FIRST EDITION. MURDEROUS ITALIANS.

NEW ORLEANS INFESTED WITH GANGS OF ASSASSINS. A During Police Chief's Career Cut Short—Several men Tracer Arrest for the Killings—How the Emperor of the Mafia is Persecuted.

NEW ORLEANS, Oct. 18.—The Mafia has shown itself again. At midnight last night David C. Hennessy, chief of police of New Orleans, was assassinated in his own front door by two gangs of the Stogola Geta, a mysterious Italian murder society, which has existed here for years, and which has committed innumerable crimes.

The news of the murder has created the profoundest excitement and threats to have serious results. There has been much talk of lynching, and it is probable that if the evidence against the Italian mob under arrest had been stronger, some popular demonstration would have been made against the parish prison.

The assassination—the worst ever committed here—has aroused the people of New Orleans to the fact that there is a society in the city which is killing any one who gets in its way.

In view of the fact that the Mafia is in some way or other, but the authorities determined to put an end to this vendetta business, which was getting to frequent among the Italian New Orleans, and which resulted in 40 or more murders and assassinations, and vigorous efforts were made to capture the criminals.

The trial of the principal witnesses, an Italian, was assassinated. The trial resulted in a conviction, but there was so much prejudice that the judge granted a new trial, which is yet to come off.

Chief of Police Hennessy who was a witness in the first case, set to work to collect all the evidence in regard to the Mafia, the Stogola and other Italian assassination societies in New Orleans, and to the numerous vendetta and murder cases committed by them.

When Hennessy fell, the men who were considered to be the most dangerous and down the street, one of them threw a brick at the other corner for Hennessy, and the fugitives, who were crawling up the street and disappeared in the darkness.

When relief reached Hennessy he was found fallen on the door step. He was literally riddled with bullets. Both his lungs were perforated; another wound was very near his heart, and his stomach, one in his side, and still another in his back.

The doctors on the scene pronounced the wounds mortal. Hennessy died at 9 o'clock this morning. He was taken to the last and declared that the murder was committed by "Dago." Of this there was no reasonable doubt, and several persons saw the men who committed the murder before the murder, and when they were flying up the street with their guns.
