The New Brunswick Legislature opened at Fredericton on the 14th inst. with the usual formalities.

In the British House of Commons, on the 15th inst., the Irish Land Tenure Bill was rejected by a vote of 231 to 173.

More than half the city of Cairo, Illinois, is unemployed, and business is paralyzed. The only means of communication being by boats and rafts.

Mrs. C. V. McGowan has sold the Osborne House property to Mr. P. P. Archibald, late of the Albion Hotel, Halifax, who will take possession early in May next.

The collection taken up in the Cathedral at high mass on St. Patrick Day, for the benefit of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, amounted to upwards of fifty cents.

The Paris Temps on the 14th inst. confirmed the announcement that a motion picture had been established between France and Great Britain regarding the Newfoundland fisheries.

Judge STEWART, of New Brunswick, has commenced his proceedings against the St. John Sun for an editorial charging him with unfairness, etc., in making up the Queen's County election list.

CHARLES JOHNSON, Ole Steffen and Mrs. Olsen and her son, Lynchere, were sentenced to imprisonment for life, and three days of each year to solitary confinement, at Leavenworth, Wis., on the 14th inst.

HENRY J. MCCORMACK was presented to the Palace Hotel, St. John, N. B., on the night of the 13th inst., with a Swiss girl who was charged with the murder of a woman who had been watching the world. He got a great reception.

MARY GALLAGHER, aged one hundred and two years, died at Cleveland, Ohio, on the 8th inst. She was born in Achill parish, County Mayo, Ireland, on Jan. 8, 1788, and came to America in 1862. She did not know a word of English.

The entire French ministry resigned on the 14th inst., because of the senator's severe action on the Minister of Finance, and a vote of confidence on the commercial treaty with Turkey. Defection will probably form a ministry.

PETITIONS have been filed against the return of Messrs. Matheson and MacLellan, Ardenhall and Montgomery, Bentley and Bell, Rogers and McMillan. Altogether 110,000 signatures have been filed, ten against Oppositonists and seven against Government supporters.

The New York agent of the Galton line of steamers, received a cablegram on the 14th inst., that the Arizona would not sail from Liverpool on account of the strike among the stevedores, who are all in sympathy with the Liverpool dockmen.

A Boston correspondent of the Halifax Chronicle, referring to the Cape of Good Hope mackerel, says:

The Cape mackerel mentioned were shipped here in casks and turned out first class. The fish were large and fat and sold after being packed, at 31¢.
