## GENERAL INFORMATION

**A** LL SEATS BEING FREE, the maintenance of the Church depends entirely upon the voluntary contributions of the members and adherents. It is therefore the duty of every member and adherent to undertake to give a certain sum of money EACH SABBATH.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the  
Congregation.

Toronto, January 20th, 1897.

Pursuant to notice read from the pulpit on the two preceding Sabbaths, the annual meeting was held this evening in the lecture hall.

The meeting was opened by prayer. The chair was occupied by the Rev. Alex. Gilray.

On the motion of Mr. Jas. Turnbull, seconded by Mr. Chas. T. Lyon, Mr. James Brown was appointed Secretary of the meeting.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting as printed in the year book were accepted as read.

The report of the Board of Managers was read by Mr. James Brown who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The nominations for the eight vacancies on the Board of Managers was then made, which resulted in the election of the following gentlemen for three years, Messrs. A. E. Bastedo, James Brown, W. P. McCulloch, C. McPherson, D. Urquhart, and H. F. Sharpe, and for two years Mr. G. R. W. Thomas, and for one year Mr. Wm. Bennett.

The Scrutineers being Messrs. Imrie, Miller, Henderson, Clarke and Gordon.

The Treasurer's report was received as printed by the motion of Mr. C. R. Peterkin, treasurer. Carried.

The Session report was read by the Session clerk, Mr. Geo. E. Dalby, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Sabbath School report was read by Mr. Samuelson, Supt., who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Women's Foreign Missionary Society report was read by its president, Mrs. Gray, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Y. P. S. C. E. report was read by Mr. W. P. McCulloch, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

Woman's Association report was read by the Secretary of the Meeting on behalf of Miss Jessie Mitchell, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

Bible Class report was read by Mr. G. R. W. Thomas, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

Junior Society of Christian Endeavor report was read by Mr. Robt. Wilson, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Speedwell Mission Band report was read by the Secretary of the Meeting on behalf of Miss Katie Macdonald, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

Boys' Brigade, Rev. Alex. Gilray reported that the Brigade had worked well the beginning of the year, but that it had been thought advisable to discontinue it during the summer and fall. He was glad to report that one of the boys had received the General's medal. The Brigade he said had started up again, and that the out-look was very good for a good season's work.

The Board of Managers report after a short discussion, was accepted as read on the motion of Mr. D. W. Clark, seconded by Mr. Elder.

In connection with the suggestion contained in the Board of Managers report re renewal of mortgage, the Chairman of the Board Mr. C. R. Peterkin moved the following resolution, seconded by Mr. E. H. Harcourt, "that in view of the mortgage "on the church property falling due in June next, and to save the "calling of a congregational meeting at that time, I beg to move "that the Board of Managers be, and are hereby empowered to "make all necessary arrangements for the renewal of the same." Carried.

The Treasurer's report as in the hands of the congregation was then taken up, and accepted without discussion.

It was moved by Mr. McCullough, seconded by Mr. Chas. G. Smith, that the several other reports be received, and adopted as read. Carried.

On the motion of Mr. Geo. E. Dalby, seconded by Mr. Wm. Clark, the following gentlemen were appointed trustees for 1897, Messrs. James Turnbull, B. A., H. F. Sharpe, and C. McPherson. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Elder, seconded by Mr. Chas. T. Lyon, that Mr. W. E. Raney and Mr. H. C. Wright be appointed auditors for the coming year. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Elder, seconded by Mr. Lyon, that a vote of thanks be tendered to the treasurer, Mr. C. R. Peterkin

for his services. This motion was spoken to by a number of gentlemen each expressing appreciation of the valuable services Mr. Peterkin has rendered the church. Carried by a standing vote.

A vote of thanks was extended the secretary, Mr. James Brown, which was moved by Mr. A. E. Bastedo, and seconded by Mr. Imrie. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Elder, that a vote of thanks be tendered the pastor. This motion was heartily received, and as heartily carried.

It was moved by Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Acheson, that a vote of thanks be tendered the Woman's Association, and the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society for their services. Carried.

A vote of thanks was also tendered the Board of Managers, Sabbath School Superintendent, Teachers and all other officers of the church for their services during the year. This motion being moved by Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Henderson. Carried.

A vote of thanks was tendered the choir on the motion of Mr. Bastedo, seconded by Mr. Miller. Carried.

A brief discussion followed in reference to the musical service of the church, but nothing was decided upon.

It was moved by Mr. R. Wilson, and duly seconded, that the Board of Managers be instructed to publish the "Annual Year Book." Carried.

This concluded the business of the meeting, which was dismissed by the singing of the Doxology, and prayer by the pastor, Rev. Alex. Gilray.

