A NEW CARBONARI.

CAIRO, May 28.—Complete anarchy prevails. Endeavors to form a Ministry have failed. Cherif Pasha has decuined to undertake the task because of the attitude of the Egyptian army. The proceedings at the meeting at Sultan Pasha's house yesterday afternoon were most uproarious, several officers brandishing their swords. The policy of the association is to keep Ireland in a state of discontent, turmoil and outrage. The Church seeks to promote peace and to repress outrage. The people find their priests reproving them and apparently siding with their foes. They rebel against the injunctions of the bishops and the clergy, especially those who denounce secret societies. It can all be summed up in one phrase—if Ireland were happy and contented she would remain Catholic, but as long as discontent can be kept up and secret associations for the redress of grievances or for the accomplishment of other purposes are apparently the cessary, while the Church denounces them and excommunicates their members, it is and becomes more and more ready to be the the checked of the transmitter.
