PROPRIETORS CAN WORK AT THE PRINTING TRADE

Motion to Rule Them Out of Union Defeated—Convention in Toronto Next Year.

St. Louis, Aug. 11.—After a heated discussion the convention of the International Typographical Union today rejected a proposition that subordinate unions shall not allow proprietors to work at the trade and prohibiting union members from assisting in any work being performed by proprietors.
