### EVIDENCE IN CONNECTION WITH THE DEATH OF EDMUND LEGER

The inquest into the death of Edmund Leger, who died from injuries received on board the steamer Montreal, was begun by Coroner Berryman last night. David O'Connell, winchman on the steamer, said that the fatality was purely accidental. The sling of deals became caught in a guy rope and Leger, in doing his duty and loosening the sling, was swept across the deck. Martin B. Wilcox, foreman on the steamer on the night of the accident, said that it was a common thing for 'longshoremen to work longer hours than the resolution, which was adopted by laboring men, called for. He said the lighting on the ship was perfect on the night in question. The inquest was adjourned until next Wednesday night at 7.30 o'clock.
