

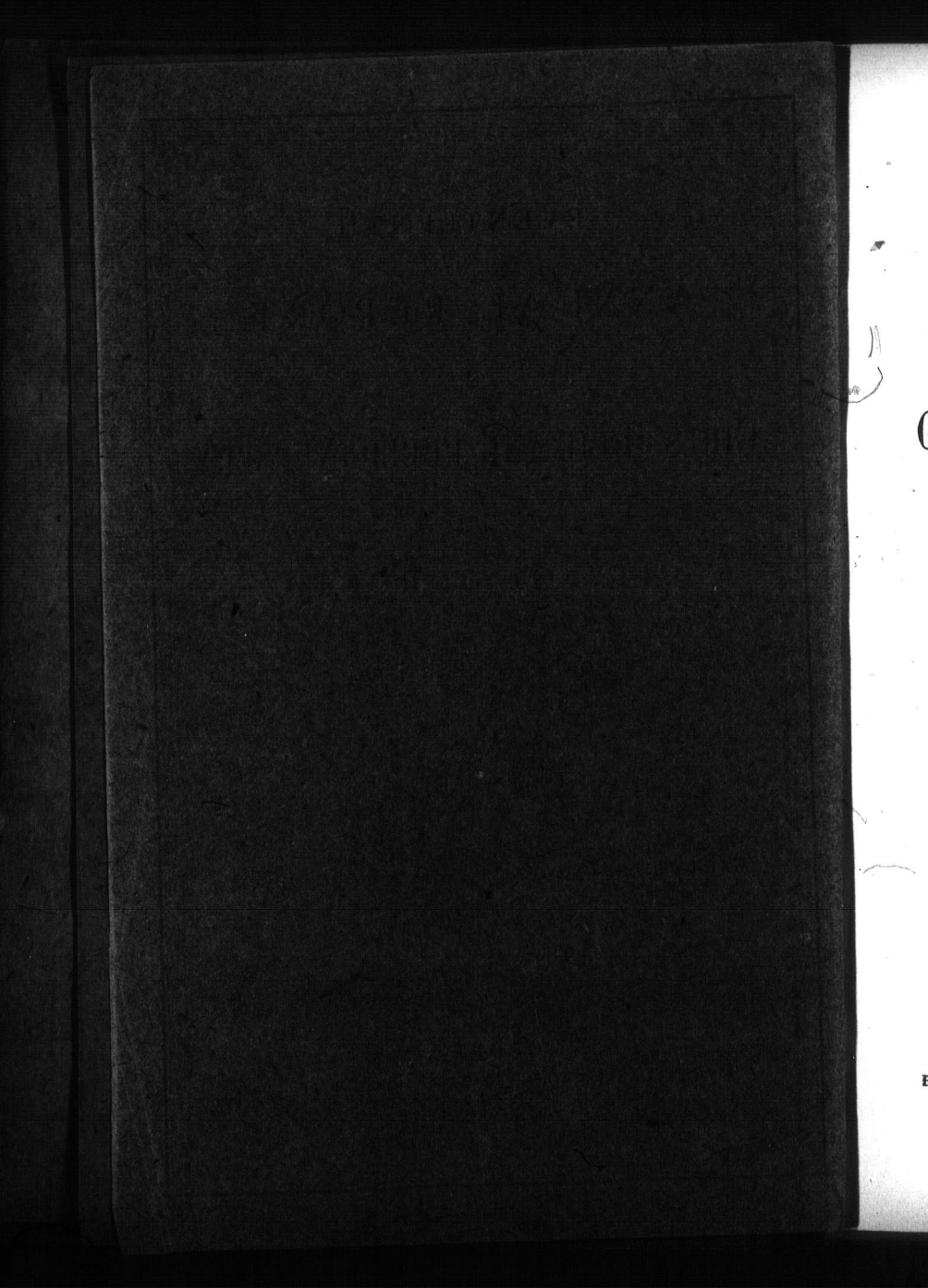

# GIRLS' HOME AND PUBLIC NURSERY.

## SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

"At the close of the year 1873, the Lady Managers of the Girls' Home have much pleasure in presenting the public, and their many friends, with a short-report of their work.

