The agitation for union of the Methodist bodies of this Dominion has resulted in the formulation and adoption of a basis of Union for the contracting bodies, which has been accepted by each and all of the Churches. Union is upon us. We are committed to it. We kindly urge you to stand firmly by the constitutional action of the Church.

This has been a year of earnest and successful effort in soul-saving. Financially there has been, through the pressure of hard times, from natural causes, great depression, not only throughout Ontario, but throughout the continent. We have realized this in a marked degree, but are sanguine that no disastrous results shall follow. There are many considerations calling us to prompt and energetic action in monetary matters. Our missions demand greater donations and enlarged subscriptions, and we trust the wealthy may be inspired to lead out in contributions and bequests for this great work—the evangelization of the world.

Our Educational enterprises are the bulwarks of the Church. Freedom from sin and ignorance is the watchword of Zion. Give liberally therefore towards the support of our colleges and universities, so that the rising generation may become educated, cultured and accomplished—competent to fill the places assigned them in the future—and particularly that the ministers may be as

SABBATH-SCHOOL UNION.

The Board of the Sabbath School Union can state with confidence the assistance they have rendered during the past year to open schools, and to assist weak schools, has been very beneficial, and highly appreciated.

It is a cause of thankfulness to the Union that an increased number of conversions are reported.

There has been a falling off in the number of returns as per schedule, but the Board feel assured it is not that Sabbath-Schools are dying out, but rather that enough attention has not been given to the proper gathering of statistics.

The Union would recommend our ministers to, first, often call attention to the importance of Sabbath-School work; second, to preach on the subject; third, to visit as often as possible the schools under their charge; fourth, to enquire of officers as to the prosperity of schools under their care; fifth, also to interest themselves in the financial work of Sabbath-Schools. On Motion—It was ordered that we have two hundred copies of Minutes, also two hundred Missionary reports published in connection with the Minutes.

It was resolved that the Secretary of Conference be the depository of all Conference documents, books, and journals belonging to the Conference.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted :

TO REV. JAMES CURTS, SECRETARY OF THE ONTARIO ANNUAL CONFERENCE :

Reverend and Dear Sir and Brother.—We, the members of the Ontario Annual Conference, desire to express to you our very great appreciation of your valuable services as Secretary of the same for the entire term of its existence of 22 years. Your labors have been abundant, and without remuneration, and therefore we

beg you to accept this small sum of money at our hands, not so much for its real value as to convey to you our great regard for the sacrifices made, and the great willingness manifested by yourself in serving this body."

It was resolved that the Treasurer of the Missionary society be instructed not to pay out any monies to those who had not reported to this Conference until he had received a report from them.

Resolved—That in the unsettled state of the Educational interests in this country, this Annual Conference would suggest the advisability of having a Methodist University, supported by the Methodist people.

Resolved—That the Secretary of the Conference, together with Revs. E. E. Howard and W. J. Maybee be a committee to prepare a revised ministerial time table, under the disciplinary rules, for the Minutes, to whom any brother not properly credited in the present table may represent his case in writing.

REPORTS.

EQUALIZATION.

1. Whereas inquiries are being made repeatedly as to the amount required of each minister, your Committee have to say that it altogether depends on the amount raised and the number of ministers going into the Union. The amount per capita that each minister in the active work and superannuated relation is expected to pay is \$129, to equalize with the C. M. Church of Canada. This, multiplied by the number going into the Union will give the aggregate to be raised. From this will be deducted the total amount raised; the balance, divided among the active and superannuated men, will be the amount per capita required.

2. Your Committee have ascertained that the total amount assessed the Ontario Annual Conference is \$9,146. To meet this there is

3. Your Committee recommend that the preacher in charge be responsible for the thorough canvass of his charge, and may select such agencies as are available to secure the assessment.

4. That each Presiding Elder call his preachers together for immediate and practical action.

5. That all monies be paid by the 10th of June to be forwarded to the Rev. C. A. Simpson, Treasurer of the Ontario Conference.

6. All notes to be drawn in favor of the Presiding Elders on their respective districts. Where notes are, parties in whose favor they are drawn turn them into cash on the best possible terms.

7. That in case the General Conference Board make a pro rata division of the liabilities in order that justice be done, the assets be divided in the same manner.

EDUCATION.

Your Committee to whom was referred the subject of Education beg leave to report as follows :

Having heard the reports from our Educational Institutions, we rejoice in the evidence those reports give that the interest in Christian education is still on the increase among our people, and that the several institutions have well maintained their former efficiency for good during the past year.

