ENCOURAGING REPORT OF F. N. BURT COMPANY

Was Best Ever Presented to a Meeting of the Shareholders. OUTLOOK FAVORABLE With One Exception, Net Profits Exceeded Those of Previous Years.

The best report ever received was that presented to the shareholders at the annual meeting of the F. N. Burt Company, Limited, held yesterday in the board room of the company, West King street.

Mr. J. Moore, the president, in moving the adoption of the report and financial statement, spoke at length on the success of the company during the year 1915, every year's net profit had exceeded those of the previous year.

From the profits shown from the last half of the year, Mr. Moore said, some \$1,000,000 was gained, the outlook for the present year, with conditions all favorable, the sales for the last three months were 40 per cent ahead of those of the previous corresponding months.

ONTARIO FIRST IN GOLD PRODUCTION

Province Produced Forty-Four Per Cent of Total for All Canada. The preliminary report on the mineral production of Canada for the year 1915 has just been issued by the department of mines, Ottawa.

It shows that Ontario has now become the largest gold-producing province in Canada, the production in 1915 from fifteen properties being reported as \$3,385,956, or 44 per cent of the total production in Canada as against a production in 1914 of \$5,545,509, an increase of \$2,841,447, or 51 per cent.

The output in British Columbia was \$5,283,382, including \$755,000 from placer workings. The Yukon yielded \$4,155,721, a decrease of \$369,553 from 1914. The total gold for all Canada is given as \$18,936,971. The total silver, estimated at 49,684 cents per ounce, was \$1,028,397.

There has been an increased production in all metals with the exception of tin, the total value of the metallic production in 1915 was \$77,046,082, as compared with \$59,386,519 in 1914, and \$66,361,351 in 1913. The production of tin, copper and zinc is the highest that has been recorded in these metals.

The total metallic and non-metallic minerals of all Canada are put at \$138,213,750. Of this Ontario contributed \$41,800,000, or 44.5 per cent, showing an increase over 1914 of \$8,765,501, or 15.5 per cent.

LARGE CANADIAN LOAN IN HANDS OF MORGAN

Syndicate of United States Underwriters Will Probably Be Formed Soon. NEGOTIATIONS ARE ON Amount of Issue May Be Seventy-Five Million Dollars.

NEW YORK, March 16.—A group of American bankers, headed by J. P. Morgan and Company, are negotiating with the Canadian Government for the flotation of a new Canadian loan, according to a statement issued by the Morgan firm today.

WORKMEN TO CUT DOWN AMOUNT OF INSURANCE

Majority of Members Favor Plan to Readjust All Beneficiary Certificates. MAKE THE BASIS SOUND J. Lockie Wilson is Elected Grand Master Workman for This Year.

By a majority of 15,475, or more than nine-tenths of the vote cast, members of the Ancient Order of United Workmen have endorsed a private bill which is to be introduced in the legislature in a few days, providing for an adjustment of the beneficiary certificates of membership in the order, so as to place the order on a sound financial and actuarial basis.

Announcement of this action was made by J. Lockie Wilson, grand master workman, at the conclusion of the A.O.U.W. convention, held in Toronto during the past two days. The plan is to readjust the amounts of insurance to be carried by the members. For instance, a member carrying a thousand dollar policy, and paying premiums on that amount, will continue to pay the same amount, but his insurance will be reduced to seven or eight hundred dollars, according to the amount of his premium. It is hoped in this way to reduce to seven or eight hundred dollars the amount of insurance in the funds of the order, and several million dollars are expected to be paid out in fraternal insurance since the order was founded.