"The entire year has been but one more proof of the kind and watchful Providence which cares for the helpless and for the orphan. It will be difficult to do more than enumerate the numbers admitted into the Home, and the numbers placed out in respectable positions; and yet it is essential, if we would interest others in our work, that we should tell them some of its details, some of those little incidents which so cheer or discourage.

"The number in the Home at the close of the year was 84; 97 were in at the commencement; 63 have since been admitted, being a total of 180 who have been inmates during the year. Of these, 8 have been adopted, 4 have gone to service, 48 have been taken out by parents, 5 have gone to the Boys' Home, 4 died, and 3 ran away, being a total of 72 who have been removed from the institute during the year 1873. While the number in the Home now is not quite so great as last year, those actually benefitted are more numerous, there having been a larger proportion of temporary inmates during the last year than in any previous one. It may be interesting to know that these have been children of English immigrants—strangers in a foreign land; the Home has felt it both a duty and pleasure thus to give them a helping hand in making this new and sometimes difficult start in life. Indeed, two of the most interesting little ones now in the Home are of this class. Their mother died during the passage out, and their father, seemingly broken-hearted and discouraged, has wandered away, leaving Daisy and Frank to the entire care of those who would

care for them. Letters from friends across the ocean have recently proved them to be connected most respectably. The only alternative in this sad circumstance is to find new parents, who will be able to provide for them a happy home. Similar efforts in the past have been successful. We remember years ago a little waif who was brought in to be clothed, fed, and cared for. A worthless mother begged leave to see her occasionally, but eventually lost all interest. A lady who adopted her writes a few weeks since: 'I wish to tell you about Jinny; she is quite well and perfectly happy. She has a sweet disposition, and is all I can wish. Her sole companion is my sister's only son, Willie H., grandson of Mrs. H., the American authoress. I merely tell you this that you may know the different sphere of life in which poor little Jinny will live from one of degradation, through the efforts of your noble Institution. The Girls' Home, Toronto, will be ever dear to me. I often think when I kiss her good night (and "Susy," her doll, also) that if she should be taken from me it would be worse than death, but I hope you can assure me that I shall not be troubled in that way. I must beg your pardon for so long a letter, but if left to myself I should extend it to pages. The fact is, I love little children, and to feel that I have one that I can call my own seems pleasant. With my prayers and wishes for the poor little unfortunate children, I am most sincerely, E. A. P.' One more incident might be interesting. It is that of an outcast child brought to the Home about eight years ago. She at first went to a lady for adoption, but she becoming discouraged, transferred her to a friend, who promised to give her a fresh trial. They moved to San Francisco over a year ago. The blessing which has followed earnest Christian teaching in her new home speaks for itself in the following note:—'San Francisco, Nov. 29, 1873. Dear ladies, I do not feel quite equal yet to writing letters, but I should like you to know that I have taken the most important step of my life, given my heart to God. Having obeyed the command, Matt. vi. 33, I may confidently hope for God's blessing in all my future. You may be gratified to hear I like the climate and my home, and that one of my chief pleasures is going with mother to teach at the Chinese Mission. That God may bless all your efforts at the "Home" is the prayer of yours, gratefully, Eliza.' Her adopted mother says, 'It is with great pleasure I enclose the note from Eliza, because I am sure it is the *very best news* the ladies at the "Home" can receive of her. During the week of prayer held at the commencement of the year, we attended regularly, and to my

surprise and delight, Eliza was amongst the earnest enquirers \* \* She is now a believer. \* \* I need scarcely add how grateful I feel to God that so soon we should be "one" in the household of faith.' The Managers rejoice that thus, in one more instance, the promise has been realized — 'When my father and mother forsake me, the Lord will take me up.'

