Dublin, July 6.—The riot at the Conservatory Workmen's Club Home here last evening was provoked by men in the club, who committed nearly all the breaches of order. A Catholic procession passed the Club House, which was crowded with men at the time. They attacked the procession with bottles and stones, and also with revolvers. The rioters then fired on the Catholics with shotguns and revolvers, and several of the rioters were killed. The police surrounded the house, getting control of the premises, and finally arrested the rioters. The rioters were taken to the police station and held in custody.
