





Is it Necessary ?- If so What Should be Done to tant date. Improve the System.

The joint committee of the board of works, and the committee on markets and bealth met yesterday to discuss the advisability of reorganization. There were present Ald. Clarke, in the chair, and Ald. Booth, Carlyle, Geo. Evans, Taylor and Turner.

Aldr Clarke suggested as the first thing that the resolutions referring to reorganization should be read, and their movers heard in their support. As Ald. Boswell, who moved the first two, was not present, the third one, moved by Ald. Geo. Evans was read, advising the sale of horses and other ents of the department, as he thought it to be in the interest of the city to have the various works done by contract. Ald. Evens spoke in favor of the resolution, because he thought the work could be done cheaper as the employees of the depart were not careful of expenditure, as they had not to pay for the cost of things. Ald. Boswell having arrived in the meantime,

his resolutions were read, and he spoke in support of them. He thought the work should be let by contract at so much per should be let by contract at so much per noile for streat cleaning and repairing, and scarwanger work.