The endowment fund of Albert University, under the able management of Rev. A. Campbell, has now reached the respectable sum of over \$51,000. We regret, however, to learn that the advantage which the University should reap from that endowment is very much reduced by the tardiness of so many in paying the interest on their notes.

The financial state of Alma College is very creditable to its able Board of Management, and satisfactory to those who have contributed to make it so. We regret that the Board was under the necessity of changing its intended course of having no more paid agents, but the explanations received by your committee from Mr. E. I. Warner, to our minds, fully justify their course, and as the total cost of the paid agency was only \$480, and the necessity of the case was urgent, they deserve credit at least for their economy.

We are happy to be able to state that in the opinion of the officers of Albert University the proposed changes that will take place on the consummation of Union will not militate against the cause of education, but will greatly economize the resources. Albert College will be continued in all its efficiency as an educational institution, and the rights of those of its students who may wish to pursue a University course properly guarded.

We would state our conviction that whatever changes may take place, there will be abundant call for liberality on the part of the friends of Chris-

tian education, that our United Methodism may become a mightier power for good on this line than could ever be reached by us in our divided state.

We will close our report by giving some figures taken from the report presented at the late Union General Conference, first of our own institutions. The aggregate is: real estate, \$118,000; endowment, \$51,000; income, \$27,000. Then of the combined educational institutions of Methodism in Canada: real estate, \$376,563; endowment fund, \$438,955; income, \$85,868. By which it will be seen that the M. E. Church, in educational matters, will bring into the Union nearly one-third of its real estate, nearly one-eighth of its endowment fund, and reaches nearly one-third of the income. All of which is respectfully submitted.

We regard the Sabbath School as a religious institution, for the purpose of leading the children to Christ, through a knowledge of His word, and are pleased to learn that the blessing of God is resting upon this means, and resulting in the conversion of many.

We are satisfied that no expenditure either of time or money is more remunerative than that spent in this cause. The blessing of our Lord, "Suffer little children to come unto Me, and forbid them not, for of such is the kingdom of Heaven," remains unchanged. It is high time that the Church became more fully aroused to the importance of giving our children a Scriptural education. We recommend, therefore, the general use of our Catechism in the Sabbath School, believing that it would secure uniformity in doctrine, and consequently result in good. MEMOIRS.

The subject of this memoir, Rev. F. W. Watts, was the eldest son of Rev. J. H. Watts for many years, a faithful minister of the M. E. Church, Ontario Conference. He was born in London, Ontario, March 28th, 1854, and was converted in the twenty second year of his age, and joined the M. E. Church. Soon after his conversion he began to feel that his life work was to preach the Gospel of Christ, and the Church seeing in him the elements of a successful minister, soon recognized that call, and at the Conference of 1877 he was admitted on trial into the itinerancy, and stationed with his father as his superintendent on the Haldimand circuit. The next year he labored with the Rev. W. Hansom on the Orono and Clark Circuit. Having finished his probation with great credit, he was admitted into full connection and ordained deacon at the Brighton conference in 1879, and was stationed with Rev. W. Pirritte on the Georgetown circuit. At the Conference of 1880 he was stationed as preacher in charge of the King circuit, and on the 14th of July in that year he was united in marriage to Miss Zorah, daughter of the late Wm. Martin, of Stirling village. He was ordained elder at the Conference of 1881, and in 1883 he was removed to Oshawa station, but after laboring there for a few weeks with his usual earnestness, and just as he was winning the hearts of the people and to all probability there seemed opening up before him a year of great usefulness, he was stricken down by typhoid fever, and despite all that human skill and kindness could do, death gained a temporary victory, and our young brother passed peacefully away from earth, June 24th, 1883. After appropriate religious services led by Bishop Carman, his body was taken to Stirling and laid in the cemetery, there to await the resurrection morn, but the

freed spirit left its tenement of clay, and the turmoils of earth, and swept through the gates, and entered into the city of God. A funeral sermon was preached in Oshawa on a following Sabbath by the Rev. J. J. Reddit, former pastor of the church, to a large and sympathetic congregation.

On the arrival of the body at Stirling it was met by several ministers, who had been in attendance at the Colborne district meeting, which was holding its sessions at Campbellford at the time, but which adjourned for the occasion. A very appropriate sermon was preached by Rev. J. Curts, from Phil i. 21.

