

OTTAWA, Oct. 28. After the presentation of several re-ports of Election Committees, the order of the day was called and Sir Francis Hincks addressed the House on Mac-kenzie's amendment. Huntington charged him (Sir F.) with resigning his Imperial office, and taking office in the Canadian Government in hopes of making money out of the Pacific Kailway. 


