THE SUN'S LIBEL SUIT.

Our esteemed contemporary, the Sun, is the defendant in an action which has been brought against it by Judge Steadman of the county court for the publication in that paper of certain articles reflecting on him in its capacity of acting officer for Queens county. In these articles Judge Steadman is charged with gross unfairness with respect to the reception of the names of voters, the result of his action being to give the Grits the advantage over the Conservatives in Queens. If what the Sun states is true, Mr. Steadman is not fit to be a returning officer of Queens or any other county much less to be a judge of the county court. The defendants have justified their alleged libel by showing that the facts contained in it are true and no issue has been joined. The trial of the case is set down for the 27th inst. which begins tomorrow with Mr. Justice Tuck on the bench. Judge Steadman claims damages to the amount of \$10,000. An attempt was made by Mr. Curran on behalf of the defendant to change the venue to St. John in this case on several grounds. One of these, the extra expense involved in having the trial at Fredericton was defeated by the plaintiff agreeing to pay the extra expense of witnesses, whatever it might be. Another ground was that the fact that Mr. Steadman, being judge of the County Court for York, was at an advantage over the defendant, every juryman being a possible plaintiff or defendant in a suit before him, some time or other. We think that this objection was entitled to more weight than it received and the trial should have been held in St. John. There is no denying the fact that, human nature being as it is, a judge like Mr. Steadman stands at an enormous advantage in a suit as compared with a newspaper. In a position like the Sun Publishing Co. in the county in which he is judge. We already see proof of this in the comments of some of the Fredericton newspapers who are taking Judge Steadman's part without apparently knowing anything of the merits of the case. FREE SUGAR OR FREE TRADE WITH SOUTH AFRICA.

It looks now as if President Harrison might veto the McKinley tariff bill which has been giving both houses of Congress much trouble. This idea has originated in the President's mind, and is being given the force of a message recently sent by the President to Congress, enclosing a letter from Mr. Blaine, in which he recommends free trade between the United States and the other American nations. Mr. Blaine suggests that Congress pass an amendment to the tariff act of 1882, which exempts from all the products of any nation of the American hemisphere upon which no export duties are imposed whenever and so long as such nation shall admit its ports free of all national, provincial, municipal and other duties, and that it will waive the British people to the necessity of taking some steps to counteract American hostility to British interests.

THE CHATHAM WATER.

The Chatham Water, referring to the address of Dr. Carman, general superintendent of the Methodist church of Canada, urging the formation of a solid Protestant phalanx against the Roman Catholic church, says: "Mr. Carman is behind the age. The percentage of goods which come from Great Britain to Canada by way of American ports is really surprising—we should say, rather, humiliating. With a line of fast steamers the prestige we should enjoy would be a valuable collateral to the tangible advantages with relation to trade. Our national prospects warrant the very best service that engineering skill can devise, and the spirit of enterprise among our citizens will maintain the Government in its measures to secure that service.' We are glad to see the people of Canada becoming alive to the great importance of this matter."