As a Christian his experience was clear and his piety decided. As a minister he was above the average in ability and earnestness. He leaves a widow and two children to mourn his loss. May the great Head of the Church, whose ways are far above our ways, ever sustain and direct them in the paths of life, and may they, with us, meet our brother again in that blissful land where death is known no more.

REV. JAMES A. CAMPBELL, pastor of Frankford Circuit, died in the parsonage, August 13th, 1883, in the 39th year of his age. He was born in the County of Peel, and was converted in the 16th year of his age. After teaching school a few years he was admitted on trial in the Ontario Annual Conference, in the spring of 1867, and shortly afterwards became a member of the same, and continued to be such until the time of his death. Among his charges were Stirling, Hope, Cobourg, Georgetown, Winnipeg, Brampton and Port Perry.

He was married February 7th, 1871, to Miss Louisa Rosevear, second daughter of the late John Rosevear, M. P. P., who, with her five children, mourns the loss of a faithful husband and an affectionate father.

At the Conference held in Colborne he asked and obtained permission to attend Albert College, where he matriculated and put in part of his course, but circumstances were such that he was unable to go up to graduation. As a preacher Bro Campbell was clear, concise, conclusive. He excelled as a writer, and was, at the time of his death, a regular contributor to the *Irish Christian Advocate*, the *St. Louis Christian Advocate*, and the *Texas Christian Advocate* of the M. E. Church South. Bro. Campbell went to his work last year fully consecrated, was winning the hearts of the people on his charge, and using his influence for the salvation of souls, but that fell disease, typhoid fever, became seated in his system, baffled the skill of his physicians, and on the 13th of August he died. He was buried in the Port Hope cemetery on the 15th, the services being conducted by Rev. James Curts, P. E., assisted by Rev. J. Learoyd, C. M., and W. J. Maybee, M. E. A week from the following Sunday a large and sympathizing audience assembled in the Church at Frankford, to hear the funeral sermon, which was preached by Bro. Curts from Rev. xiv. 13, "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord," etc.

Bro. Campbell is gone, but will not soon be forgotten by either his brethren in the ministry or the people on the circuits which he traveled.

