Origin of the Sugar Plum and Other Sweetmeats. It is believed that of all candies the "sugar plum" is the most ancient. It was the invention of one Julius Dragatus who according to the International Confectioner, was of the family of Dragat and was noted for his skill as a baker and confectioner. Dragatus put forth the first specimen of the sugar plum in the year 117 B.C. The bonbons of this variety were called dragat, after their inventor (dragées in French), and their manufacture constituted a monopoly enjoyed exclusively by the Fabian family. Whenever there was a birth or a marriage in that family a great distribution of dragat took place as an evidence of rejoicing. This custom is still retained by certain of the noble families of Europe.

LOOKING TO SIR JAMES WHITNEY. The appointment of Chairman Leitch to the bench gives Sir James Whitney the opportunity of increasing the strength of the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board, and in increasing the confidence of the people.

When the Whitney government brought down its bill revising the Ontario Railway Act and creating a board to deal with municipalities and public service corporations, there was a rush to Ottawa for Dominion charters by scores of public service corporations.

The fight this deputation is putting up is Ontario's fight and the spokesman for Ontario should be Sir James Whitney. Sir James and this province should know and act upon the fact that there has been a change of government at Ottawa.

Should not all corporations, even those created by the Dominion and carrying on interprovincial business, be subject to provincial law as respects all business begun and ended within the province?

Every corporation in Ontario, no matter by what government created, should be subject to the exclusive control of the province so far as all traffic and business done by such corporations within the province is concerned.

DOCTOR ON PROFESSOR. Fantastic to many will appear the suggestion by Rev. J. A. Macdonald in The Globe to the effect that Woodrow Wilson may, after all, be the greatest Progressive instead of Col. Roosevelt.

OTTAWA, Nov. 1.—(Special.)—A change of government in the Dominion Liberal party is confidently predicted by The Gait Reporter (Conservative) tonight in an editorial. The Reporter sees in Mr. Rowell an able man of high character, but grievous disappointment as a party leader, and declares that the light of the party favor now encircles the head of Hon. INTRINSIC LIGHT OF STARS.

A scientist in the observatory of Paris has made some interesting calculations of the intrinsic light of a number of stars, based on the results he had previously attained in regard to their effective temperatures. The brightness of a star, as seen from the earth, does not depend wholly upon its size and distance. Thus he finds that Sirius and Vega emit light the brightness of which is 6,000,000 candle power per square centimetre, while at the other end of the scale the light of Aldebaran amounts to only 22,000 candle power per square centimetre. The intrinsic brightness of Vega is actually less than in half a dozen American states, and barely half of the number in use in New York State alone.

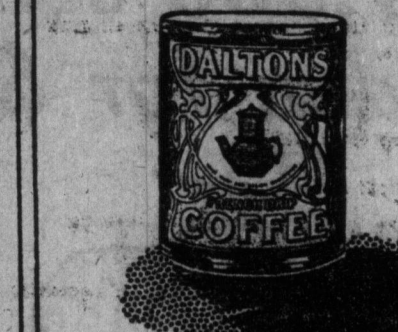

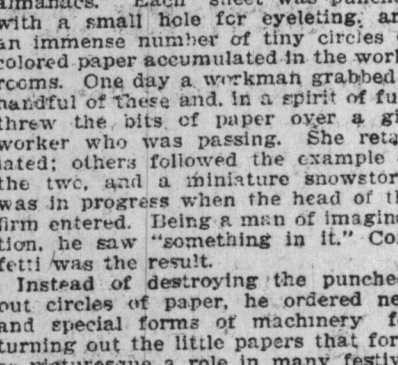

Series of Strong Facts Presented in the Form of a Memorandum—Request Made That No Licenses Be Issued to Women, and That There Should Be Not More Than One License For Every 1000 Men of Age.

(Special Correspondence.) MONTREAL, Nov. 1.—The license commission appointed by the Government of the Province of Quebec to make an investigation of the liquor question, met here today.

The memorandum came openly and frankly from the brewing industry of the Province of Quebec. When it is considered that the charge can be made that the brewers are simply pleading for their own interest—a charge which no doubt is fully substantiated—the opponents of prohibition must have a strong case if the brewers are thus willing to put their case on a memorandum and let their case be considered purely on the merits of the facts submitted.

After a petition was read from the French Chamber of Commerce favoring special licenses for beer and light wines, and after L. T. Marchand, Esq., had presented the case for the Montreal hotel proprietors, Father Ladlesieus in presenting the views of the clergy, none of the speakers of which the way demanded outright prohibition.

Not All the Evils. Bishop Farthing of the Anglican church started out by admitting that drink did not cause all of the evils aimed for. Bad housing and other evils of the system, he said, undoubtedly drove men to drink.

None for Women. Madame Deque, president of the Federation of St. John Baptist Association, urged that no licenses be granted to women, and that there should be not more than one license for every 1000 men of age.
