A Valuable Curiosity. Conductor Clark, of the Dominion Atlantic railway, says the *Hants Journal*, is in possession of a genuine curiosity—a deed of a slave girl, dated at Annapolis Oct. 6, 1804. The document, a copy of which we give below, was found several years ago in a safe in the cellar of the late Sheriff Bonnett's house at Annapolis. Some of the children of the slave girl are still living in Annapolis county. Mr. Robertson, of the island revenue department, Halifax, is a grandson of the William Robertson named in the indenture. The document is greatly prized by the owner, who has been offered a high price for it.

This indenture, made the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and four, between Jane Dickson, William Prince and Isaac Bonnett, of Annapolis, county of Annapolis and province of Nova Scotia, administratrix and administrators of the goods and chattels, rights and credits which were and are of the late Robert Dickson, deceased, of the one part, and William Robertson, of the same place, merchant, of the other part;