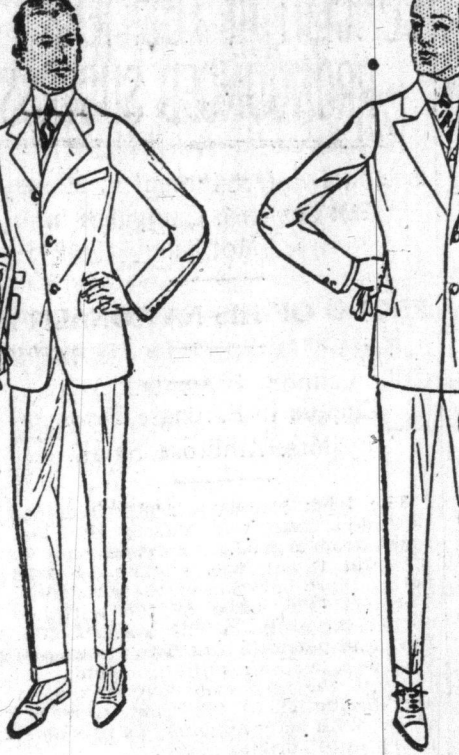

CONDENM FINDINGS OF PROVINCIAL AUDITOR

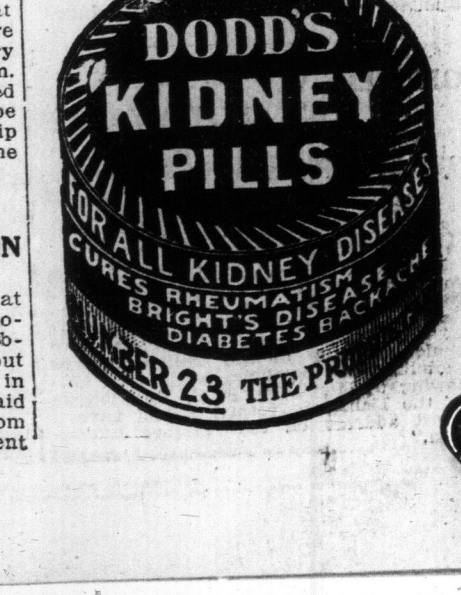

The official pointed out that "the hydro accounts had gone before the public accounts committee every year and no fault was found with them. Every cent spent by us is regulated and checked over and no work can be done without the issue of a work slip which must go through the hands of the supervisor of the work."

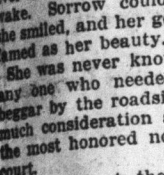

What Insomnia Really Is and How It May Be Cured

THERE is no one cause of insomnia, and once you discover the cause that has bothered you the chances are that particular one will never operate again. Insomnia is no more a malady in itself than is a fever, but it is a cross-roads sign or a symbol of many underlying disorders.

It is not always a simple matter, though the real cause of sleeplessness be found, immediately to remove it and effect a cure of this lamentable condition.

Sources of Insomnia. To advise exercises and athletics as the sweet restorer of sleep, irrespective of the individual's habits or occupation, is often to invite disaster and confusion.

Methods of Relief. One of the pitfalls of the unwary person is to thrash over and rehearse in his mind the hopes, irritations, successes and failures, events and disappointments of the day.

Answers to Health Questions. G. K.-Q. What do you recommend to stop hair from falling, and to increase its growth? My hair is very dry. I am 27 years of age.

A. Apply with friction to the scalp each night and morning the following: Fluid extract of pilocarpine, 1 dr. Tincture of cantharides, 1/2 dr. Tincture of opium, 1/2 dr. Rose water, 1 oz. Distilled water, 1/2 oz.

M. A.-Q. What do you advise for a young lady troubled with gas of the stomach? I have indigestion and sleeplessness.

A. 1. Take 7 grains of oxide of magnesium about half an hour before meals, and one-half dozen bone charcoal tablets about half an hour after meals. 2. Take a glassful of warm water, as hot as you can stand it, into which has been dissolved a little soda, as soon as these spells come over you.

HELEN R.-Q. Will you please tell me what to use to stop hair from growing on my chin? It is very noticeable.

A. Use the following, about twice a week: Calcium sulphate, two parts; zinc oxide, one part; starch, one part. Make a paste with water and apply to the hair. Let this remain about five minutes and then wipe off gently with a soft cloth.

JOHN M. M.-Q. Please tell me what to do for marks left from pimples.

A.-Take a facic acid bacilli tablet after each meal. Never use hot water or soap on the face, but peroxide and glycerine, one teaspoonful of each to a pint of water, as a wash. A sulphur and peroxide lotion may be kept on the face at night.

MANY THANKS. Q-I am troubled with excessive kidney fluid. Will you be so kind as to offer some suggestion?

A.-Take eight drops of tincture of belladonna in water every four hours. Take this for one week, stop a week and continue the following week. Also stop in at the urological department of the nearest hospital for an examination.

S. D. Q-I am troubled with constipation. What will you advise me to do for this?

A.-Take a tablespoonful of milk of magnesia about half an hour before meals and a wineglassful of olive oil one-half an hour after meals with one-half dozen bone charcoal tablets. Eat lots of nourishing foods, green vegetables, cereals, fresh fruits and meats, plenty of water. Take active exercise in the open air daily and enjoy all the sunlight and fresh air you possibly can.
