**TO SHOOT GOALS IN NETS.**

Proposed Amendment to the Lacrosse Rules  
 of Play—C. L. A. Council  
 in Session.

The council of the Canadian Lacrosse As-  
 sociation met last night at the Rosina  
 House, with President J. J. Craig, Dan  
 Rose, J. D. Baillie, W. H. Hall and Secre-  
 tary W. S. A. Hartley present. Several  
 copies of motions were handed in, the  
 principal of which is to provide for the use  
 of a goal net, the same as in Association foot-  
 ball and lacrosse in England, and which  
 would do away with all disputes in re-  
 gard to goals scored. Another was an amend-  
 ment to make all members of clubs perma-  
 nent residents of the city, town or village  
 in which the club they represent has its  
 headquarters.

All notices of amendments to the consti-  
 tution must be filed with the secretary be-  
 fore March 25, and clubs having any com-  
 plaints to lay against the association are  
 requested to lodge them within the next  
 two weeks, as they may be considered at  
 the next council meeting to be held within  
 that time.

Greatest Number in the History of the

Secretary Fraser's racing game goes mer-



THE PART CANADA PLAYS IN IMPERIAL DEFENCE.

Col. G. T. Denison Deplores the Smallness of Our Contribution. Mr Charles Tupper and Principal Grant, However, Think We Have Done Our Duty Fairly Well and the Meeting Supported That Idea—Mr. Tarte is Truly Loyal—Resolutions Passed.

Ottawa, March 11.—(Special.)—The annual meeting of the British Empire League in Canada was held yesterday in one of the committee rooms of the House of Commons. Lieut-Col. G. T. Denison, President, occupied the chair.

Among those present were Sir Charles Tupper, Sir Mackenzie Bowell, Sir Louis Davies, Sir Sandford Fleming, Mr. Tarte, William Mulock, Hon. Charles Fitzpatrick, R. W. Shannon, Rev. Principal Grant, Mr. Thomas Mulock, Sir Charles Hibbert, Tupper, besides many members of the Senate and House of Commons.

Hon. Mr. Tarte seconded the motion for the adoption of the report. He recalled the raising in 1888, when he joined the league, but he had stood by his guns, and he would assure the league members that now the part of British rule was just as strong in Quebec as in Ontario.

Canadian Naval Reserve. Sir Charles Tupper moved a resolution: "That in the opinion of the league it is important to take immediate steps to establish a system in Canada of training men for the Royal Naval Reserve, in order to qualify our sailors for manning our different steamship lines, and thus help the Empire in case of war."

Waited on the Premier. In accordance with the resolution passed by the British Empire League a committee of the league, composed of Sir Sandford Fleming, Mr. G. T. Denison, Mr. C. G. T. Denison, waited upon Sir Wilfrid Laurier this afternoon to lay before him the question of the Pacific cable between Canada and Australasia.

LESSON OF ONTARIO ELECTIONS.

Le Revolt of Montreal Calls it a Formidable Rebuff to the Liberals—Foster to Sir Wilfrid.

Montreal, March 11.—(Special.)—"A Severe Lesson" is the heading of an article in Le Revolt, treating the result of the Ontario elections. "The lesson given by Ontario," it begins, "is one of those formidable rebuffs which either times save a party by bringing its leaders to their senses, or precipitate its ruin. We may pretend to be deaf and blind to the meaning of the result, yet such a reverse should be heard, its significance understood, and its consequences judged. For a long time past the true Liberals have been saying: 'Take care what you are about. Their voice, however, was lost in the joyous clamors of a banquet which people suppose would last till the second deluge, or in the noise of flattery kept up around Ministers by jobbers and traitors. We were blamed for sounding the alarm when those gentlemen asked us to forget without remorse their most sacred promises to the party and to the country."

"The Government, deceived by Joseph Elmer, gave to certain victories, by far too dearly bought, an erroneous importance or a value that did not exist. Therefore Ontario, the Gibraltar of Liberalism, the province that had never changed, whose counties had been ingeniously carved, Ontario has virtually gone over to the Conservative party, in order to hold on to power the heels of the Darte clan, and resorting to the most desperate and shameful expedients. They will open holes in order to plug them up. They are cajoling the one independent member elected, and are down on their knees burning myrrah and incense before the present incumbent Patron of Industry. But there is more, as everything indicates that Manitoba is about ready to give a like dancing to the prevaricators at Ottawa. Really things are moving more rapidly than we supposed. Sir Wilfrid Laurier had thrown the weight of his prestige and his speech into the battle that was just being fought, and what has been the result? In Ottawa even one Liberal candidate is beaten, and the only one escapes by a narrow majority, and there is no doubt that if they should open the Federal seat by sending Mr. Belcourt to Russell, the Laurier Government will be defeated in the Capital. Now, what does all this mean? Simply that the true Liberals are doing what our Lord threatened to do when He said: 'Those who deny me I will deny.' The Laurier Cabinet, badly advised by intruders and their satellites, has ignored the party and the country. Therefore are in accord with Ontario in declaring that the Laurier Government has ignored the party and the country. As to the statement that it was only a provincial election, let us look into what has taken place since Ontario has given her verdict. We are giving ourselves trouble to repair the loss? Is it the Liberal leader or his lieutenants? It is Mr. Tarte, Mr. Edwards and Mr. Belcourt, and others of the same class, for they well know that it was the Laurier Government that suffered."

The article concludes by attributing these losses to the Drummond, the Yukon, the "business is business" principles and the wretched administration of the public trust.

TORONTO POULTRY FANCIERS.

Efforts to Induce the American Association to Hold its Annual Show in Toronto.

The regular monthly meeting of the Toronto Poultry Association Thursday night in Temperance Hall was not only largely attended, but was very interesting and instructive.

The President of the Ontario Poultry Association, Dr. Bell, in the course of his remarks concerning next year's exhibition—the 25th of the association—Toronto, said that an endeavor was being made with some prospects of success, to get the American Poultry Association to hold its annual meeting here at that time. This will be in the second or third week in January. "Billy" McNeil of London began working at the matter at the Boston show, and assurances seem to be all right.

The monthly show of birds comprised some nice Cochins, Langshans and Leghorns, and the discussion of the work of the judges afterwards was very profitable. It is safe to say that the standard will be more closely studied than ever.
