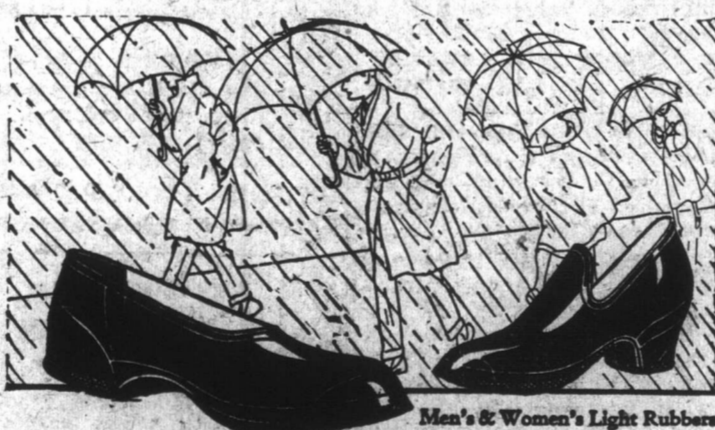

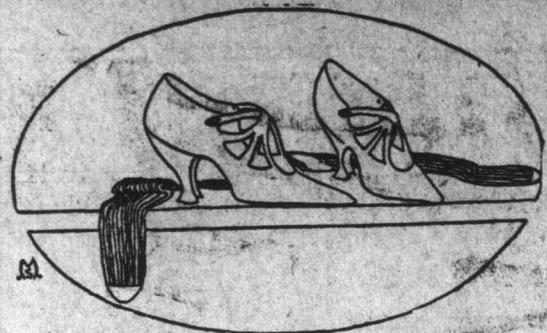

The Modern Juggernaut

For laughing eyes, compelling—wept, But earnest now, with sudden thrill, When a little form lay rigid and still Under the wheels.

Many Great Men Have Big Noses.

It is traditional that great men have big noses. Napoleon, it is said, used to pick his generals by their noses. To ascertain if a big nose is really an indication of superior mental powers Prof. Frederick Adams Woods of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology has for 20 years been collecting portraits of men who have in some way or other distinguished themselves. The results of his investigations he now publishes in the Journal of Heredity.

Terrified by An Eclipse.

After the death of the Regent of the Scots—Sir Andrew Moray—Robert the Steward was appointed sole governor and his first act was to send the Knight of Liddesdale to the King of France for help against the English; and then, about the end of April, 1339, he laid siege to Perth. The siege had lasted ten weeks, and the Scots were about to give it up, when five French ships of war, with the Knight of Liddesdale—who had executed his commission with well-timed success—appeared in the Tay. The siege then proceeded with renewed vigour, and during its progress there occurred a startling incident. In the midst of the military operations on July 7, and soon after noon, the sun was eclipsed; for a short-time there was nearly total darkness, and the eclipses lasted on the whole for nearly two hours and a half, during which the soldiers of both armies forgot their strife, and gazed in terror into the sky. But the leader of the besiegers—Sir William Bullock, who had been Balliol's Chancellor and had deserted his master—unintimidated by what was thought to be a sign of divine death, redoub-

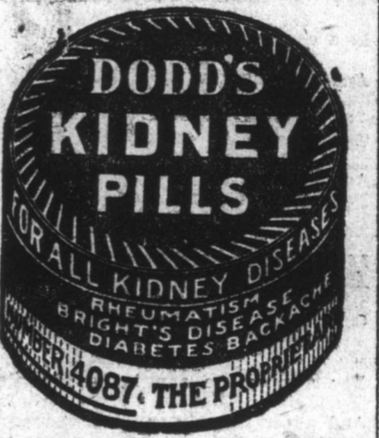
