Sir Francis Hincks Replies to Huntigton - George and Glass Dearest Against the Government. James McDonald Moves an Amendment - John Young, the Publisher of Sir John's Private Letter, to be Postmaster General in the Next Government.

OTTAWA, Oct. 28. After the presentation of several reports of Election Committees, the order of the day was called, and Sir Francis Hincks addressed the House on Macdonald's amendment. Huntigton charged him (Sir F.) with resigning his Imperial office, and taking office in the Canadian Government in hopes of making money out of the Pacific Railway. This was untrue and impossible, for when he entered the Government, the prospect of union with British Columbia was dull and distant. After lengthy explanations of his own political position, Sir Francis said he never heard or read of any Prime Minister ever having been treated as Sir John.
