STANDING RULES
FOR THE
CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT
OF THE
Newfoundland Church Society.

I.—This Society shall be called "THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

II.—The Officers of this Society shall consist of a Patron, a President, and Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and a Secretary, or Secretaries, with a Committee of Management of Sixteen Members, of whom the four senior shall retire every year. Five Members shall constitute a quorum. No person shall be re-elected to serve on the Committee until the expiration of a year from the date of his retirement.

III.—His Excellency the Governor for the time being shall be requested to accept the office of Patron; the Lord Bishop shall be the President; the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; and all the Officers of the Society, with the Clergy of the Church resident in St. John's, *ex-officio* members of the Committee;—the rest of the Clergy of the Church throughout the Colony honorary members of the same.

IV.—All persons paying the annual sum of Ten Shillings currency shall be members of this Society, with power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

V.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the funds to the furtherance of the Gospel in this Island, under the recommendation and sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese;—the objects to which such appropriation shall be made being the following: 1st, the maintenance of the Clergy; 2d, the erection or enlargement of Churches, Parsonages, and School-rooms; 3d, the supply of Bibles, Prayer Books, School Books, and Religious Works and Tracts.

VI.—The Committee shall meet on the first Monday in every month.

VII.—The Committee shall appoint each year three of their members to audit the Treasurer's accounts.

VIII.—A Monthly Meeting of the Society shall be held on the second Wednesday in every month, at 7 o'clock; and a General Annual Meeting on the second Wednesday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint.

IX.—No existing law shall be repealed or altered, nor any new Rule established except at a general meeting—the proposed change having been first recommended by the Committee, and approved by the President.

X.—All Meetings shall be opened and closed with the Prayers recommended to be used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts.

XI.—The members of the Church in every part of the Island shall be invited to co-operate, by forming Local Committees, under the direction of the Clergy, in each Mission or Parish.

XII.—The Treasurers of the Local Committees shall transmit to the General Treasurer in St. John's the amount of the Collections made in their respective Districts.

Moved by the Hon J. CROWDY, and seconded by the Ven. the Archdeacon :—

That the Report, just read, be received, adopted, and printed with the Treasurer's Account, under the direction of the Secretary.

Moved by J. TUNBRIDGE, Esq., and seconded by P. G. TESSIER, Esq. :—

That this Meeting acknowledges with devout thankfulness the blessing which it has pleased Almighty God to vouchsafe to the Newfoundland Church Society since its last Anniversary Meeting.

Moved by the Hon. the Attorney General, and seconded by B. ROBINSON, Esq., Q.C. :—

That this Society rejoices with and congratulates the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts upon the success which has attended the celebration of its third Jubilee; and pledges itself to increased efforts in co-operation with that Venerable Institution for the extension of the Gospel in Newfoundland.

Moved by the Rev. H. TUCKWELL, and seconded by W. H. ELLIS, Esq. :—

That this meeting would record its undiminished interest in the proceedings and welfare of the kindred Societies in the North American Dioceses, and other British Colonies.

That this Meeting acknowledges with thankfulness the improvements which have been effected in the Act for the encouragement of Education in this Colony, and would express an earnest hope that in any future Act bearing upon this important and sacred subject, full justice may be done to the Church of England.

R E P O R T.

IF the duty of your Committee, in reporting at this eleventh Anniversary on the condition and prospects of the NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY, be in some respects less difficult than usual, (in consequence of the short period that has elapsed since the last annual meeting) it should be remembered that their materials are proportionably scanty. They trust, however, that their present Report will not be found altogether devoid of interest.

The Committee would first congratulate the Society on having been enabled to celebrate their Anniversary at this earlier season of the year. The advantages of this arrangement, which were briefly alluded to at the last General Meeting, are chiefly these:—The Report of last year's proceedings being not only in print, but in circulation among the members of the Society, before another collection shall have been commenced; (1) all subscribers will, as it is proper they should, be able to see the result of the collection made during the last year, both in their own particular locality and in the Island generally; and (2) to inform themselves in what manner the funds have been appropriated and disposed. This will, it is hoped, be an encouragement to the contributors, as it must be more satisfactory to the Clergy themselves, on whom the duty of the collecting chiefly rests.