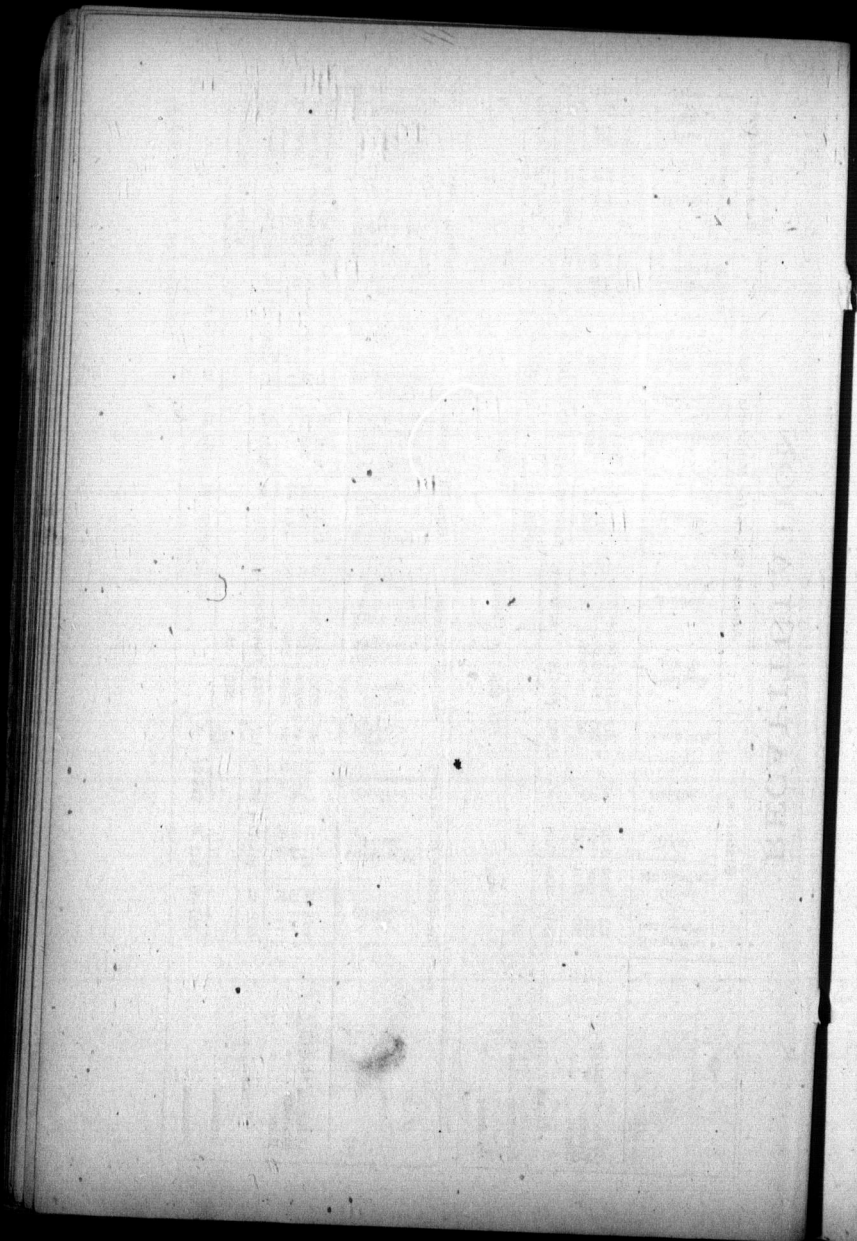

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

To the Members of the M. E. Church within the Bounds of the Bay of Quinte Conference :

DEAR BRETHREN : Another Conference year has closed under circumstances of peculiar interest and solemnity. It is a matter of thanksgiving that the year just closed has been marked with special outpourings of the Holy Spirit in the edification of the Church and the conversion of souls. This is specially encouraging under the circumstances, agitated, as we have been, by controversies, apprehensions, and anxieties. The lives and the health of the preachers have been generally preserved by a gracious Providence. One brother of wide usefulness and good report has been called to his reward. Rev. Sheldon Young died at his residence in Belleville in February last without a moments warning, but fully and joyfully prepared for his sudden exit. After a ministry of unusual fruitfulness and a brief and cheerful superannuation, our dear brother triumphed over his last enemy and passed to his coronation. May we imitate his virtues.

Since the last session of our Conference the union of the four Methodist bodies of Canada has been consummated. We would not refrain from joyful thanksgiving that this exciting question has been discussed and settled in a spirit so generous and kindly. The local and temporary frictions incident to so great a change of Church relations we ardently hope and firmly believe will be removed at an early day, and be followed by the most happy results. We offer devout thanksgiving to Almighty God that the uniting Church almost universally are disposed to yield preferences, deal generously, and accept the new situation with "faith, hope, and charity."

One great preparation for the work before us is a universal baptism of the Holy Spirit and a renewal of the experience of holiness throughout our borders. We must not forget our special mission as a Church, which, in the words of our illustrious founder, is to "spread Scriptural holiness throughout these lands." To this end we earnestly exhort preachers and people to cling to our Methodist usages, the class-meeting, the love-feast, the protracted meetings, the "altar-service," and other methods and means so greatly honored and blessed of God in the past, in the saving of souls and the up-lifting of the Church.

While we would thus loyally hold to our peculiarities as a Church, we would join in all earnest and successful efforts to rescue the perishing. We would accordingly encourage the formation of "praying bands," with the advice and under the direction of the pastors, so far as practicable, believing that such "bands" have long been useful in the United States, and more recently in our own land. Avoiding, as alike dangerous, the two extremes of formalism and fanaticism, our people, we hope, will abound in every good work that contemplates the salvation of men.

We commend the connexional interests of the new Church to your cordial sympathy and co-operation. The mission work, the new Connexional Journal, the *Guardian*, the Colleges, the Sunday-School Parliament, and all other interests of the Church, have a claim on your prayers and your earnest support.

And now, brethren, "we commend you to God, and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and to give you an inheritance among all them which are sanctified.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

EDUCATION.

The Committee on Education beg leave to present the following report: After carefully examining the reports from our Educational Institutions, we are pleased to be able to inform you that the work has been successfully and satisfactorily carried on. Our Colleges have been liberally patronized, and have enjoyed another successful and prosperous year. The Dominion is well equipped for educational purposes with public and high schools, colleges and universities, and we are gratified to see our own Colleges so largely and liberally supported. Notwithstanding the many facilities afforded by the State for higher education, we are of the firm conviction that the Methodist Church should sustain its Schools and Colleges and look carefully after the religious instruction of its own students. The higher education of women is occupying public attention as it never did before, and already lady students in arts and medicines have been laureated in Canadian universities. Alma College, erected for this work, is fully answering the purposes for which it was founded. This College, with its beautiful buildings, is becoming deservedly more popular every year, and its utmost capacity is taxed to find room for the students that throng its halls. Rev. Principal Austin has given a satisfactory account of the attendance, work and financial status of the College, and assures us that the current income has exceeded the current expenditure. The Agent, Rev. W. G. Hudgins, has rendered valuable service in collecting the notes and subscriptions. Albert and Alexandria Colleges have been largely attended, and enjoyed a year of much prosperity. The Bursar, Rev. A. Campbell, has presented his report, and shows that the assets over the liabilities is \$25,230.09; value of the Endowment Fund, \$50,000.00; net value of College property and Endowment Fund is \$75,230.00. All of which is respectfully submitted.

