Spain Will Not Relinquish Her Territory-The Limit of Concession Has Been Reached-The Premier Calls on the People to Unite in the Face of an Odious Attempt Against Spanish

The speech which the Queen Regent will deliver at the opening of the Spanish Cortes to-day will, it is said, prove satisfactory to the national sentiments of the Spaniards. Perfect unanimity prevails throughout the country, war is preferred rather than yield to the demands of the United States.
