

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NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

The Council beg to submit the following as their report for the year just ending.

1. The Annual Matches were marked by an unaccountable falling off in the number of competitors, and this, notwithstanding that the Prize List and conditions of the shooting were similar in all respects to those of last year, when the attendance was so satisfactory. The Council have given their best consideration to the matter and are convinced that the feult, if any there be, does not lie with the Association.

The programme, as at present framed, has met only with the approbation of the competitors, as it has attractions for both old and new shots.

The County Associations do not seem to succeed any better than the Provincial in developing new marksmen. Like the Provincial Rifle Association, they only hold one match in the course of the season, and so they fail to get at those, who by personal encouragement would become recruits to the shooting ranks.

The only remedy which suggests itself to the Council is the formation of Regimental Clubs in the several corps which would lead to a greater interest in the relative shooting of the companies composing them. There is a noticeable lack of this interest in our own corps as compared with many of the corps elsewhere in Canada. In many of the battalions it is regarded as almost necessary to efficiency that a fairly strong team should be furnished each year to sustain the credit of the corps at the Provincial gatherings.

The Council therefore submit to the consideration of the members their opinion that the only means now remaining by which the membership of the Provincial Rifle Association can be enlarged lies in the formation of Shooting Clubs and Shooting Committees in the different corps whose work it would be to encourage an interest in prize shooting.

What alterations in the present programme would likely aid in increasing the attendance has been a question much considered by the members of the Council, and numerous suggestions have been offered and some of these the Council would beg to make mention of in this report, though, without expressing any opinion as to their probable effect. It has been suggested that a Maiden Team Match be added to thr Prize List—open to teams of five from each corps—teams to be composed solely of men who have never before attended a Provincial Meeting. Also, that the squadding be so arranged that the matches shall only occupy three days, and thus effect a saving both of time and money to the competitors. Also, to restrict the Nursery Match to those who have never won a larger prize than one of Five Dollars. Also, that a Nursery Aggregate be provided, restricted in the same manner.

- 2. Owing to the lack of English Ammunition the Association was forced to accept that of Canadian make for use at the matches. It was unfortunately found very unreliable and complaints about it were general among those who shot it. It is to be hoped that immediate steps will be taken to remedy its defects, for unless the quality is improved the consequence must be fatal to Snider shooting in the Dominion. The Executive Committee found it necessary to issue an order that only the ammunition sold at the office should be used in the matches so as to place all the competitors on an equal footing. It would be well, in the future, to insert a clause to this effect in the regulations governing the meeting.
- 3. The Association was fortunate in having a good representation at the Dominion Matches, there being the team proper of twenty members and five others who accompanied it. With much difficulty free passage over the Intercolonial was secured for the team. We have much reason to hope that the Authorities will continue to pass the Maritime Riflemen as far as Quebec free of charge. If it is ever refused, it will be impossible for this Association, at least, to furnish anything like a proportionate contingent to the Dominion Meeting. The team Captain's report contains the detail of the team's success, in some particulars very gratifying. Its winnings were larger than those

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of twenty h difficulty team. We nue to pass If it is ever to furnish on Meeting. It is success, in than those

of any former New Brunswick team, and it brought back the chief prize in the Governor-General's Match. The Council also notice with satisfaction that three of the team hold places on next year's Wimbledon twenty.

4. Since the last Annual Meeting a five year's lease of the Stockton Range, at the present yearly rental of Sixty Dollars, has been procured from the proprietors. By its terms, occupation by the Association must begin not earlier than the 18th of August in each year.

5. Acting on the suggestion contained in the last Annual Report the Executive Committee had an additional butt constructed for the extra Series Matches, and this gave all the accommodation required. The butt has been so built that it will mount a long-range target, and the Council consider that it might be advisable to include in the next programme a match at 800 yards for Martini rifles only.

6. Early in the year some correspondence took place between this Association and those of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island with reference to an Annual Inter-Provincial Team Match. Both Associations seemed desirous of having such a match definitely arranged, but the occurrence of the Northwest Rebellion put an end to the further consideration of the matter. It is too important a match to be permitted to fall through and the incoming Council would do well to take the initiative in bringing it once more to the notice of the other Associations. In view of the growing importance and necessity of Martini shooting, a match such as this with that rifle would be of the greatest benefit to the older marksmen of all three Provinces.

