And there are very few who do not give a copper to the keeper of this old, old custom.

Another Christian custom—but this is a custom of religious ceremonial—is that of placing a lighted candle in every window on the night of Christmas eve, the idea being originally meant to show that if the holy family had come to that house they would have found a welcome, instead of the repulse of the householders of Bethlehem.

The most interesting as well as the oldest and still most cherished customs are those that have gathered round the "keens," and "funerals." The "keens" or "keens," so often mentioned in Irish legends, are now to be met with only in the west, where the soft plaintive voices seem to lead themselves unconsciously to the grave.
