





Milk cared for in this way will reach the factory in good condition, if these additional directions are observed reach the factory in good condition, if these additional directions are observed viz.: When sour whey is carried home in cans it should be removed at once, and the cans washed first with soap and warm water, afterwards scalded with boiling water and put out in the open air till required for use. Never put scalding water in the cans till they have first heen washed required for use. Never put scalding water in the canst till they have first been washed, and if possible never let your milk go to the factory at a temperature of 64 degrees or over. At that temperature, the shaking of the wagon is most apt to cause small lumps of butter fat to collect on the milk, and if they make their appearance that butter goes out in the whey. It can never be put back in the cheese. Its loss makes the average less, and effects the quality of the cheese.
