## M A T

The Matron shall be responsible for all articles belonging also for all articles belonging to the patients delivered over to her, shall keep in see that all the wards, &c. are regularly scoured and bleansed, the patients' apparel dressed and served at regular stated periods, in fine, she shall generally attend to and ordinary female servants, under the directions of the Commissioners and Matron before stated, with respect to male keepers and ordinary servants ;—she shall not be under her observation.

## H E A D N

The Head Nurse shall be hired by the Commissioners shall be responsible for the cleanliness and good order of the female wards, and instructions relative to them are properly enforced, that their diet is properly served, &c. of the female wards, and all articles committed by the Matron into her charge shall, when necessary, apply to the Steward for assistance in controlling disorders from the Medical Superintendent ;—she shall see that the female patients are reported to the Visitor any misconduct on the part of the female keepers who are

## P O R T

The Porter shall be subject to the instructions of the Steward, to open the door, and see that nothing belonging to the Institution is carried out, and that no articles be taken by their friends, or otherwise, without permission ;—he shall take care that no person be permitted to inspect the Institution without permission from the Medical Superintendent.

## K E E P

The Keepers shall be persons of good character, humble, and obedient, who shall obey the instructions delivered to them by the Medical Superintendent, Steward, and Matron, and dress them ;—they shall administer the medicines prescribed, and they shall be civil and respectful to the Steward, Matron, and Head Nurse, and

## A D M I S S I O N O

No Patient shall be admitted into the Temporary Lunatic Asylum. Idiots are inadmissible. The Medical Superintendent shall be the exclusive authority to receive patients, and shall be deemed pauper if unable to pay one dollar per week for their maintenance, shall be deemed pauper if a certificate shall be lodged with the Commissioners, signed by a Clergyman and a Justice of the Peace, who resides, stating that, from the evidence they have in their possession, they are of sound mind, and of amount of £25, and that his or her disease has not exceeded the period of two years, and that he or she has advanced the necessary funds. The several Districts shall be deemed liable for the expenses of re-conveying him or her back again to their friends, when discharged, if they are unable to pay. No advance may be.

Persons not admitted as Paupers will be expected to contribute to the funds of the Institution to defray their expenses when in the Institution. No pay-patient shall be admitted without an advance for that period.

## ADMISSION.

belonging to the Institution committed into her charge, and keep inventories of the same;—she shall attend to the cleanliness of the Institution, and the patients' apparel in good order and clean; she shall see that the several meals are properly prepared and served to all matters appertaining to house-keeping;—she shall hire the female keepers and the Medical Superintendent, but shall have no power to dismiss them, excepting as the Visitor shall note down daily and report to the Visitor any disorderly conduct which may come to her knowledge.

## HEAD NURSE.

Head Nurse, in conjunction with the Medical Superintendent; she shall attend to the cleanliness of the female patients;—she shall see that the medical attendants are properly served at regular periods, as prescribed;—she shall be responsible for the furniture and effects committed to her charge for the use of the patients, and keep an inventory of the same;—she shall attend to the disorderly patients; shall not absent herself from the Institution, except with permission of the Medical Superintendent, who are usefully and exclusively employed for the benefit of the Institution, and shall be subject to her directions.

## DOCTOR.

the Medical Superintendent and Steward; he shall keep the Institution in good order, and that neither spirits or any other article whatsoever be brought in to the patients, and that no person has access to the patients without authority, and that no person be admitted to the Institution, except by the Medical Superintendent, or in company with a Commissioner.

## KEEPERS.

the keepers, humane, &c.; they shall sleep in their several wards, shall be appointed by the Medical Superintendent, or Head Nurse, as case may be;—they shall wash and cleanse the patients, and perform the necessary dressings, at the times and in the manner directed;—they shall be paid by the Medical Superintendent, and generally conduct themselves in an unexceptionable manner.

## ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Persons who are admitted to the Lunatic Asylum whose case shall be deemed incurable.—The Medical Superintendent shall be the exclusive judge of those persons who are fit objects for admission. Persons who are paupers, and admitted as such. Prior to the admission of a Pauper Lunatic, a Justice of the Peace, and two Magistrates, from the immediate neighbourhood where such Lunatic resides, shall be of opinion that the said Lunatic (if an adult) does not possess property to the value of £100; if a minor, that his or her parents, or guardians, are unable to defray the expenses of twelve months; if a minor, that his or her parents, or guardians, are unable to defray the expenses for all expenses incurred in conveying a Pauper Lunatic to the Asylum, also the expenses of the Lunatic, while charged, cured, relieved, or incurable, together with the funeral expenses, as the case may require.

The Medical Superintendent shall receive from the Commissioners such sums of money as the Commissioners may deem adequate for the maintenance of the Institution, and all payments must be made in
