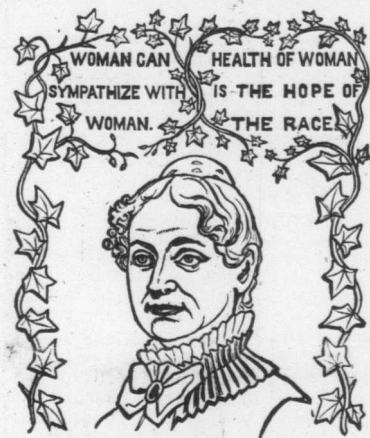

No. 1.—Trotting Race for a purse of \$100. Open to horses that have never beaten 3 m. 30 to first, \$30 to second, \$10 to third.

No. 2.—Trotting Race for a purse of \$100. Open to all horses that have never beaten 2 1/2 m. \$30 to first, \$10 to second, \$5 to third.

SECOND DAY—THURSDAY 26TH.

No. 3.—Trotting Race—For a Purse of \$50; Open to all horses owned in Northumberland County prior to October 1st, 1882. \$25 to first, \$10 to second, \$5 to third.

No. 4.—Running Race—For a Purse of \$30. Open to horses same as No. 3, but two in three. \$20 to first, \$10 to second.

No. 5.—Free for all Trotting Race—For a Purse of \$200. \$125 to first, \$50 to second, \$25 to third.