The Committee regret, however, to say that from several Missions (viz., Harbour-Grace, Island Cove, Port-de-Grave, Trinity, Lamaline, and La Poile) returns for the last year have not yet been received.

Whatever may be the cause or causes of this delay, no blame can be attached to your Committee, for the attention of the Clergy has been particularly called to that part of the last Report urging the importance of forwarding their returns as quickly as practicable, by a note from the Secretary (some months ago), and a copy of a resolution of the Committee, to the same effect, has since been circulated.

The Committee would express a hope that from henceforth it will be remembered that the Annual Meeting will, please GOD, be held at this season of the year. They would also reiterate the opinion (expressed in the last Report), and respectfully draw the attention of the Clergy particularly to it:—viz., that “it should be practicable to forward their lists of names, with the amounts received, from the nearer Missions at the end of the year, and from those more remote early in the spring.” The Committee cannot quit this subject without remarking that while some of the returns first received were from the most distant Missions, those still wanting belong, with one or two exceptions only, to the Missions, between which and St. John’s communication is most regular and frequent. The lists ought to be sent to the Secretary, and all remittances to the Treasurer.

Before the period comes round for holding our next Anniversary the Committee trust that all the Clergy, understanding the purpose and benefit of holding the annual meeting at this season, will have sent in both their lists and returns.

In the minutes of the conference of five of the Bishops of the British North American Provinces at Quebec, in the month of September last, which by the kindness of our Diocesan have been printed and circulated in this Diocese, the Committee observe among many important subjects the following remarks on the maintenance of the Clergy, which they would recommend to the most serious consideration of the members of this Society:—

“We desire to record our conviction that the ordinances of the Church will never be rightly valued, nor its strength fully

developed, until the people, for whom the Clergy minister in-
 truly things, furnish a more adequate support to the institutions
 and to the Clergy of the Church.

"Further, as the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel,
 in consequence of numerous and increasing claims in all parts
 of the world, is compelled gradually to withdraw its aid from
 the older missions, we desire to impress on our flocks the duty
 of fulfilling their obligations in respect of the payment of their
 Minister; and with a view to this object we recommend that
 the Churchwardens, in every parish or mission, should furnish
 every year to the Bishop a written return, duly certified by
 themselves and by the Clergyman, of the sums paid towards his
 support for the current year."

These remarks, so germane to one chief and sacred
 object of this Society, will come, it is hoped, home with
 greater weight to the hearts and consciences of all mem-
 bers of this Society, as exhibiting the unanimous opinion,
 and a recommendation grounded upon that opinion, of
 the persons, to say the least, most competent to judge
 and advise.

The Treasurer's account will shew the present state of
 the funds. As usual, were the Committee to enter into
 detail they would have to speak of diminished payments
 in some missions, while in others it would be their plea-
 sing duty to shew the progress of the Society, as regards
 the sums collected. On the whole, notwithstanding the
 unprofitable results of the fishery in many places last
 summer, they see at present no cause to anticipate that
 the Society's income for the year 1851 will be less than
 those of former years.

The Committee cannot but regard this circumstance
 as a token of the Divine blessing and favour, and they
 thankfully call upon all the members of the Society to
 confess and adore His great goodness, Who has enabled
 them, amid much difficulty and many depressing causes,
 steadily to "go forward;" and being fully conscious
 that without GOD's continual help this Society, which
 is calculated to be, and has been so important an instru-
 ment in advancing the cause of His Church in this Dio-
 cese, cannot prosper, they would invite all to pray that
 His blessing and favour may not be withdrawn.

