. His eyes were also badly singed.

**EXTENSION TO GAS WORKS.**—At a meeting of the Directors of the Gas Company last night, the tenders from various parties for the construction of the addition to the works were opened. The contract for supplying iron piping was awarded Messrs. James Stewart & Co. of Hamilton; the construction of the gasometer and other attendant apparatus to an American firm; the excavations and erection of the tank to Mr. Thos. Dobbie. The whole is expected to be fully completed by the middle of October. Mr. Yule left this afternoon for the other side to complete arrangements.

**BRITISH M. E. CHURCH.**—On Thursday evening the Conference Missionary meeting was held in the Rebecca street Church, Hamilton, at 8 o'clock. Rev. Willis Nazary in the chair. The church was filled to its utmost capacity by a large and intelligent audience. Several ministers from the Wesleyan Methodist Conference occupied seats on the platform. Much enthusiasm prevailed and eloquent speeches were delivered by members of both Conferences. Conference re-assembled at 9 o'clock on Friday morning and adjourned at 12 o'clock.

### POLICE COURT.

David King was charged by Chief Constable Kelly with disorderly conduct in the Grand Trunk Hotel on Thursday. Fined \$1 and costs.

Considerable fun was caused on Monday evening last by a drove of pigs, which the driver, Mr. Wilkinson, of Guelph, was trying to weigh on the market scales. The pigs kept breaking away and one ran and jumped over the falls, down into the bed of the Grand River, a distance of about forty feet, without receiving any injury, apparently.—*Elora Express.*

Mr. Wm. Randall, working for Mr. Shiger, West Garafraza, met with a serious accident while cutting timber for a barn one day last week. He received a deep cut in the leg near the instep.

An accident of rather a remarkable nature took place on Monday, June 1st, by which a two year old colt, the property of Mr. Alfred Tanner, of the 4th Con., Maryborough, lost its life. Some children had put up a swing in the woods, and leaving it, the colt by some means became entangled in the rope and hung itself.

Thomas Sturtridge, of Trahill Farm, near Callington, Cornwall, England, and brother to Mr. Wm. Sturtridge, of Peel township, has three ewes which had 12 lambs this spring—one having 5, one 4, and the other 3.

Mr. Robt. Grant, of Elora, met with a serious accident on Monday last, at the planing mill of Messrs. Gibb & Gerrie, four of his fingers being badly cut by a circular saw.

The census of Teeswater has been taken, and shows a population of 805. A petition, asking for village incorporation, was drawn up and signed by over 100 householders and freeholders, has been forwarded to the County Council.

The Tiverton people have taken the balance left over from the 25th celebration and applied it to the purchase of fire ladders and other apparatus.

A gentleman just returned from Lake Superior, expresses the conviction that Nepigon Harbor will never do for the terminus of the Pacific Railway. On the 17th of May it was blocked with ice for thirty miles out to the lake. Thunder Bay was perfectly clear on the 10th.

Lord Dufferin, family and suite, have left Ottawa to take up their residence for a season at Quebec.

### Mysterious Death.

As we go to press a rather mysterious circumstance is being investigated by Dr. Keating, at Merilhan's Hotel.

It appears that the wife of Francis Parker, a farmer living in Puslinch, sent to Dr. Reilly, of Hamilton, a few weeks ago, for a woman to do the work at the house in the room of her daughter, who left home. Mrs. Catherine Kennedy, a young widow, came in response, bringing a child about two months old, it having been born on the 14th of April last. The child appeared to be quite healthy until last Wednesday, when it took suddenly ill, and according to the statement of the mother died about midnight. The mother had gone out in the evening to milk the cows and left the child on the bed. Mrs. Parker, hearing its cry, took the child out of bed and put it in the cradle with her own child, leaving her daughter to watch it; and when Mrs. Kennedy returned her child was in convulsions, and giving every symptom that it was dying. The mother avers that she said to Mrs. Parker's daughter "You have done something to the child," and that the girl left the room and slammed the door, but this statement is denied by Mrs. Parker. Dr. Herod's evidence went to show that the child had received an injury, and that there were no traces of foul play.

### Narrow Escape of Three Persons from being Poisoned.

On Friday afternoon, Mrs. Ducentberry, of Aeton, stepped into Mr. C. Mander's Drug Store to obtain some tartaric acid, to use as a drink with baking soda. Mr. Mander being in, she obtained the tartaric acid from him as she thought and took it home and put about a teaspoonful of the drug or acid in a tumbler with a teaspoonful of baking soda, and in a few minutes she felt herself getting sick at the stomach with inclination to vomit. Mr. Ducentberry came in and found her in a bad state and immediately gave her some hot water to make her vomit. Then he ran and called Doctor Carter, who was on the spot in a few minutes, as he had been to be at home, and when he saw Mrs. Ducentberry he knew she had been taking poison, so he Dr. wished to see the mixture or acid.
