

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but set sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence in each efthree years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Preemption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, as certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and caltivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at teast S0 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-ection alongside his homestead. Price 53.00

ection alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate \$0 acres and srect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrabby ar steny land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

CANADIAN BLACK AST

It is understood that the Dominion Government is considering the enforcement of a black list of United States firms, following the example of Great Britain and Australia. Under this plan citizens are forbidden to trade with certain concerns under Teutonic control, or in which German capital is largely in-

There was a big hulabaloo in the United States when this action was first announced by John Bull, and the Senate took action, placing in the hands of the President, the power to refuse clearance papers to vessels of countries exercising such discrimination, but nothing has since

been heard of it. In a recent speech Lord Robert Cecil. Great Britain's Minister of War, Trade, stated most clearly that it was altogether unlikely that any change would be made. During the course of an interview, he said, and

his words are worth repeating:-"The ideas expressed by some of your newspapers that Great Britain is adopting a deliberate policy with which to injure United States trade is the purest moonshine, since out-side of our Dominions our trade with the United States is the most important. Of course, natural trade rivalry exists, but no responsible states-man in this country would dream of proposing an insane measure designed to injure United States commerce. "Any impression that the blacklist is merely an entering wedge for a trade warfare after the war may be dismissed at once. I assure you the blacklist is purely a war meas-

ure, and I cannot insist too strongly that the government is taking every precaution to guarantee its enforcement so as to cause as little hard-

ship as possible to innocent traders.
"We believe our trade measures are proving efficacious, although it is difficult to give any figures indi-cating the extent of the harm done to our enemies, but I might point out that the mark is still declining in value.

Germany, prior to hostilities, had built up a huge commercial war machine, fully equal to that of the army. It is badly shattered now. The British fleet has seen to it that her commodities cannot cross the sea trade channels, and the boycott 's becoming each day more and more complete.



Roumanians are Pursued

Koumanians

By Courier Leased Wire. Berlin, Oct. 11., via London, 4.16 h.m.—Pursuit of the second Roumanian army, beaten by the Austro-Germans at Kronstadt, in Transylvania, continues, according to the German official statement, issued today. ********************************* HOW TO KEEP WELL

BY JOHN W. S. McCULLOUGH, M.D., D.P.H., CHIEF OFFICER OF THE PROVINCIAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

~~~~~~<del>~~~~~~~~~~~</del> A NEW SEWAGE TREATMENT.

T THE LAST MEETING of the Health Officers' Association Mr. T. Chalkley Hatton, Engineer to the Sewerage Commission of Milwaukee, described a new treatment of sewage by means of activated sludge which bids fair to outrival the methods of sewage treatment in present use. The method, first outlined by English treatment in present use. sewage experts, consists in treating sewage with old sludge (the solids of sewage) rich in bacteria—about 21,000,000 to the cubic centimetre. The mixture while held in tanks has air in fine bubbles forced through it. This process is continued from two to four hours; the sewage is run into tanks

where it mixes with the activated sludge. In Milwaukee, where the process has been carried on extensively in an experimental way by Mr. Hatton, the proportion of activated sludge used is 20 per cent. and 0.437 cubic feet of air to each gallon of sewage is pumped through the mixture. About 95 per cent. of the purification is accomplished in the first hour. The sewage then flows into another tank and the sludge sedimented out. The sewage liquid from which 95 per cent. of the bacteria is removed flows away continuously, and the sludge is dried, pressed, and

In the Milwaukee plant one million gallons of sewage produces three to sold for fertilizer. five thousand gallons of sludge. This, when dried, is worth \$12.00 per ton as a fertilizer. It costs \$3.00 a ton to dry the sludge, which is worth \$6.00 a ton. It requires a million gallons of sewage to produce a ton of sludge, so that there is a profit of \$3.00 on each million gallons of sewage. This of course does not include the cost of operation, up-keep, and interest
The advantages claimed for this method are, that,—

of sewage disposal plants.

(1) There are no odors.(2) The effluent is never offensive. The sludge is inoffensive and easily dried.

(4) The sludge makes a certain profit.
(5) The method is cheaper than any other known complete method. This method of sewage treatment is under consideration by several towns in Ontario. It has been shown to operate successfully in zero weather, and is worth the attention of communities contemplating installation

TUBERCULOSIS. A cold abcess is a collection of pus or matter caused by the bacillus of tuberculosis. It is called "cold" because, while an ordinary abcess has the usual inflammatory symptoms of pain, redness, and tenderness, these are absent in cold abcess. This form of abcess occurs both COLD ABCESS in children and adults; and the patient, in addition to the local treatment of the abcess itself, should be very carefully examined for symptoms of lung or other forms of tuberculosis. If there is any fever he requires rest, the best of food, outdoor life and

If there is any fever he requires rest, the best of food, outdoor life and should abstain from alcoholics. No particular medicine is required, but if any is thought necessary it should be administered under the direction of a skilled physician. There is no danger if the patient with tuberculosis of the lungs does

contain the bacilli.

J. S. G., Hamilton, E. Q .- Kindly inform me how I can prevent the breeding of flies about

A .- If you have a horse or cow keep the manure in a fly-proof box A.—If you have a noise of cow keep the manufe in a hy-pict both and have the box emptied and the contents taken away at least weekly. The careful disposal of manure is the most important anti-fly measure. If the manure cannot be taken away promptly it should be treated by dissolving borax in water and sprinkling the manure, using one pound of borax to every 16 cubic feet of manure.

Sulphyte of iron is another means of prevention of fly breeding in

Sulphate of iron is another means of prevention of fly breeding in manure. Two pounds (2lb) in one rallon of water is sufficient for the manure from one horse for one day.

W. Bowlby proposes a re-enactment of by-law number 175, made in December, 1862, which prohibits these transactions taking place until after 11

which it had to combat.

in December, 1862, fixing the time at which merchants and farmers could transact business at eleven o'clock. On November 8th, 1886, bylaw Number 318 was introduced, changing the time to 10 o'clock. The merchants, however, exerted their influence again, and, as a result, on the 25th of March, 1895, the hour was reduced to 9 o'clock.

This situation was satisfactory to the merchants until 1907, when the whole system was abolished in bylaw number 916, which was passed in June of that year.

Following is the by-law which the Mayor proposes to re-enact, and thus to reduce, in this instance, the prevailing high prices for food stuffs, by removing one of the middlemen in the handling of goods between the producer and the consumer.

The development of this faculty in the young people, coupled with the knowledge of musical grammar, and the production and management of the voice, is sure not only to bene-fit the future work of the Schubert Choir, but every choir in the city will to some extent ultimately share in the results achieved.