Since the last annual meeting the sum of £753 0s. 6d. has been voted by the Committee to the objects of the Society, under the Bishop's recommendation. Of this sum £619 10s. were appropriated towards the stipends of the Clergy, and voted as usual in the spring of the year:—a further amount of £114 6s. 6d. to the erection or repair of Churches and Parsonage-houses, and the remaining sum of £20 4s. for printing and other incidental expenses, of which a full detail will appear in the Treasurer's account. As the sum mentioned for Churches and Parsonages may appear small, it may be proper to state that in Bay Roberts, Catalina, Herring Neck, Burin, and Lamaline the whole collection has been specially made for and spent on these objects. And in Bay-de-Verde, Greenspond, and Trinity, besides the amounts paid into the Treasurer's hands for the general purposes of the Society, special collections have been made for Churches or Parsonage-houses. Thus the whole sum expended for these objects is much larger than would appear from this Report.

The Committee would here venture to remark that, although the lists of contributors to special local objects have hitherto been printed with their Report, (such contributions being virtually raised in aid of the Church) it would be much better if all collections were made expressly and by name for the Society. There would be no objection to an understanding, in any particular case, that the collection should be regarded as special, and be returned immediately in full. But the Committee think it very desirable that the Report of the Church Society should embrace the whole income derived from its members for all Church purposes. To carry this plan out thoroughly it would be necessary that the amounts collected should invariably be remitted to the Treasurer, and the Committee commend this to the consideration of the Clergy, with the less hesitation, as they have reason to think that, directly or indirectly, the money does for the most part come to St. John's.

This plan and this plan only will remedy an evil complained of in the Report of Trinity branch of this Society,

read at their public meeting in February last, as follows:—

“The sums collected, it is here necessary to observe, have not been accounted for in the printed Reports after the usual manner of setting forth receipts and payments of monies.”

—This observation refers to the discrepancy between the amount shewn by the list of subscribers at Trinity and that paid into the Treasurer's hands in St. John's.

The Committee would again thank those gentlemen who have taken part in Branch Meetings, and they would renew their earnest recommendations to the Clergy to establish local Committees and hold meetings in their principal settlements, as a means of both interesting their flocks and friends in the cause of the Society, and of better informing them generally of its proceedings and objects.

The Depository of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge at Mr. M'COUBREY'S continues to prosper. The Committee reserve their account of books sold till another meeting, as so short a time has elapsed since their last detailed Report. The Committee would more particularly call the attention of members of the Church in out-harbours to this Depository as the best medium thro' which they may supply themselves on the most reasonable terms, not only with Bibles, Testaments, and Prayer Books, but likewise with Tracts and other Religious and Useful Books.

The Committee desire to congratulate the Bishop and the members generally of the Church, on the promotion of three Deacons, on Trinity Sunday, to the Holy Order of the Priesthood. They trust that Grace from above will be given them proportionable to their increased responsibilities. It would have been an occasion of much additional gratification and thankfulness if the Committee could have reported an increase in the number of the Clergy. The Society should be reminded continually that there are yet very many settlements in this Diocese receiving only an occasional visit from the Missionary. The Committee entreat all members of the Church in

this Diocese earnestly to pray the Lord of the harvest that He would send forth labourers into His harvest.

The Committee, while acknowledging with thankfulness the improvements which have been effected in the Act for the encouragement of education in this colony, cannot refrain from animadverting upon the injury done to the Church by the continued refusal of the Legislature to sub-divide the educational grant. They painfully feel that the Church of England in this colony is by this refusal kept in an invidious and disadvantageous position, as compared with the Church of Rome; and that the children of our poorer brethren are prevented receiving proper religious instruction in the elementary Schools: and they would earnestly recommend all the members of the Society to use their endeavours, by petitions to the Legislature and by all lawful and honourable ways, to obtain the like concession to the Church of England which has been made to the Roman Catholic Church, "that the education of their poorer brethren in the Schools may be placed under the direction of the Clergy and other members of their own Church only."

