

## MEMORANDA.

**The Session** meets on the first Tuesday of each month, in the Vestry.

**The Weekly Prayer Meeting of the Congregation** is held every Wednesday evening, at 7½ o'clock, in the Lecture Room.

**The Ordinance of Baptism** is dispensed on the first Wednesday of each month, at the Prayer Meeting, in the Lecture Room.

**The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper** is dispensed on the first Sabbaths in February, June and October.

**The Sabbath School** meets every Sabbath in the Lecture Room, at 2½ p. m. Bible Class meets in the Bible Class Room, at the same hour.

**The Sabbath School Teachers** meet on the first Monday in each month, at 7½ o'clock, in the Library.

**The Committee of the Missionary Society** and Collectors meet on the first Wednesday of each month, and a meeting of the congregation for prayer and the receiving of Missionary intelligence, is held on the same evening, at 7½ o'clock in the Lecture Room.

**The Deacons' Court and Managing Committee** meet on the second Tuesday of each month, at 7½ o'clock, in the Library.

**Pew Holders** leaving the bounds, or giving up their sittings, are requested to give notice to the Pew-Secretary, in order that the seats may be re-let at once. Pew rent is payable quarterly, in advance, on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October.

TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE  
Deacons' Court and Managing Committee  
OF  
**ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, LONDON,**  
FOR THE YEAR 1872.

In submitting the Twenty-second Annual Report the Deacon's Court and Managing Committee desire to acknowledge the goodness of God for his merciful kindness to us, and for the blessings of peace and prosperity he has vouchsafed to us as a congregation,—that he has been pleased to preserve our beloved Pastor in health, and that during the past year there has been no assistance required on account of his health. This can be seen from the small amount charged in the Treasurer's account for ministerial services.

Death has been amongst us since our last annual meeting, and removed old and young. Of the number thus taken from our midst, we have to regret the

death of one of our respected Deacons, Mr. Robert Moore—and Mr. Andrew Chisholm, one of the Trustees for the Cemetery.

In regard to the income and expenditure of the congregation, we have to report that the same are in a satisfactory condition; the books of the Treasurer have been audited and found correct, and an abstract of the receipts and disbursements for the year is annexed to this Report; and it is evident, were it not for the amount paid towards the building of the Manse that a large balance would be at the credit of the congregation.

#### THE MANSE.

Your Committee have to report that the Manse has been finished, and is now occupied by our beloved Pastor, and we are glad to state that he is quite satisfied with it and finds it a comfortable home. The Manse, outhouses and fences, cost \$4673.67. Of this amount there is still due to the bank \$2500, and in order that this amount may be paid off at once, and thus avoid a further mortgage on the *church property*, it is recommended that a subscription list be opened immediately to liquidate this debt, as your committee are satisfied that the required amount will be subscribed and paid in a very short time.

The old manse has been removed, and its removal has added considerably to the appearance of the church. The ground on which it stood will require to be sodded

and planted with trees, so as to be uniform with the rest of the ground.

Your Committee expected a large sum from those in arrears to the building fund of the church, and from others of the congregation who did not subscribe to that fund to assist in erecting the Manse ; in this they were disappointed, but your committee are very glad to think that defaulters and non-subscribers will have an opportunity of coming forward and liberally assisting those who subscribed handsomely at the first, and will, no doubt, do so again.

The congregation is aware that there is a sum of \$9000 borrowed from the Huron and Erie Savings and Loan Society, and that \$720 a year is required to be paid as interest for this amount. Your Committee would respectfully recommend to their successors in office that as they are sure a larger sum than what is required for the Manse debt will be subscribed, the balance be applied towards the payment of this liability.

Your Committee beg to draw attention to the small sum collected on the arrearages of the Building Fund and Erection of Shed's subscriptions, which still amount to over \$800, and they consider that subscribers in arrears to these funds are in honor bound to pay their subscriptions forthwith.

Your Committee would recommend that the quarterly collections for meeting the interest on the amount borrowed, be continued for another year.

Your Committee would desire to record their appreciation of the services of the choir, under the leadership of Mr. Barron, during the year, and the thanks of the congregation are due to the several members of the choir for their disinterested services.

In consequence of the lamented death of Mr. Andrew Chisholm it will be necessary for the congregation to appoint a Trustee for the Cemetery.

In accordance with a resolution passed at the last annual meeting, a social meeting of the congregation was held in March last, which, thanks to the services of Mr. E. Rowland and the ladies of the congregation, was a financial success—the amount of \$176.83 having been realized—and your committee would recommend that in future such meetings of the congregation should be held more frequently.

In compliance with the rules of the congregation six managers retire annually. Those whose term of office now expires are :

# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SABBATH SCHOOLS

IN CONNECTION WITH ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH FOR 1872.

In submitting our Report for the year just closed, we would anew express our thankfulness to God for the many blessings we have received at his hand, and for the health vouchsafed, by which we have been enabled to prosecute the work of Sabbath School instruction through another year. While in the providence of God some of the teachers have been removed from the city to other spheres of labor, none have been removed by death. This is also true as regards the scholars.

We regret that we cannot report any marked increase of numbers over past years. The want of a sufficient number of regular and efficient teachers is still very much felt. We would again earnestly desire the sympathy and hearty co-operation of parents and other friends of the Sabbath School in this most important work. There is plenty to do, therefore do not wait to be asked, but having first given yourself to the Lord, come and work for Him. "The harvest truly is great, but the labourers few." The effort commenced in 1871 to excite a missionary spirit in the hearts of the children, by their uniting to support a pupil at the Point Aux Tremble's School has, we are happy to say, been increasingly successful. The sum of \$62 has been raised for this mission during the year, being double the amount contributed in 1871.

The Sabbath School organization consists of the Central School, and three branch Schools—one in the Gore of London, one in Westminster and one in Petersville.