NOTE, No summary is made of any of the reports referred to in the Minutes, each of them being printed in full in the following pages,

### Session Report for Year 1896.

During the year 71 members have been added by Certificate, and 35 by Profession of Faith—106 in all. Eighty-five have been disjoined, and we lament with the congregation the decease of 6 of their number, viz., Mrs. Cameron, Mr. James Connell, Mr. Robt. Kemp, Mrs. Lang, Miss M. Waddingham, and Miss Ellen Willard, leaving a membership, after purging the roll, of 846. There were 38 infants and 4 adults baptized.

Mr. Jas. Calhoun, having moved from the city, has necessarily severed his connection with the Session.

The attendance of the congregation at the Sabbath services has increased, and we are glad to be able to report increased numbers at Communion, 644 being present on the last occasion of its observance.

As the various Societies and Departments of the congregation will be represented, and speak through their respective reports we do not wish to anticipate them, but desire to express our satisfaction at the good work accomplished in the Sabbath School, and thankfulness for the intelligent interest of the young people of the Bible class, for the zealous efforts of the Y. P. S. of C. E., for the faithfulness of the active members of the Auxillary to the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society, and the liberal support of the congregation which has enabled its management to report a considerable advance.

We take this opportunity of recognizing the fidelity of our Missionary Collectors.

We commend the labor of love cheerfully rendered by the Woman's Association in works of benevolence and mercy, and are grateful for the splendid results of their active co-operation with our Board of Management.

We are thankful for the harmony existing in the Choir, and for their helpfulness in leading the inspiring Exercises of Praise, and that they thus devote the talent God has given, to His Glory.

We desire to express our indebtedness to the Board for all the faithfulness, wisdom, and care they have shown in the management of our financial affairs.

We congratulate the congregation on the encouraging reports which will be submitted to you at this time.

We have cause for heart-felt gratitude to Almighty God for all His Goodness, in the prosperity we enjoy, but let us not forget to look, and work, and pray for more remarkable signs of growth "in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." Let us work together heart and hand without any selfish aim or thought "forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

## Board of Managers Annual Report.

The Board have pleasure in presenting their annual report for 1896.

The average collection for the year was \$89.12 per Sabbath, the average collection for 1895 was \$93.74 per Sabbath, or a decrease of \$4.62 per Sabbath during the past year. The direct revenue for 1896 was \$5,527.03, and for 1895 was \$5,573.78, showing a decrease for 1896 of \$46.75. Although this is so, the total amount received from all sources during the year is ahead of that of 1895 to the extent of \$224.77, and we are glad to say that the floating debt has been reduced \$40.79 during the past year. The treasurer's statement you have in detail in your hands.

The Debt Fund during 1896 has proved so satisfactory, that your Board have decided to make the fund a permanent one, and with this object in view, have adopted a small envelope in keeping with the weekly offering envelope, only it will be blue in color, and known as the "Debt Fund." This envelope to be used on the same system, as during 1896, that is, one to be used monthly, on the last Sabbath of each month.

Your Board takes this opportunity of again strongly urging the greater use of the weekly offering system by the members, and adherents of this church, and would impress on those not using them, that this is the authorized system of the church, and it is the duty of every member and adherent to use this system, and that regularly. It is urged that those not now using the envelopes will commence the year by doing so.

The Board would draw the congregations attention to the fact that the mortgage on the church falls due in June, and to save the necessity of calling a special congregation meeting about that date, they would recommend your empowering the Board now, to renew the mortgage when due to the best advantage.

The Board have decided for the better management of the church affairs to ask the heads of each department of this church to act jointly with a committee from the Board, the object being the arranging of, and the better systemizing of meetings and entertainments during 1897, it being hoped in this way to concentrate the work more, and make every branch as successful as possible.

The Board takes this opportunity of thanking the Woman's Association for the help afforded them during the past year, and

would recommend earnestly the noble effort they are about to put forth this year to do still greater work.

The retiring members of the Board are Messrs. James Brown, A. E. Bastedo, A. Bell, W. P. McCulloch, P. B. Martin, D. Cameron, N. Binns and R. Wilson, Mr. Wilson, retired voluntary, having yet two years of his term and Mr. Binns one year of his term unexpired, two gentlemen will require to be elected to fill their places for the unexpired time. All of the above named gentlemen are eligible for re-election.

In conclusion, our prayer is, that God's blessing may continue to rest upon us during the year on which we have entered even more abundantly than in the past.

### Sabbath School Report for 1896.

The average attendance has increased 17 per Sabbath, which might be still further increased if scholars were prompt in returning after holidays.

Two Junior Bible Classes have been formed, one for girls, and one for boys. The teachers are Mrs. Gray and Miss A. J. Grimason, respectively.