In the Act lately passed the principle of sub-division appears to be granted with certain limitations as respects the Schools in the electoral districts of St. John's and Conception Bay: and for this, as an instalment, the Committee desire to be thankful, receiving it as an earnest of a more liberal adjustment of the Education question throughout the colony. They know of no just and valid objection to the extension of this privilege, and are persuaded that it may be extended not only without engendering any angry or unkind feelings, but with advantage and satisfaction to all. The Committee feel it a duty as well as a pleasure to record their grateful sense of the generous and faithful exertions of those gentlemen both in Her Majesty's Council and in the House of Assembly, who have advocated the claims of the Church of England, to which exertions we are indebted for this measure of success. In connection with this important topic, the Committee beg to invite particular attention to the following extract from the Minutes of the late

conference of North American Bishops, as setting forth their Lordship's deliberate and unanimous opinion on the just claims of the Church of England in the Colonies, and the duty of her members:—

Whereas systems of Education are very generally introduced and supported in these Colonies, either (1) excluding religious instruction altogether from the Schools, or (2) recognising no distinction except between Roman Catholics and Protestants, whereby no opportunity is afforded us of bringing up the children of our Communion in the special doctrines and duties of our faith, to the manifest depravation of their religious principles, and with crying injustice to the Church of England, we desire to express our decided conviction.

(1.) That all Education for the Members of our Church should be distinctly based on the revealed religion of the Old and New Testaments, with special reference to their duties and privileges, as by baptism regenerate and made God's children by adoption and grace.

(2) That all lawful and honourable methods should be adopted to move the Colonial Legislatures to make grants to the Church of England, as well as to the Roman Catholics, and other religious bodies, as they require it, and according to their numbers respectively, for the education of the members of their own Communion.

There is one more subject of especial interest to the Church in this, and indeed in every colony of the British Empire, which the Committee advert to with joy and thankfulness:—the good success which GOD has vouchsafed to the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in the celebration of its third Jubilee. The Committee rejoice to state that on the 16th of April last the Jubilee Fund had reached the noble sum of £43,000, and as there were then two months before the Jubilee year would close, it was confidently hoped the special collection would amount in the end to £50,000. Votes have already been made from the Jubilee Fund:—

(1) For the extension of the Episcopate abroad, £13,000; (2) For the education of Missionaries £8,500; (3) The sum of £2,000 has been applied to the spiritual aid of emigrants. And, lastly, a large sum is set apart

for Missionary purposes in the East Indies, and for the West Indian Mission to South Africa.

It is very satisfactory to observe that notwithstanding the large amount contributed to the Jubilee Fund there is no diminution of the ordinary income of the Society. The Jubilee has been celebrated in all the Colonial Dioceses of the Church of England, as well as in every Diocese of the Mother country. The most lively interest in the welfare of the Society has also been manifested by the Bishops and Clergy of the Scottish Episcopal Church, and of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America. The Archbishop of Canterbury's letter to the Bishops of both these branches of our Communion, and the very interesting letters of the Scotch Bishops assembled in Synod at Edinburgh, and of twenty American Bishops, in reply, are printed in the last Reports of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts.

The Committee earnestly hope that this manifestation, on the part of the Church in the United States, of interest in the welfare of our Venerable Society, although that Church is no longer assisted by the Society's bountiful liberality, and is only mindful of by-gone favours and benefits, will provoke all members of the Church in this colony to a godly jealousy, even to feel, and speak, and do likewise. The favours and benefits which the Church of the United States remembers and recounts as matters of history with so much gratitude, are still bestowed upon us in full measure by the Venerable Society. May the time arrive when, through the agency of our own Church Society, we may stand in the same happy and honourable condition not only self-supported, but contributing also to the spread of Gospel truth in Heathen lands, or in other dependencies of the British Crown.

