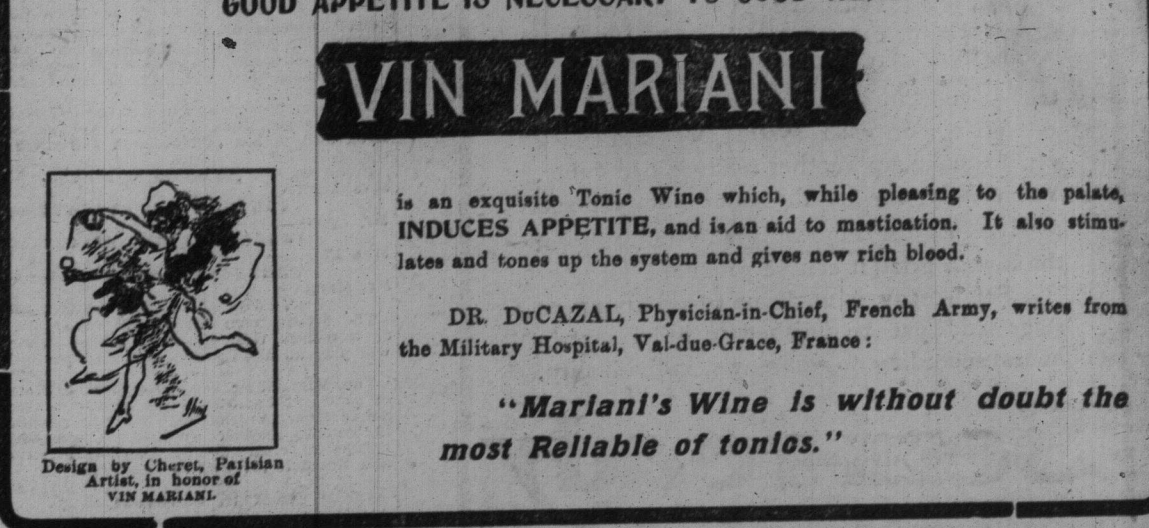

GREAT DAY AT THE JUNCTION LAYING OF THE CORNER STONE

Arch. Campbell, M.P., Officiated and Was Presented With an Address by the Mayor.

The corner stone of the new postoffice and customs building, at the corner of Keele and Dundas-streets, Toronto Junction, was well and truly laid by Archibald Campbell, M.P., in the presence of about 2000 people on Saturday afternoon.

The foundation had been covered with boards, and upon them were placed rows of seats for the very large number of ladies and interested spectators. The Mayor's chair and chairs for the Council were placed upon a smaller platform and were used by the speakers of the day.

Chisholm Grateful. In opening the proceedings, Mayor Chisholm said that he was sure all felt obliged and grateful to be there to mark the laying of the new postoffice and customs building. He felt grateful to the Dominion government in recognizing the fact that Toronto Junction had reached that stage in its progress where a public building, such as the one now being built, had become a public necessity. He was glad that every feeling would be laid aside and that an occasion like this could be made a happy one.

After calling on Rev. George C. Pidgeon to deliver an invocation, Mayor Chisholm called upon Archibald Campbell, M.P., to lay the corner stone, and in so doing presented him with a handsome silver trowel and read the following address: To Archibald Campbell, M.P.: On behalf of the Town Council and your fellow-citizens, who have assembled here to celebrate the completion of the foundation on which the new postoffice and customs house is to be raised, we desire to express our appreciation of you as a public-spirited citizen who has done much to advance the material interests of the town of which we are all so proud.

As proprietor of an important industry—one of the sources of the town's prosperity—your efforts have been a powerful stimulus to our commerce during the years that you have lived in our midst. The debt of gratitude which we especially desire to acknowledge is, however, for the successful efforts you have put forth in our behalf in connection with the building of the new postoffice and customs house, and which, we trust, will stand for generations to come as a great public utility, an ornament to the town, and a monument to the redemption of your promise to have it built. Under the auspices of the town of which you should well and truly be the benefactor, it is our hope that you will stand for generations to come as a great public utility, an ornament to the town, and a monument to the redemption of your promise to have it built.

Mr. Campbell's Speech. Mr. Campbell said he hardly knew how to express thanks, not only for the beautiful address, but for the kind words with which it was accompanied. LAW RESPECTING VACANCY FULFILLED BY GOVERNMENT

Act Works Automatically, But an Exception is Made in Case of North Renfrew.

Chapter 12 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario is explicit in providing for the election of a member to the legislative assembly to fill the vacancy caused by the death of a member. J. W. Munro, who was elected for the riding of North Renfrew by a majority of nearly 500 on May 23, 1902, died on May 30, causing a vacancy in the constituency. The legislature met on March 10 of this year, and the constituency is still vacant. Here is what Section 36 and 37 of the act say:

Act Covering Vacancies.