7. By the accounts of the Treasurer which are submitted it will be seen that the usual grants were received from the Dominion and Provincial Governments. The meagre attendance at the matches of course seriously affected the receipts and so the Association must begin another year with but a small balance in its favor.

To the President and Members of the Provincial Rifle Association :-

Gentlemen,—Your Auditors beg to report that, after examination they find, as per Secretary-Treasurer's report, the receipts of the past year to be \$2,355.10, which, with balance in hand from previous statement, makes a total of \$2,377.13. The expenditures were \$2,376.45, leaving a present balance of 68 cents on hand. We find vouchers for all the outlay except the disbursement to Ottawa team of \$300, and the item \$24.30 for incidentals, which can no doubt be explained by the Secretary.

We are unable to check the receipts so far as entrance fees, sighting shots, sale of ammunition, etc., are concerned, there being no corresponding data by which to do so. We think some system should be adopted whereby a check would be had and furnished on the receipts as well as on the expenditure. The Secretary appends to his statement the quantity of ammunition on hand, valued at \$83.36; also the liability of the Association of \$31.25.

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OTTAWA TEAM REPORT.

Saint John, N. B., September 28, 1885.

SIR,—I have the honor to submit herewith a return of the prizes gained by the New Brunswick Team at the recent matches of the Dominion Rifle Association. I would further beg to report that as Captain of the Team I received the Provincial Grant of \$300.00 and, after having paid the amount of the entrance fees, divided the remainder equally among the members of the team proper.

The whole representation numbered twenty-five.

It is a well understood thing that those who attend the Ottawa Matches for the first time have but a meagre chance of success, and until they become familiar with the peculiarities of Rideau must not be surprised if their efforts are fruitless. I therefore think it but right to mention that one-fourth of the team were strangers to the range and, although it is highly satisfactory that new men should find their way to Ottawa, yet the fact that the team was so constituted is one to be weighed when the team's record is under consideration.

I would beg to make special mention of the position taken by Staff-Sergt. Winter in the Manufacturer's match, and by Lieut. McRobbie in the Rideau; also of Lieut. E. A. Smith's first place in the 800 yard extra series, in which match he was second last year.

On the whole, the team may be considered to have done fairly well in the regular matches, and more than usually well in the side competitions. High scores were made in all the matches, but they were confined to those who were so fortunate as to escape the rain squalls. As a consequence of the variable weather the aggregate scores were comparatively low.

Trooper Beatty, Private W. Lordly, Sergt. D. M. Loggie and Lieut. J. H. McRobbie were successful in getting into the Grand Aggregate and so entitled to take part in the shooting for the Lansdowne prizes. That the special prize given by His Excellency should have been won by a member from New Brunswick is a success of which the team and the association can truly be proud. Sergt. Loggie's grand score of 95, made under such trying circumstances, places him among the foremost of Canada's riflemen.

It will be noticed that three of the above named men are members of the next Wimbledon team.

I would suggest that, next year, advantage be taken of the admirable camping accommodation which the range affords, and that arrangements be made beforehand to place the team under canvass. The formation of a New Brunswick camp would, I feel sure, add greatly to the enjoyment of the visit. At present, the team scatters on arrival at Ottawa, and then follows the daily inconvenience of getting to and from the range, whilst if the team were under canvass the members would remain together, and morning gunfire would find them quietly prepared to commence the day's work.

It is, of course, known to the riflemen of the Province that the Martini-Henry has altogether superseded the Snider at Wimbledon, and that the members of the Canadian team are placed at a great disadvantage through not being familiar with the newer weapon. The Dominion association can hardly allow this state of affairs to continue, and will, no doubt, wisely introduce more Martini matches into the series which determines the *personnel* of the team. It thus becomes imperative upon those who look forward to the Wimbledon team, or to a foremost place at Otawa, to devote themselves more closely to Martini shooting.