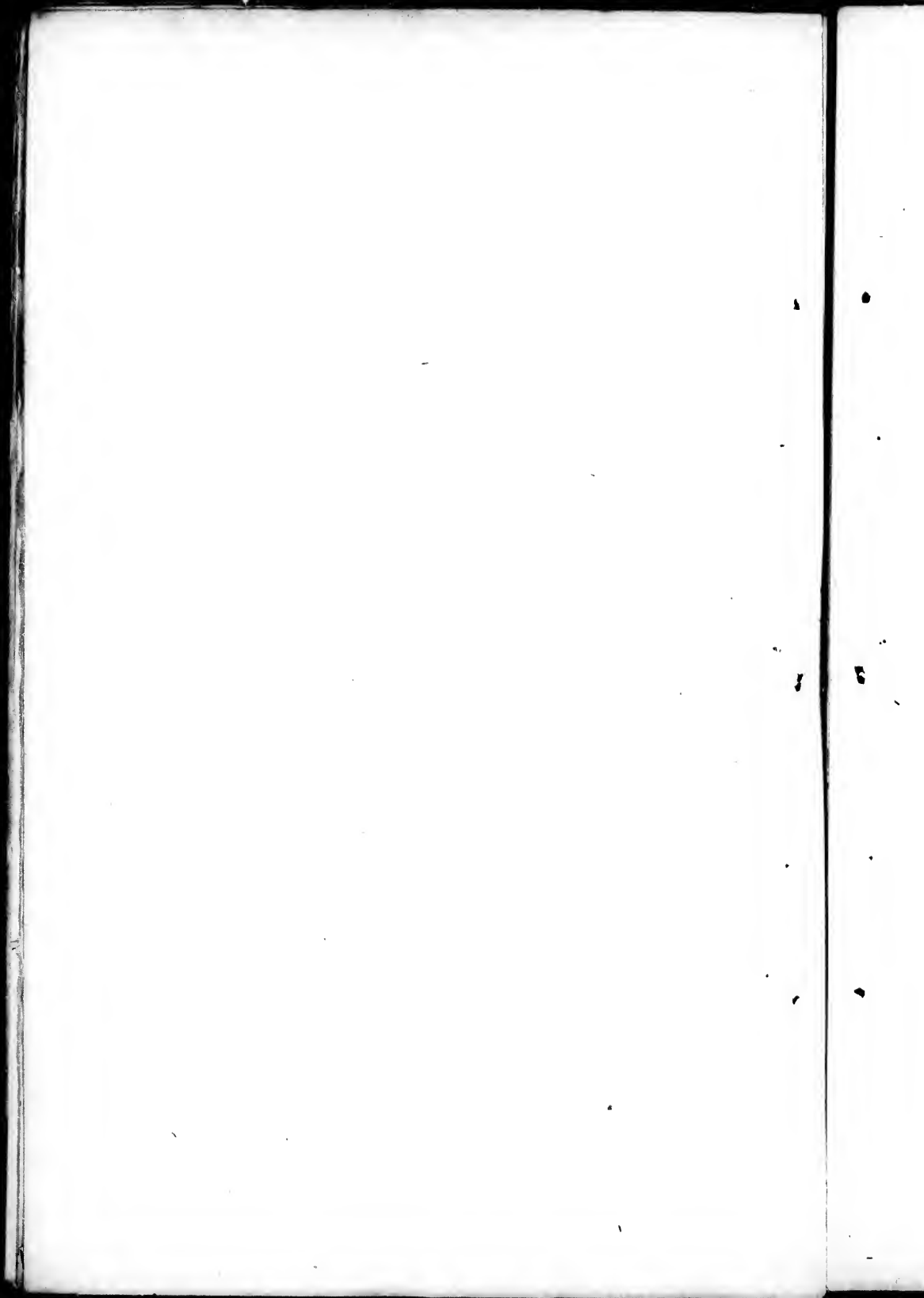
