IMPROVEMENTS IN SCREW-PROPELLING, &c.

We have been furnished with the following account of the recent improvements in propelling and steering vessels, by Mr. William Howland, of the Portsmouth Dock Yard, lately of the School of Naval Architecture, the specification of which has just been entered, and which we doubt not will be regarded with the greatest interest by all who are concerned in the nautical art.

The surface of the rudder may be the same as the inner surface of the counter rudder, although a less surface would be sufficient. A large and very strong rudder blade is fixed at the upper part of the rudder with a large hole, through which a shaft is passed, and which is secured to the rudder by a screw.

The other improvement in propelling relates to the screw propeller, and is especially important in the screw propelled vessels, because it enables the screw to be worked in a more efficient manner.
