



INTRODUCTORY



T is the dream of every man to have a home of his own. If he is a city dweller, then this yearning for obvious reasons turns towards the country districts, where there is freedom of air and space, yard and garden, and elbow room for the exercise which is the builder of health and stimulator of physical strength. Even, if he has a home in the city, there is a season when the call to the land rings in his cars with tempting insistency.

Five, cars ago, there were very few people who resided along the north shore of Lake Ontario, between Hamilton and Toronto, outside of those who had settled or been pioneers in the ordinary way. It remained for such men as the Messrs. Osler, Eaton, Ryrie, Gooderham, Cox, Stone, Sir Edmund Walker, etc., to discover the many advantages of this shore. These were men who had travelled the world over, and for that reason could appreciate a good thing close at home. During the past three years, there have been fully five hundred families who have taken up either their summer residence or permanent residence along the lake shore. between Toronto and Hamilton, and the whole distance of 35 r ³¹ es is now being built up with charming villas, and with thriving towns and villages. The conditions and advantages of the Lake Shore as portrayed herewith, is not merely that of a single ideal community, but an existing, semi-rural abiding place, which is in close proximity to many of the leading Cities and Towns, situated in the very garden of Canada. 