PRINTING.

Your Committee on Printing submit their report as follows:

They have examined minutely the report of the Book Committee and the exhibit of the Book Room placed in their hands, and are pleased to report their entire satisfaction with the management of our publishing interests for the past year.

The profits reported from the Book Room are not so large as in former years, owing to the increased expenditure for running expenses during the

past fourteen months (the period embraced in the report), and a falling off in the sale of hymn books during the year.

The *C. C. Advocate* has been published regularly during the year, and has been replete with interesting and profitable items. Your Committee think, though, that the support given to it has not been commensurate with its intrinsic worth.

They wish, also, to express their admiration of the efforts of the book agent to have all *Advocate* accounts paid in before Conference assembled; and as there is yet a large number of debts remaining unpaid, and as these debts, if paid, would largely aid in raising the Equalization Fund, your Committee therefore recommend:

1. That each preacher be requested to wait upon those who are in arrears for the *Advocate*, whose paper has been discontinued, as soon as possible after the rising of Conference, and require a settlement in cash, if possible, or by note, payable to Rev. S. G. Stone.

2. That the preachers do their utmost to collect all outstanding accounts by those who still receive the *Advocate*.

3. That the preachers be urged to use their influence to widen the circulation of our connexional paper.

CENTRAL CAMP-GROUND.

To the Bay Quinte Annual Conference of the M. E. Church of Canada:

Your Board of Trustees of the St. Lawrence Central Camp-ground beg leave to report:

That during the past year a Camp-meeting was held upon the said grounds in June by your Committee appointed for that purpose; and a Sunday-School Parliament was held on said grounds in August by our General Conference Committee for that purpose, both of which meetings were profitable to the Church and generally successful.

That from the moneys received on account of lease of lots (amounting to \$233.51), gate fees (amounting to \$599.40), boat fares (amounting to \$542.55) and board and lodging charges (amounting to \$1,209.22) your Trustees were enabled in addition to the ordinary expense of management and the unprovided for expense of the Sunday-School Parliament (amounting to \$287.91), to pay the yearly interest upon the debt incurred by your said Trustees in connection with the purchase and improvement of said ground and the erection of the tabernacle. The dining and sleeping halls and the other public buildings thereon, and the yearly insurance charges upon said buildings.

That a caretaker is kept and maintained on said grounds the year round.

That the total indebtedness of your Trustees on account of said grounds is \$9,351.10.

That a large sum is due and unpaid by lessees of lots upon their agreements for leases, for the collection of which reasonable efforts have been made with but little success, to the no small embarrassment of your Trustees.

Having been placed in this position of responsibility and trust by your body in and for the general interest of our Church, and having exerted themselves to the best of their ability in execution of said trust, your Trustees think they are entitled to the sympathy, confidence, encouragement, and active co-operation of their brethren generally, and respectfully ask the same, especially from the members of Conference, to the end that they may gradually free themselves from the financial responsibility under which they rest in this Church enterprise.

MEMOIRS.

REV. SHELDON YOUNG.

The subject of this brief notice was born in the Township of Murray, County of Northumberland, 1st September, 1819; died in Belleville in his 65th year, February 26th, 1884.

Brother Young joined the Bay Quinte Annual Conference of the M. E. Church in Canada at its first session, held in Farmersville, September 4th, 1844.

He proved himself an indefatigable worker in the Master's vineyard as an effective member of the Conference for the space of thirty-four years, having superannuated at the Napanee Conference in the year 1879. Since his superannuation he has very frequently, in the vicinity of Belleville, held service, notwithstanding his severe bodily affliction.

Bro. Young was an able minister and a remarkable revivalist, especially in the earlier days of his ministry. Many, both in the ministry and laity, claim him as their spiritual father, and doubtless there were scores of redeemed ones waiting to receive him over the river. His last days were the most peaceful and happy of his life.
