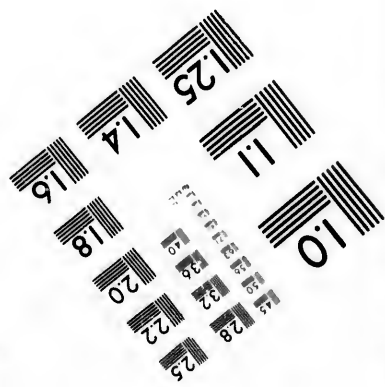
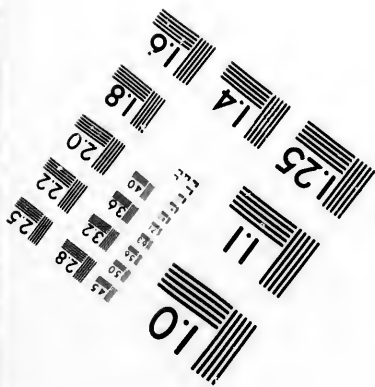
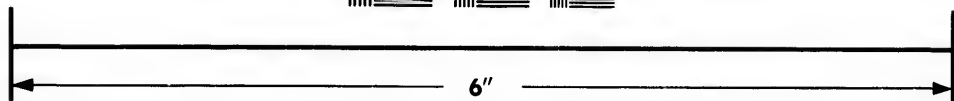
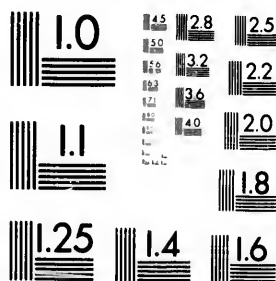


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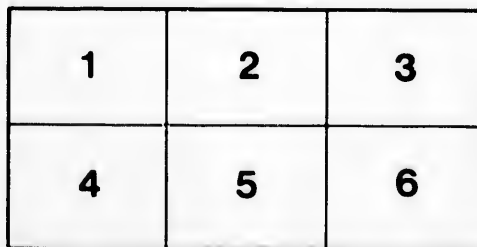
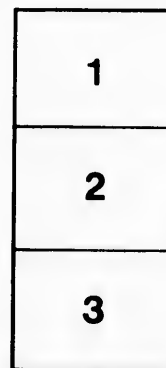
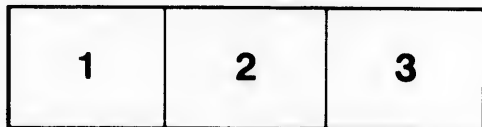
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Progress and Prosperity

A Convert to the Government.

The following letter was written to Mr. Charles Semlin, leader of the Opposition, by J. H. Falconer. As Mr. Semlin would not deal with Falconer in any way, that mercenary individual immediately went over to the government and is now one of its loudest-mouthed supporters:

Midway, June 28th, 1897.

I do not expect to return to Victoria until November, and will be in British Columbia all the time. The battle is yours if this matter is not delayed. Have a meeting of your friends, Sword and others; guarantee a limited salary, and I will pull you through as sure as the sun shines.

I will not dwell upon this matter any further, as I know you are of the same opinion as I am, that organization is absolutely necessary.

If you would send me instructions as well to collect for campaign purposes I feel satisfied it can be done.

I have organized strong courts of I. O. Foresters in Marcus, Grand Forks, Greenwood, Carson, and now at Midway, and have been tendered banquets galore.

My address after Bossburg for eight days will be Northport, Wash., then Ymlr, B. C., then Nelson, Rossland, etc., etc. etc.
