

REPORT.

In placing the Annual Report of the affairs of the Toronto House of Industry before the subscribers and the public, the managers of that charity feel pleasure in being able to state that, although the expenses of the Institution have greatly increased—from causes which must be apparent to all, they, at the same time, are enabled to shew an enlarged increase in the general receipts, and, under all the circumstances, a favourable state of the finances.

The same course has been adopted this year as in 1855, in taking up the annual subscriptions, Committees having been appointed from the Board for the different Wards; and although some of those Committees have not yet completed their collections for 1856, still enough has been returned to shew with what liberality the citizens of Toronto respond to this annual call.

Through the kindness of the Lord Bishop of Toronto, the sum of £161 9s. 10d., Cy., was handed to the Treasurer of this Institution in November last, being a portion of the fund raised in

1832 and 1834, for the relief of the widows and orphans of those who died, in destitute circumstances, of cholera, in those years.

The amount of mortgage left to this charity by the late Dr. Burnside, (for £1,000 Cy.,) and to which reference was made in our two former Annual Reports, has not yet been realized; but the managers have now good reason to hope that this amount, together with the accrued interest thereon, will be received, and the principal safely invested during the ensuing year (1857), by which an increased income will be secured for the charity.

During the past year the Corporation of the City of Toronto have purchased a tract of land, near the city, to be converted into an Industrial Farm, &c., which, in the opinion of this Board, is an Institution that, if well conducted, must be of incalculable benefit to the city, not only as a place where offenders (particularly juveniles) may be classified and reformed, while punished, but also where many of the infirm and maimed might be made to assist, in some way, to their own support. To this source the managers of the House of Industry trust they may shortly look for some relief to the already greatly over-crowded state of that Institution, as will be seen from the report of the Superintendent, submitted herewith. The average number of inmates during the year 1856, has been 108, while many of those were

invalids, suffering from various diseases, but inadmissible to the General Hospital, because declared incurable.

As in former years, the managers have succeeded in raising, by a subscription, separate from that for general purposes, sufficient to purchase 200 cords of wood, which is now being distributed by the Weekly Committees of the House of Industry.

Herewith they beg to submit a detailed statement of the Treasurer's accounts for the past year, (1856,) duly audited; and also the Superintendent's Report of the numbers relieved, and the amount of relief afforded during the year to outdoor poor, &c.

All which is respectfully submitted.
