For a child from three to six years old from half a teaspoonful to a teaspoonful, and for one to two teaspoonfuls, and children above twelve about the same dose should be weakened in a little water when given to children, and adults take water after the dose.

L'EMPLOI.—*Pour les adultes:*—Prendre deux cuillerées à café trois fois après les repas, en augmentant la dose jusqu'à une cuillerée à bouche par jour. Continuer cette dernière quantité jusqu'à ce que la guérison