The temperance department has been re-organized with Miss L. Rhind as secretary. So far 70 of our scholars have signed the pledge.

One hundred and sixty volumes have been added to our library.

Nineteen candidates were successful in the Higher Religious Instruction examination.

#### HINDRANCES.

Sabbath parades. Want of co-operation between parents and teachers. Neglect of scholars to bring their bibles. Lack of proper preparation of lessons on the part of many of the scholars. Irreverence and improper behavior in some cases.

## ENCOURAGEMENTS.

Many of the scholars show an earnest interest in the study of the Word of God. Every now and again we hear of former scholars deciding for Christ. Twelve have united with the Church by profession of faith, and many who have not yet united, we have good reason to believe truly love the Saviour.



The attendance for 1896 was 1,034 more than last year, being 3,455, average 66, a gain of 19 over last year, distributed as follows:—Ladies 49, gentlemen 17. The Class was in Session every Sabbath during the year.

The collections were as follows:—General \$91.39, being \$31.96 more than last year; Monthly Debt Fund \$37.75 being an increase over last years share fund of \$32.75, and special \$6.45, an increase of \$1.34, in all amounting to \$135.59, an increase of \$64.74 over last year.

It has been decided by the Class to continue the Monthly Debt Fund Collections for the present. The Committee for the present year is as follows:—Misses McRae, Wright, Hunter, L. McCracken & Havill, and Messrs. McCulloch, Havill and Mitchell. Miss A. Miller has been appointed organist for the new year. We desire to thank Miss Best for her kind services at the organ during the year, and also Miss Readman and Mr. Cook for their services on our Committee, which reminds us of the very pleasant evening we spent last February at the Bible Class Reception.

We shall also follow the International Lesson scheme during 1897 under the teaching of our Pastor.

We are looking forward to 1897 with expectations of greater blessings than we received during the past, and we would in closing extend a most hearty invitation to every person in the congregation, who has not joined our class to become members, and enjoy the study of God's Word with us.

The Society can, at the close of the year 1896, look back upon a Term in which there has been much accomplished along the different lines of Christian work. So apparent and effectual has been the work in some branches, under the guidance and approval of our Master, as to call forth words of praise and gladness from our Pastor. The increase of interest in Missionary work has especially been very marked, and the Missionary Committee, the members of which have done such excellent work in the neighboring districts distributing tracts, visiting different families, and reporting any cases in need of assistance or a pastoral visit, has been re-appointed with the majority of the old members at their own special request. The Flower Committee intend, during the coming Term, to work more in touch with the Missionary Committee, thereby being enabled to reach many a cheerless home, which otherwise would be unknown to them, with a bouquet of flowers and a suitable verse of Scripture. The Society has also made special efforts in con-

nection with Foreign and Home Missions, having raised a special amount of \$25.00 for a Mission Station among the Mormons in the West, over and above the one quarter of all receipts, amounting this year to \$32.94, which is set apart and allocated in the usual way to the different Foreign and Home Missions of the Presbyterian Church. This amount is somewhat larger than in previous years. The sum of \$54.28 handed over from our regular contributions to the Church Treasurer, is also in advance of previous years. At the last business meeting of the Term, the different Committees presented most interesting and encouraging reports upon the different branches of the work. The Prayer-Meeting, Social and Lookout and Calling Committees have done much to increase the interest in the weekly prayer-meetings by a most appropriate selection of leaders, a hearty hand-shake and welcome to all, and a personal interest shown in any desiring to join with us. The Lookout Committee has, in all, reported the names of twenty-five new members during the year, but on the other hand thirty-six names in all have been taken from our roll, the majority of these having left the city and others in our immediate vicinity, thus leaving us with 107 active members as against 128 at the beginning of the Term. The Sabbath School Committee deserve credit for their ready assistance in taking the places from time to time of absent teachers, a work which is sometimes not very encouraging to young Christians. The Good-Literature Committee have, during the year, arranged a series of Lectures, principally upon the Foundations and Doctrines of the Presbyterian Church, all of which were much appreciated and well attended. The Good-Citizenship Committee, as well as being good Temperance advocates in our midst, have given special attention to the Sabbath Observance question, and are now busy fighting Sunday Cars; and last, but not least, we would not forget the Musical Committee, the members of which are usually found to the front taking a very noticeable and hearty interest in making the musical part of the meetings praiseworthy and beneficial.

Summing all up we can only say, "Surely goodness and mercy have followed us all the days of this year," and we pray that during the coming Term our Society may receive such a rich spiritual blessing that each one of our members, as well as those with whom we come in contact, may be led to realize more fully how good and blessed a thing it is to wait upon the Lord, and take some part in the extending of His Kingdom.