"Owing to the numbers supported in the 'Home,' together with the increased expense of living, the Managers, early in autumn, found themselves in debt. They were unexpectedly relieved, however, by friends whose kindness they have sincerely and deeply appreciated. We refer to the Society of Oddfellows, who presented them with the handsome sum of \$540, the proceeds of a concert given by them in aid of the Home. The lady managers beg once more to assure those gentlemen of the sincere gratitude with which this assistance was received. The managers also thank the public and many kind friends who, by their gifts and increased subscriptions, have proved continued confidence in their management. The Sunday School is still carried on successfully in the Home. The ladies are indebted to those who teach, and also to the Rev. Mr. Boddy and Rev. A. Baldwin, who instruct the children through the week. As in former years, Dr. Ross still remains the kind and active friend of the Home. Continued confidence is felt in the Matron, Mrs. Pearson, under whose care the children present a healthful and comfortable appearance. Annexed will be found the Treasurer's report. The special thanks of the Board are due to the Merchants' Bank for \$103.75, Volunteer Fund surplus; to Mr. Samuel Platt, for \$100; to the Philharmonic Society for \$152.50, proceeds of a concert; for \$60, a collection on the occasion of a sermon preached by Rev. H. H. Waters; to J. P. Clark, Esq., Paisley, for \$23.66; to Mr. Ruston, Georgetown, for \$10; to Mrs. Campbell, Brampton, and to Miss Rawlinson for special collections of \$26 and \$20 respectively. They also gratefully acknowledge the increased liberality of the City Council in a grant of \$500; and also \$320 from the Government. The editors of *The Mail, Globe, Leader* and *Sun* are thanked for printing done at various times free of charge. Kind acknowledgments are tendered to a few friends by whose liberality one of the Lady Managers was enabled to provide a bountiful Christmas dinner, it is almost needless to add heartily enjoyed by the children.

"In reviewing the joys and sorrows of the past year, the Managers desire to pay a tribute to the memory of one who was taken from their

midst in the prime of life, and who was one of their earliest and most earnest labourers. They are touched deeply with the thought that one is missed from their Board who was ever foremost in carrying out its every project—one to whose untiring energy the present prosperity of the Home is in no small measure indebted. We refer to Mrs. McMaster; but He who 'doeth all things well' called her from her labours here to her eternal rest above. And while this, the first call that death has made on this little band of workers, has left behind it sorrowing hearts, may a voice from the grave say to each, in tones most earnest, 'Work while it is yet day, for the night cometh.'

"The year is ended. One more picture, with its lights and shades, is added to the group. Acknowledging the Master's good hand through it all, we place it before our friends. But above all we pray it may not be unworthy the gaze of Him who has so graciously led and blessed the work completed.

## PHYSICIAN'S REPORT.

---

I have the honour to submit to the Lady Managers of the Girls' Home and Public Nursery, the following report for the year 1873 :—

At the beginning of the year the inmates of the Home were in good health, with the exception of a few of the younger children, who were in a very delicate condition and required the most careful nursing.

Early in the year a mild attack of whooping-cough occurred, and many of the children suffered from it ; but all recovered.

In March the Bigsby children, six in number, were admitted ; their health had been much impaired previously, and two of them subsequently died. One, named Daisy Bigsby, aged about three years, was attacked by inflammation of the lungs and pleura, and, after a short illness, died on the 12th of April ; and another, named Mary Bigsby, and aged eight months, suffered from diarrhœa and died on the 15th of April ; a third, named Ethal Bigsby, suffered from canker of the mouth, but subsequently recovered.

Edward Franklin, aged about two-and-a-half years, of a consumptive habit, who had been very delicate for a long time, died from marasmus on the 5th of May ; and Herbert Forbes, a very frail child, aged about fifteen months, gradually declined and died from consumption, on the 26th of June. These make a total of four deaths during the year.

The matron and some of the nurses suffered occasionally, during the early months, from intermittent fever, but enjoyed better health towards the close of the year ; and the children, with the exception of a few trivial complaints, have had very good health throughout the latter half of the year, and now present a very creditable appearance.

## CONSTITUTION.

---

This Institution shall be called the "Girls' Home and Public Nursery," and have for its object the rescue from vice of young girls, and the bestowal of careful attention to their religious, moral and temporal welfare; also the maintenance and support of children under the age of seven years.

The management shall be entrusted to a committee consisting of twenty-seven ladies chosen at the annual meeting, out of which shall be elected the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Directress, Treasurer and Secretary.

No alteration shall be made in this Constitution, except at the Annual Meeting, and notice of any proposed alteration must always be given to the 1st Directress at least one month previous to such annual meeting.

---

### RULES FOR THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

## GIRLS' HOME AND PUBLIC NURSERY.

---

Regular meetings of the Board of Managers shall be held on the first Tuesday of every month, at 11 a.m. Special meetings may be called by the Secretary, upon an order from the 1st Directress, or, in her absence, at the request of any three members.

All meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer (the regular forms being used on these occasions), and be opened as soon after the appointed hour as a quorum shall be present (which shall consist of five members, including one of the three Directresses) in the following order:—

1st. The Secretary shall read the minutes of the preceding meeting, which shall be signed; inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place, and read her general report of the condition of the Institution.

2nd. The Treasurer shall present her account of all moneys received and expended during the past month, to be audited and signed by the 1st Directress, or, in her absence, the 2nd or 3rd.

3rd. The 1st Directress, or, in her absence, the 2nd or 3rd, shall place all resolutions before the meeting, declare the decision to the Secretary, and if an equality of votes occur, give the casting one, in addition to her vote as member of Board.

As soon as the meeting is opened (when a quorum is formed) all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

Ladies not attending at the usual monthly meeting shall, previously to the same, notify their inability to attend to the Secretary; and except in cases of illness, or absence from the city, any lady allowing three of these meetings to pass without being present, shall have her name struck off the list of the managing committee.

The 1st Directress, or, in her absence, the 2nd or 3rd, shall preside at the monthly meetings; audit and sign the accounts presented to her by the Treasurer for that purpose; propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and take charge of all moneys belonging to the Institution as well as the children's fees, keeping accounts of the same. All accounts shall be brought by her before the meeting of the managers every month, to be signed by the 1st Directress, or in her absence, the 2nd or 3rd.

The Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence, keep account as far as practicable of all the children in the Institution—giving a general report thereof at the monthly meeting, at which she shall regularly attend, but never be called upon to preside, minute the proceedings, and take the names of the ladies present.

A Committee of seven shall meet every Tuesday morning at 11 o'clock, consisting of the 1st Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary, the two visitors of the previous week, and the two of the current week, when the said visiting ladies shall report their experience of the past. On these occasions three shall form a quorum.

The members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Secretary to visit the Home daily each week, ascertain from the Matron the behaviour of the children, as well as whatever may be requisite for them and for the house, and report the same at the regular weekly meetings. They shall also enter their names in the Visitors' Book. The 1st Directress, Treasurer and Secretary, shall not be of the number of the daily visitors.

Any manager may admit applicants up to the age of fourteen, with the doctor's certificate insuring them to be free of disease.

RULES AND REGULATIONS  
FOR THE MATRON AND CHILDREN OF THE  
GIRLS' HOME AND PUBLIC NURSERY.

---

I.

The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the children, as well as to conduct the household affairs generally, and also to instruct the elder ones from the age of seven to fourteen, in reading, sewing and writing.

II.

She shall be capable of admitting applicants with the doctor's certificates, subject always to the approval of the weekly committee.

III.

She shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each child, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

IV.

The children shall rise at 6 a. m. from 1st May to 31st October, and at 7 a. m. from 1st November to 30th April. The time for going to rest to be from 6 to 8 p. m.

V.

Meals to be at regular hours. Breakfast at 8 a. m. ; dinner at 12 ; tea at 5 p. m.. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder children.

VI.

All children of age to do so shall regularly attend Sunday School, and also Divine service once every Sunday in charge of the Matron ; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

VII.

The Matron shall devote two hours in the afternoon to teaching the elder children sewing—from half-past one to half-past three. The elder children shall also be taught for two hours in the morning (from ten to twelve) by a person engaged competent to teach them reading and writing. The younger children to attend for one hour in the morning, and one in the afternoon, or half the time.

## VIII.

All hours that are not taken up by instruction or meals shall be occupied by the children under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, nursing, or in play.

## IX.

Children shall be admitted into this Institution up to the age of fourteen, except in the summer months of June, July and August, when infants under twelve months cannot be taken in.

## X.

No child shall be admitted who is ill of contagious disease.

## XI.

The charge for each child of such parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case should occur. If more than one child of the same parent or friend gain admittance, a reduction shall be made as approved by the ladies of the weekly committee. The charge for each child admitted by the day, shall be—infants, 5d. ; children of two years of age, 3d.

## XII.

Parents or friends of the children shall be admitted to visit them any afternoon between the hours of 3 and 5 only.
